Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 89:2-3. 16-19

Second Reading

Gospel

Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

Matthew 10:37-42

First Reading: Jeremiah 20:10-13

The prophet finds himself in a terrifying situation: he is surrounded by whispered threats and violence and his friends have become his enemies. But he refuses to be afraid, and instead turns to God. The prophet does not rely on himself for rescue: he trusts to God, who not only will vindicate him in the end, but walks with him even now.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-15

Paul contrasts Adam and Christ—sin and grace. Since Adam and Eve, sin has been inextricable from the human condition. The Mosaic Law did not take away sin, but rather made its presence more clear by measuring or "accounting" it. But with the coming of Christ, this pattern is broken forever, as great overflows, healing the sin of the world.

Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33

Jesus knows that his disciples will experience much of what Jeremiah experienced in today's First Reading: abandonment, persecution, fear. He reminds them not to be afraid, but to trust in the all-present, all-loving God who is always with them. The most important thing is to let nothing deter them from proclaiming the Kingdom of God.



FACILITIES REPAIR & MAINTENANCE *REPAIR OF HALL OVERHANG

Working behind the scene are volunteers who just repaired the deteriorating concrete overhang by the Parish Hall kitchen. They had to assemble and set up the scaffolding, drill and chip at the concrete, pressure wash, apply roof



coating and epoxy to seal the cracks and leaks, do a ceiling patch, install box outlet, paint and clean up to complete the job. The amount of \$965.60 was spent for the materials but the labor was all voluntary. We are most grateful to the parish volunteers - Roger Isidro, Adriano Daligcon, Frankie Cabral, Rudy Fiesta, Paul Valbuena, Kalolo Tuihalafatai, Puli Tuihalafatai, Popeti Tulia, Jun Cortez and Andy Ibera. Benny Ursulum lent the scaffolding materials while the paint was donated by Roger Isidro, who also coordinated the daily work schedule and project.

*FORTHCOMING PROJECTS

At the regular monthly meeting in June 19 of the Committee on Facilities and Maintenance chaired by Joyce Oliveira, it was decided that we work next on putting up a concrete fence on the makai side of the convent as well as concrete pavement on its frontage. Rudy Fiesta will work on the posts and iron works while Kalolo Tuihalafatai and his men will dig the ground for the laying of the foundation for the hollow tiles and cement. Our good neighbor and parishioner, Rosie Jacinto, also offered to help foot the expenses incurred.

This and other maintenance projects are being done with the parishioners' stewardship offering for Repair & Maintenance. We will soon begin the awaited renovation of the convent building starting with the flooring on both levels. Definitely, this needs more funding and we shall be appealing to the parishioners' kokua as we resume the monthly second collection for Repair & Maintenance soon. We are most grateful for your support and generosity and may God repay you abundantly.
