The Transfiguration of the Lord



Next Sunday's Readings

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading 1 Kings 19:9, 11-13

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 85:9-14

Second Reading Romans 9:1-5

Gospel Matthew 14:22-33

First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10; 13-14

The First Reading gives a sublime description of heaven, with symbolic, mysterious language. God takes his seat amidst throngs of angels. It is both throne room and court of law, and into it comes a man, who is presented to God and given the kingship. For Christians, the "one like a Son of man" is Christ.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-19

In this passage from 2 Peter, we hear a first hand account of today's feast: Peter himself describes what he saw and heard on the mount of Transfiguration. He saw the glory of Jesus, the Father's Son, and he heard the familiar words: "This is my Son, my beloved" (2 Peter 1:17). These words, Peter says, are a truth to cling to when we find ourselves in difficulty: they are like a light in shining in darkness, a glimpse of the Transfiguration.


Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

In all the synoptic accounts of the Gospel, the story of the Transfiguration comes after Jesus tells the disciples about his approaching Crucifixion and Death. Jesus takes Peter, James and John with him, and these three become witnesses of Jesus in his heavenly glory. Before their eyes, he is changed: he is still Jesus, but his face and clothing grow bright. The light shines not from without, but from within him. Moses and Elijah appear - the Law and the Prophets of the Old Testament - and God's voice is heard, telling them who Jesus is and reminding them to listen to him. The disciples behold, but do not yet understand. Only after Jesus' Crucifixion and Resurrection will they understand what they have seen: Jesus is fully human, fully God.

The Cursillo in Hawaii is conducting a Men's Cursillo Weekend on August 10-13 at the St. Anthony Retreat Center in Kalihi Valley. The Cursillo is a lay movement whose mission is to help spread the Gospel by proclaiming the Christian teachings and engage the participants in common prayers, Masses, rollos or spiritual talks, ultreyas and meditations facilitated by priests, deacons and trained leaders. Bishop Larry Silva has appointed Fr. Edgar as the Spiritual Advisor for the Cursillo in Hawaii. Together with 8 delegates from Hawaii, Fr. Edgar attended the 27th National Cursillo Encounter and 60th Anniversary of Cursillo in the USA held in San Antonio, Texas from July 27-30, 2017. The national gathering registered 745 cursillistas which included 4 Bishops, 30 priests and deacons. The group celebrated the milestone of 60 years of Cursillo as well as its significant contributions towards building up the Church in the USA.

Baptism, Confirmation & First Communion Reflections on the Original Order Diocese of Honolulu kdeneve@rcchawaii.org

The sacraments that initiate us into the Christian life are Baptism and Confirmation. Baptism and Confirmation go hand in hand, like a certificate given its official seal. In Baptism, Christians share in the death and resurrection of Jesus. In Confirmation, the Holy Spirit comes down upon us as it did on the Apostles on the

day of Pentecost. Baptism and Confirmation are as inseparable as Easter and Pentecost Sundays, the first and last days of the Easter season.

Jesus himself was baptized and then confirmed by his Father with the gift of the Spirit: "After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and, behold, the heavens were opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased'" (Matthew 3:16-17).

RELIGIOUS ED PROGRAM

REGISTRATION FOR ALL CHILDREN IN THE CATECHISM CLASSES, PREPA-RATION FOR THE INITIATION SACRA-MENTS AND COMPREHENSIVE YOUTH MINISTRY IS NOW GOING ON. Please see *Lucille Mohika* or approach any catechist.



Registration forms are available in the bulletin holders. For those who are receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion, the *Baptism Certificate* is required. The celebration of the *Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion* is set on May 20, 2018 which is the solemn Feast of Pentecost. *First Reconciliation* is scheduled beforehand.

As directed by the Diocese, the OPENING DAY OF THE SUN-DAY SCHOOL for the Year 2017-2018 is <u>August 20</u>. On the <u>first day of school in August 20</u>, there will be no formal classes yet, but all children together with their parents are urged to join the celebration of the 147th Parish Anniversary starting with the Holy Mass at 8:30am, followed by a solemn procession to the grotto and fellowship for all at the parish hall.

The catechists led by Sr. Clemence Mira, SPC and the Youth Ministry under Ropati Liua jointly devised a plan to implement the diocesan program of transitioning to the original order of celebrating the initiation sacraments. A minor revamp in the designation of catechists for the different classes was made and the idea of team teaching was included in the new structure. The identified programs for the Youth Ministry called EDGE and LIFE TEEN were ordered in both online and hard copy forms. The parents' role in the Christian formation of their children is also integrated in the program.

Let's continue to pray for our children and youths. We thank the loving services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values and prepare them well for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion*. We laud the parents, grandparents and guardians who encourage their children to attend the Sunday School and Mass and act as primary catechists and concrete examples of living the Christian faith.


