The Retreat has the theme: **PRIESTHOOD** and **TRINITARIAN TRANSFORMATION.** It will be developed and presented by the Retreat Master, *Monsignor Joseph Betschart*, President-Rector of Mount Angels Seminary in Portland, Oregon, where some of our seminarians are studying. Let us pray for our priests as they pray for us. At OLM, we still have daily Mass during the Priests' Retreat week, presided by our pastor-Emeritus, *Fr. Adrian*.

SANTO NINO FIESTA *January 14 - 3:00pm

For some years now, the Visayan Catholic Community has been sponsoring the celebration of the Feast of Santo Nino. It will be held on January 14 and will start with the Holy Mass at 3:00pm. Typically, it is a festive tradition with a procession enlivened by a band and a street dancing with the image of the Child-Jesus being swayed to the rhythm of the dance. The event is capped by a sumptuous dinner and program.

We admire the Visayan Community for their devotion and dedication in perpetuating a cherished religious tradition. We join them in celebrating and praying for the continued blessing of Santo Nino upon our Parish and the universal Church. St. Anthony Church in Kalihi Kai is also hosting another Santo Nino festivity on January 21.

Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord



First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

Isaiah addresses Jerusalem, a symbol of the chosen people of Israel. He calls them to "rise up in splendor" because the light of the Lord, the salvation of God has arrived. This great blessing brings a new mission for them. They will be a light for the nations, they will be the messengers of the wondrous deeds of the Lord. No longer will they be enslaved by other nations, in fact other nations will bring them riches from afar.

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

The issue of whether the Gentiles could inherit salvation without first becoming Jewish was a contentious one for the early Church. Paul who came to be known as the Apostle to the Gentiles, makes it clear that God has always intended that the Gentiles receive the grace of salvation. Paul believes he has been appointed to reveal the truth that the salvation of God is open to all, because all are from God.

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

The importance of this story within the Christmas narrative lies in it's theological meaning. Jesus' birth has significance far beyond the religious boundaries and expectations of his ancestors. The intervention of God in human history will have universal repercussions and people of every time and nation will be drawn to the Son of God.

CONVENT RENOVATION

The first phase of the renovation project in the Convent building of replacing the failing flooring on both ground and second levels is done. The steps of the staircases are also made new. The new flooring for the chapel and the replacement of the old commode bowls in the restrooms were later added and done too. The Planning & Building committee headed by Joyce Oliveira made the inspection and approval of the finished

project. We are most grateful to the generosity of everyone in their stewardship offerings. When funds are again available we shall continue to improve the entire structure so as to maximize its use for pastoral and relevant programs. Currently, the building is being used only by RE students on Sundays and by the Knights of Columbus for their monthly meeting and for the Kokua Food Pantry storage and distribution.

Everyone is welcome to visit and take a look at the newly-installed flooring of the Convent. You would certainly feel happy and proud of it.

We join *Joyce Oliveira*, the committee chairperson and project manager, in thanking all for sharing their financial resources for the improvement expenses and "we look forward to your continued participation and financial commitment as we move into the next phases of the overall renovation work in the coming year."
