Centennial Anniversary of Fatima Apparitions

Last Friday, October 13, OLM Parish joined the universal Church in honoring the Blessed Mother on the 100th Anniversary of her sixth and last apparition to the three children, *Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia*, in Fatima, Portugal. *Pope Francis* has granted a "*plenary indulgence of the jubilee*" to the faithful who visit with devotion an image of Our Lady of Fatima solemnly displayed for public veneration in any sacred place during the days of the anniversary of the apparitions, and devotedly participate there in any celebration or prayer in honor of the Virgin Mary, pray the *Our Father*, recite the *Creed* and invoke *Our Lady of Fatima*.

To gain the plenary indulgence, the following usual conditions must be met - **sacramental confession*, with an intention to renounce all attachment to sin; **reception of Eucharistic Communion* and **prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father*, the Pope.

In the morning, we celebrated the Votive Mass in honor of Our Lady of Fatima. Around noontime, the parishioners gathered in front of the Church to pray the holy rosary with singing of Marian hymns. A beautiful statue of Our Lady of Fatima brought by *Silver & Marivic Palting* was enthroned for public veneration. *Fr. Edgar* opened and introduced the event with a summary of the six apparitions of the Virgin Mary in Fatima. A simple fellowship capped the event.

We were glad to make the day special for the Blessed Mother and we continue to pray the rosary this month of October and everyday as a parish family that Mary may intercede and bless us all her children.

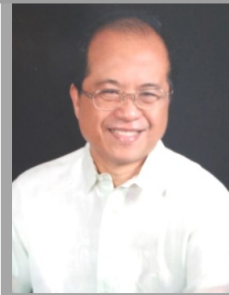
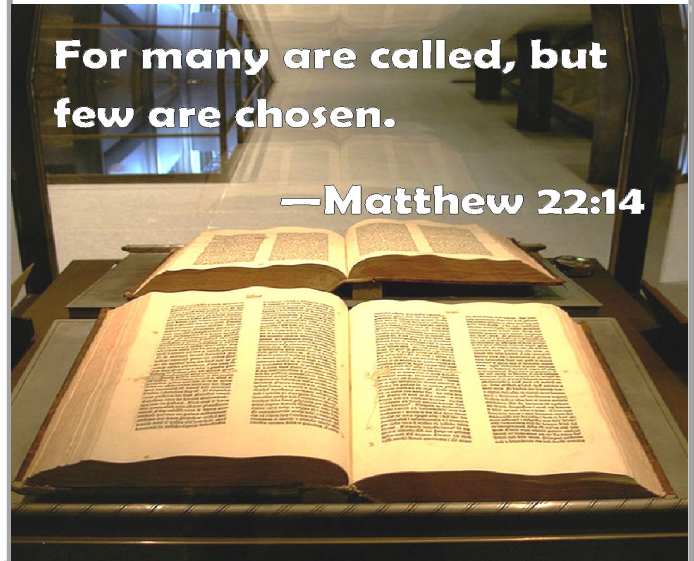

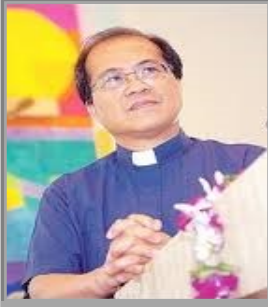

Next Sunday's Readings

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 96:1, 3-5, 7-10

Second Reading

1 Thessalonians 1:1-5

Gospel

Matthew 22:15-21

First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10

We move ahead in Isaiah to chapter 25 for this Sunday's First Reading. The entirety of this chapter describes the day when the Lord will provide victory for his people. Specifically, the verses chosen for today paint the picture of the mountain, Zion, on which the victory will take place. It is on this mountain that the Lord will also nourish his people with a splendid feast. The people's tears of defeat at the hands of their enemies, Assyria included, will no longer need to shed. Salvation is the victory of God's people.

Second Reading: Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20

Paul knows how to support himself in his work of spreading the Gospel. If he needed to labor, he did. In this passage, he expresses to us that he has the ability to live in both scarcity and abundance. Yet, the Philippians sent him a gift of money for which he is thankful. Paul accepted the gift, although he believed that God provides for his every need. This is the truth of faith he teaches the Philippians. We trust God provides enough for us in Christ Jesus, oftentimes working through others who respond to our needs as the Philippians reached out to Paul.

Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus continues to speak to the chief priests and elders in another parable. This time the parable centers on whom God invites to the banquet of the Kingdom of heaven. On Tuesday, November 7, we will proclaim Luke's account of the same parable. In Matthew's account, the king sends his servants into the streets to invite people to the feast, since those who were invited did not come, showing their own unworthiness. The servants bring back a variety of people, but the king notes how some are not wearing the proper attire for a wedding banquet. They are invited, but not chosen for they have not turned to the Lord and put on the wedding garment.

❖ SIX-DAY PILGRIMAGE TO MEXICO: Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Fr. Adrian is leading a pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico from Oct.15-21, 2017. They will visit the Old and New Basilicas and spend time for prayer and Holy Mass. Then will take a tour of Mexico City and view the colonial buildings and architecture, outdoor cafes, museums and Aztec exhibits while strolling the cobblestone streets. A STEWARDSHIP PRAYER

Dear Lord,
As we begin to shift from summer schedules to autumn demands, teach us to recognize you, and help us follow you amidst our busy life. Open the Scriptures to us... that we may know you, see you, hear you – in the voices of friends and family, in the ministries of our parish, in the proclamation of the Word, and in the Breaking of the Bread. Teach us to be good stewards, that we may use your gifts wisely and care for all those you place in our path. Encourage us, when we are overwhelmed. Strengthen us, when we are frightened. Challenge our complacency. Help us make this new season a time of spiritual renewal, hope, and action to proclaim the Gospel in our words and in our deeds. For the kingdom and the power and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.



Stewardship always involves conversion — a change of mind and heart, something that cannot be expressed in one single action, but in a whole way of living. Stewardship offers us a way to re-focus our energy and provides an opportunity to face today's challenges. The re-discovery of stewardship as an ancient New Testament teaching is one of the good news stories in our Catholic life of faith. Catholics in increasing numbers are being introduced to the message of stewardship and are studying how this concept informs their understanding of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. As Saint Paul writes: "We are servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God" (1 Cor. 4:1). As stewards, we understand that a grace-filled potential dwells within each of us that is constantly open to conversion and responsive to the love of God. Also within every human heart, the mystery of God lays dormant, waiting to be awakened by our words, our example or our actions.

As individuals, we have power we do not realize. Even our generous acts have power. Like the poor widow whom Jesus esteemed for placing two seemingly insignificant coins in the temple offertory, we have the power to build our community of faith through our generosity. Today, the witness to this power is most evident in those communities of faith that profess and practice stewardship.

What we learn from Christian stewardship is that we have an openness to change and respond, to let ourselves be new persons. As stewards, we recognize that all is gift, all is grace, and all things manifest the mystery of God's presence. Once we come to this conclusion, then we are more fully able to live the rest of our days in gratitude by celebrating and becoming Eucharistic people. Our work of stewardship is ultimately our way of saying thanks to God; our way of putting the Eucharist into action.

YOUTH MINISTRY & PARENTS' INVOLVEMENT: Part of the requirements in the new order of celebrating the Initiation Sacraments is the implementation of a comprehensive Youth Ministry from Grades 5-12 and the participation of the parents in catechizing their children. *Robert Liua* will handle the Youth Ministry activities in collaboration with the concerned Catechists. There will also be a regular gathering of parents to view video presentations from the Diocese about our Catholic faith and pastoral programs.

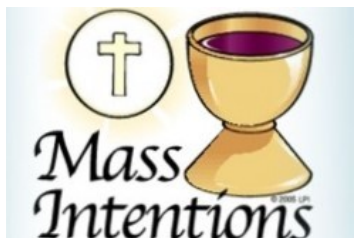
