

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Readings

Pentecost Sunday

First Reading Responsorial Psalm

Second Reading Gospel

1 Corinthians 1:3-7, 12-13 John 20:19-23

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

As we read from the Acts of the Apostles we hear what took place after the Resurrection: Jesus appeared to the disciples, instructed them through the Holy Spirit, and spoke to them about the kingdom of God. It seems some still held misguided notions about that kingdom, based on the question posed about restoring the kingdom to Israel. It is not for disciples to know the times and seasons, gut rather to witness to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 47:2-3, 6-9

This enthronement psalm, originally a song of praise as the ark of the covenant was processed into the Temple, will be heard in our proclamation as a canticle of praise for Christ who ascended into heaven. Christ is our king, who reigns over the nations and will return in the same way as he was seen going into heaven. Therefore we cry out with shouts of joy and gladness.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

This two-part reading begins with a prayer for a spirit of wisdom and revelation, resulting in knowledge of Christ, and enlightened hearts, resulting in knowledge of the hope that belongs to believers. The prayer is followed by a statement of faith: dead and sits above all who hae earthly power with all things under his feet. He is the head of the Church which is his body, and is "the fullness of the one who fills all things in every way."

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

At the end of Matthew's account of the Gospel, Jesus comes to the mountain in Galilee where he has told the disciples to meet him. Note that the audience of primarily Jewish Christians whom the Gospel writer addressed would likely have needed encouragement to share the Gospel with all the nations (not only Jews). The baptismal formulary, familiar to the original audience, is familiar to us as well. The Gospel ends wit the assurance of Christ's enduring presence.

RELIGIOUS ED PROGRAM

This year's Catechetical Program for Kinder to Grade 8 culminated last Sunday with the Eucharistic celebration and fellowship. The students were honored with various achievement awards. *Sr. Clemence Mira*, SPC, the Religious Ed coordinator, and the parish catechists led the event while the parents brought edible items for sharing and fellowship. Currently they are on summer break. Classes will resume in August wherein we shall start with the new diocesan program of implementing the original order of celebrat-



ing the initiation sacraments. That is, First Communion and Confirmation will be celebrated in the same year for Grade 2. At the same time, the required comprehensive Youth Ministry program must be fully implemented. The catechists and the Youth Ministry will collaborate on the latter matter. CONGRATULATIONS to one and all for a fruitful Catechetical Year 2016-2017. Let's continue to pray for our children and youths. We thank the loving services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values and prepare them well for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation*, *First Communion and Confirmation*. We laud the parents, grandparents and guardians who encourage their children to attend the Sunday school and act as primary catechists by their own teachings and concrete examples of living the Christian faith.
