# Pastor's Corner

#### **Next Sunday's Readings**

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

First Reading
Genesis 15:1-6, 21"1-3

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm: 105:1-9

**Second Reading** *Hebrews 11:8, 11-12, 17-19* 

Gospel Luke 2:22-40

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 16

This passage from Samuel is a delightful conversation between David and the Lord. David has decided to build a fine house for the Lord, a place that would contain the presence of thje Lord. The Lord will have nothing to do with the plan and tells David that he will continue to dwell on the midst of the people, wherever they are.

Second Reading: Romans 16:25-27

This passage concludes Paul's letter to the Romans. It is in the form of a doxology, a statement of praise for the revelation ofGod through the ages. Although the content of tjhis revelation was not known in all ages, being "kept secret" from some, it is now frullyh revealed through Jesus Christ. This is the heart of the Christmas Gospel and the reason for our celebration during Advent-Christmas season

**Gospel:** *Luke* 1:26-38

Luke's account of the Annunciation brings us to the threshold of the celebration of the Nativity of the Word made flesh. Luke is careful to note that the event is part of the great plan of God; the house of David is represented by Joseph. The promise made to David is to be realized in a simple setting in Galilee, but it's import will be to bring forth a kingdom that will have no end. Mary's response, first of fear and then of complete acceptance, helps us to identify with her as model of a servant of the Lord.

#### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE AT HOME

For the past three Sundays and weeks of Advent we have been lighting the candles of the Advent wreath. It is such a beautiful tradition and meaningful symbol of the coming of Jesus as the light of the world.

It is also becoming a tradition for families to have an Advent Wreath in their homes. The prayers for the rite of lighting the Advent wreath at home by family members are reprinted from the *Hawaii Catholic Herald* for private use.

#### **FOURTH SUNDAY/WEEK:**



Leader: Let us pray... Stir up your power and might, O Lord, and come. Rescue us through your great strength so that salvation, which has been hindered by our sins, may be hastened by the grace of your gentle mercy. Through Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

(Four candles are lighted.)

#### NEW CANDLESTAND

A new candle stand was delivered to our Church last December 2 and we blessed it at the 8:30am Mass last Sunday. It was transported all the way from Ireland through the St. Killians Candle Company. It has the unique feature of a clean and smokeless votive candle burning system and designed with fire safety in mind. It has the endorsement of the Catholic Mutual Group which supervises and insures church structures. The system is currently used in cathedrals and churches around the world including the Our Lady of Peace Cathedral-Basilica in Honolulu.

The candle stand is placed at the alcove of the Divine Mercy and the Blessed Mother. As we light the candles we can ask for their intercession for our personal intentions for healing, protection, or success, for our families



and dear ones, both living and dead, or for world peace and good government leaders. Everyone is welcomed to make use of it. You can put your offering of \$2.00 or more at the deposit hole in front of the stand.

We are most grateful to *Francisca Kovaloff* and her family for being instrumental in ordering the new candle stand for the church use.



#### PROJECT ACCOMPLISHED



ing flooring on both ground and second levels is done. The steps of the staircases are also made new. The new flooring for the chapel and the replacement of the old commode bowls in the restrooms were later added and done too. It was started last November upon approval by the Diocese. The Planning & Building committee headed by *Joyce Oliveira* made the inspection and approval of the finished project. The work was undertaken by the *Puli Construction* who did an excellent job.

The whole project costs \$37,800.00 which includes labor and materials. One of the workers and our parishioner, *Kalolo Tuihalafatai* is donating \$2000.00 of the amount. To pay for the project we had to dip from our current parish deposit in the Diocese and other donations for repair and maintenance projects such as the *James Adlawan Insurance donation* and left-over funds from the ceiling fans and lights project. We are most grateful to the generosity of everyone. When funds are again available we shall continue to improve the entire structure so as to maximize its use for pastoral and relevant programs. Right now, it is being used only by RE students on Sundays and by the Knights of Columbus for their monthly meeting and for the Kokua Food Pantry storage and distribution

Joyce Oliveira, the committee chairperson and project manager, writes: "Thank you to the dedicated parishioners who have participated through the many months of decision and planning sessions relating to the improvements to our Convent Building... This first phase of the planned renovations could only proceed with the talents and financial support of our parishioners. We look forward to your continued participation and financial commitment as we move into the next phases of the overall Convent Building renovation work in the coming New Year of 2019."




