WHY SHOULD WE RESPECT LIFE?

- 1) The Bible teaches that life is a gift of God and, hence, we have to respect it from womb to tomb. Abortion attempts to destroy a work of God. Based on the word of God, the Church teaches that an unborn child from the moment of its conception in its mother's womb is precious because it carries an immortal soul.
- 2) It is God's commandment that we shall not kill. (Exodus 20:13: "You shall not kill."). The circumstances of the baby's conception do not change the evil of abortion: it is still a baby who is killed. Every tiny human embryo can grow into a child, and modern medical technology can enable it to survive outside its mother's womb after five and a half months.
- 3) International Law forbids the killing of innocent, defenseless people. Abortion is the killing of a defenseless child in its safest abode, the womb, by its own mother, mostly for selfish motives.
- 4) Abortion harms women physically, emotionally, psychologically, socially and spiritually. 93% of the abortions in America are for convenience. The mother's health is an issue only 3% of the time, and the baby's health is an issue 3% of the time. Rape and incest are issues only 1% of the time. Ninety-three percent of all abortions in America are performed because of selfishness, just because someone doesn't want a child!
- 5) Advocates of pro-choice follow a dangerous principle of farreaching consequences in the society. If it is justifiable to kill unwanted children by abortion, then the old, the sick, the handicapped, the mentally ill, and the retarded can also be killed.

Next Sunday's Readings

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Isaiah 5:1-7

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 80:9, 12-16, 19-20

Second Reading

Gospel

Philippians 4:6-9

Matthew 21:33-43

First Reading: Ezekiel 18:25-28

Who's way is not fair, God's or ours? This is the question at the heart of the prophetic words from Ezekiel. Turn from wickedness to do what is right and just, the prophet instructs. God's way is fair, because God will save the life of a person who acts in this manner. Following the commandments leads to life, not death. Not following the commandments, which sometimes is our way and was the way of the Israelites, leads to death. Rephrase, the positive question of this reading is, Whose way is fair?

Second Reading: Philippians 2:1-11

Our attitude must march the attitude that is in Christ Jesus. Our mind is to be of the same mind as Christ Jesus. This is the essence of Paul's words to the Philippians. In Christ, humility, not selfishness, is our motivation. Christ's humility led to his exaltation. So, too, ours will lead as to life with in God's glory. The longer form of the reading includes the Christological that presents the pattern of Christ's humility and exaltation through his obedience to Death on a Cross.

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32

In Matthew, the parable of the two sons whom the father asks to work in his vineyard follows immediately after the authorities question Jesus about from where his authority for teaching the temple comes. In this parable, one son tells his father he will not work, and then does. Thr other son says he will work and then does not. Beginning with an "Amen," Jesus solemnly teaches that the first son, like tax collectors and prostitutes and all those who change their mind, repent and follow him with share in the Kihgdom of God. The authorities have yet to change their minds and believe.

&RELIGIOUS ED PROGRAM&



PARENTS' ORIENTATION: After the 8:30am Mass last Sunday, Sr. Clemence Mira, SPC, presided at the parents' gathering presenting the new programs in Religious Education as mandated by the Diocese and other forthcoming activities for the children. Carol Chona. a There is a Class for Everyone! parishioner and current Principal of St. John the Baptist Catholic

School, spoke about the new order of celebrating the initiation Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion. Fr. Edgar spoke on the importance of the parents' participation in their children's religious formation. He also explained that a comprehensive Youth Ministry will take the place of the Confirmation classes for Grade 5-12 students.

CONFIRMATION PREPARATION: As decreed by the Bishop, the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion will now be celebrated for Grade 2 students starting this Catechetical Year. The higher grades who have not received Confirmation or First Communion will also be prepared so they can be part of the celebration on May 20, 2018, which is the solemn Feast of Pentecost. First Reconciliation and Confessions is scheduled beforehand.

YOUTH MINISTRY & PARENTS' INVOLVEMENT: Part of the requirements in the new order of celebrating the Initiation Sacraments is the implementation of a comprehensive Youth Ministry from Grades 5-12 and the participation of the parents in catechizing their children. Robert Liua will handle the Youth Ministry activities in collaboration with the concerned Catechists. There will also be a regular gathering of parents to view video presentations from the Diocese about our Catholic faith and pastoral programs.

REMINDER: To all those who are preparing to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion, the Baptism Certificate is required. Please submit them as soon as possible.

Let's continue to pray for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values and prepare them well for the sacraments of First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion. We laud the parents, grandparents and all parishioners who encourage their children to attend the Sunday School and Mass and act as primary catechists and concrete examples of living the Christian faith.

OUR LADY OF FATIMA IN OCTOBER.



As we celebrate October as Rosary Month, we join the universal Church in honoring the Blessed Mother on the Centennial (100th) Anniversary of her last apparition to the three children, Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia, in Fatima, Portugal.

The Office of Worship is encouraging each parish, oratory and school to consider having a special celebration on

<u>Friday, October 13th</u> which is the actual day of the last apparition. As a reminder Pope Francis has granted a *"plenary indulgence of the jubilee"* to the faithful who visit with devotion an image of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly displayed for public veneration in any sacred place during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, and devotedly participate there in any celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary, pray the *Our Father*, recite the *Creed* and invoke Our Lady of Fatima.

To gain the plenary indulgence, the following usual conditions must be met: *sacramental confession, with an intention to renounce all attachment to sin; *reception of Eucharistic Communion and *prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, the Pope.

The reception of Penance and Holy Communion may be done within several days of the visit. If the conditions are not met, then the indulgence is partial.

Parishes, schools and oratories may consider placing a statue of Our Lady of Fatima for public veneration during the final weeks, or at least on Friday, October 13th

At OLM, on Friday, October 13, the Liturgy Committee together with the Ilocano Choir Ministry invite everyone to celebrate the event with a votive Mass in honor of Our Lady of Fatima at 6:30am then a public rosary with the image of the Lady of Fatima in front of the Church at 12:00 noon. Or you may pilgrimage to the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace where the image of the Lady of Fatima is displayed on October 13th then join the 12:00noon Mass and pray the rosary with groups from other parishes.

On Saturday, October 14, there will be a Public Rosary at 12:00 noon at the State Capitol. Clementina Ceria-Ulep is coordinating sign-ups for two weekends for those who wish to participate. If many sign-up, Clem will charter a bus for the group. Whatever way, let's make the day special for Mary that she may continue to intercede and bless us her children.


