REST IN PEACE, FR. HENRY

Fr. Henry Benedict Sabog was born on March 8, 1931 and died May 22, 2017 at age 86. On June 11, 1960, he was ordained by the *Bishop James Sweeney* as the first priest of Filipino ancestry for the Diocese of Honolulu. He served for 57 years as Associate Pastor or Pastor at seven Oahu parishes. He became a Pastor in 1970 at Our Lady of the Mount, Kalihi



Valley, Honolulu until 1986. He was also designated as Spiritual Director for the Diocesan Congress of Filipino Catholic Clubs (DCFCC), Worldwide Marriage Encounter (WME) and Parish Renewal Experiences (PRE). He was very much loved wherever he served. He will be greatly missed.

Bishop Larry Silva will preside at his Funeral Mass to be concelebrated by Priests and Deacons at <u>10am</u>, <u>June 21</u>, at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa.

The Diocese requested the parishes where Fr. Henry served to provide food items for the fellowship after Mass at the St. Theresa cafeteria. The expected count is 500, more or less. *Please kokua!*



Corpus Christi / Father's Day



First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

In the reading from Deuteronomy, Moses reminds the Israelites of the manna which fell from heaven each night during their wanderings in the desert. This mysterious food was not simply sustenance for their bodies. It also sustained their faith, reminding them daily of God's protecting care and God's determination to bring then mto their new homeland as he had promised.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:26-17

This passage from 1 Corinthians reminds us that the Body of Christ is not simply something we become. The bread and wine we share are truly the Body and Blood of Christ, and we who receive them become one body—incorporated into Christ and into each other.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

Jesus recalls the manna in the desert and invites the people to taste a new kind of food, which gives life not just from one day to tge next but life that lasts forever. Jesus' teaching about the Bread of Life marks a turning point in the Gospel according to John: many, including some of his disciples, cannot accept it and no longer follow him. Today's solemnity places before us the mystery of Christ's abiding presence in his Church. Are we prepared to receive this bread of everlasting life—and live what it demands of us?

SAFE ENVIRONMENT



June 2017 marks 15 years since the promulgation of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), which set national standards in place to bring healing to victims of abuse and also provided the

framework for prevention of future abuse.
