

Next Sunday's Reading Fourth Sunday of Easter

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

Second Reading 1 John 3:1-2

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 118:1, 8-9, 21-23,

Gospel John 10:11-18

26, 28, 29

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19

Peter addresses the Israelites after he has cured a man who was crippled from birth. His words are accusatory, letting the people know they rejected the Holy and Righteous One and put him to death. Peter's words are also affirmative. In them, Peter testifies that the God of their fathers is the same God who raised Jesus, the Holy and Righteous One. Jesus' suffering fulfilled the message of the prophets; his Resurrection is God's ultimate act of fidelity, fulfilling his promise of life to his people. Paul calls the Israelites to repentance and conversion. Our call to change does not stop with Lent. It continues in the Easter Season!

Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5

From the final chapter of John, from which last Sunday's Gospel was taken, we move back to an earlier part of the letter. Are we in Lent? You might ask this question as you read the three short verses of Today's Second Reading. Sin is the obvious topic of the passage. We hope to remain faithful in love to God's commandments. We hope ot to sin, but the author of the letter is realistic. God's children will sin. Yet all is not lost. Jesus Christ will advocate for us with the Father. Jesus Christ dies as expiation for our sins and the sins of the whole world. For this, we are grateful.

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

Jesus offers peace once again to the disciples, as we heard him offer last Sunday. The disciples do not believe it is he. Jesus recognizes that they are troubled, and invites them to see his hands and feet for themselves. Easter joy fills the disciple. Jesus eats with them and breaks open the Scriptures for them. Their growth in faith continues. Ours must, too, in Easter Time as we strengthen ourselves for lifelong witness to the Risen One.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

Sharing the Responsibilities of Good Stewardship

Like many, perhaps most, people of ministry, I often feel overextended, pressed for time, and just a bit stressed.

I remember many years ago, my college roommate had a poster that read, "Too blessed to be stressed." This could be our stewardship mantra. When we are overextended. feel pressure to complete multiple tasks at once, or are challenged by the daily circumstances of life and ministry, we remind ourselves that all is blessing. All is gift! All we are and have is entrusted to us by God and we are called to steward it well. Self-care in ministry is not always about doing or giving less. In fact, many stewards would say exactly the opposite, that growing as a steward has resulted in more giving, service, and sharing. What changes is the sense of purpose in living as disciples, and the selfawareness of our particular talents, skills and resources, all of which we are called to steward. We will be less likely to overextend when we are conscious that we are to be responsible stewards and that we are to lead others to responsible stewardship. Every person is created in God's image and is entrusted with gifts and blessings. We do not need to do it all on our own. In fact, we must not do it all on our own. Leading others to embrace the call to live as disciples and grow as good stewards requires us to invite people to contribute their unique gifts and talents, their time and attention, their service, caring, and sharing for the sake of others. Serving together, we make Christ's presence known and in doing so, give glory to God.#
