

It has been quite a while since the last major fundraising during the time of *Fr. Etuale*, about 20 years ago. Let's mobilize ourselves as good stewards and concerned parishioners and save the convent. The jalousie windows are falling and breaking, the electrical and plumbing fixtures need upgrading, the walls, cabinets and ceiling need fixing and the whole structure needs fumigating and repainting. We should make it as safe, healthy and comfortable as possible for our children who use the rooms for their Sunday catechesis, for the Knights of Columbus and some ministries and organizations who hold their office and meetings there, for the Kokua Ministry which stores food stuffs, clothes and household items in the Food Pantry and for distribution to indigents and for the chapel to become a worthy oratory or prayer room. We need to raise the \$200,000 goal to complete the repair and renovation. It will certainly be a lasting and praiseworthy legacy from our generation to the next. We do it all for the love of God and for the sake of our beloved church and parish. I'm sure that if we do our best, God and our dear patroness, *Our Lady of the Mount*, will do the rest.

At stake on the <u>May 5 raffle draw</u> are the Grand Prize of \$10,000.00, second prize of \$1,000.00 and third prize of \$500.00. The day will also feature food booths, door prizes, entertainment numbers and the special performance of the multi-talented comedian, *Mr. Frank de Lima*.

Sunday of Divine Mercy



First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35

This summary of early community of believers at Jerusalem depicts an ideal community, one we can strive to emulate. Would that we, like they, see our unity in the one heart and mind of Jesus Christ and hold everything in common, for everything ultimately belongs to the Lord! The community took care of everyone's needs as it centered its work on witnessing to the Resurrection and living out the message of new life in the Risen Christ.

Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6

Throughout the Sundays of Easter Time, the Second Readings come from the First Letter of John. Today, we hear words from the final chapter of this letter. These words instruct us that love of God's children is ultimately connected to love of God and obeying God's commandments. Faith conquers all that is evil in the world. God's children have confidence in this truth for we believe Jesus Christ conquered death. And, when our memory lapses in regard to this truth, we only need listen to the testimony of the Spirit.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Peace is Jesus' gift to the disciples when he appears to them in locked room. "Receive the Holy Spirit," he says. You have the power to forgive sins. Even on the basis of the disciples' testimony. Thomas did not believe they had seen the Lord. Would we have is the question this Gospel passage leads us to ponder today. Perhaps knowing Thomas' doubt, Jesus appears again a week later offering the same gift of peace, and not judging Thomas at all, invites him to see for himself that Jesus is indeed his Lord and God.

MAY 19 & 20 are the Vigil of Pentecost and Pentecost Sunday respectively. They are the designated days for Confirmation and First Communion of our children and young people in the Religious Ed program of parishes in the first bracket. Bishop Larry Silva has authorized and delegated parish pastors and assistants to administer the sacraments. Confirmation now includes children from Grade Two and up. It is part of the restoration of the original order of celebrating the initiation sacraments. Another required component is the implementation of the comprehensive Youth Ministry which starts with Grade Six students and up. The cate-

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

Easter – A Joyful Season for Missionary Disciples

Easter is a season of profound hope and joy. In _

his apostolic exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium ... LEADS A GIVER'S HEART TO JESUS ("The Joy of the Gospel"), Pope Francis revealed that the best way to live out the joy of Easter is to become a genuine family of faith, an "evangelizing Church that comes out of herself." He urged Catholics around the world to contemplate the mind of Jesus Christ and what it means to be the "light of Christ." From there, Pope Francis believed a spirituality of missionary discipleship could be cultivated that would "help the Church get out of herself" and reach out to those who live in darkness - a darkness in which we realize where we would be without the light of Christ, a darkness that reveals much about our world, our own sinfulness, the darkness that sometimes envelopes our own lives and even shrouds our own hearts. The procession into the church of the newly-lit Paschal candle reminds us of the light and strength provided by the community of the faithful and the saving light of Christ that consumes the darkness. Indeed, Saint Paul maintains that we are stewards of this great light.

As missionary disciples who exercise stewardship of Jesus' teachings, we join with those apostles whose hearts were on fire and contemplate the words of the risen Lord: "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father" (Matt. 5:16). For missionary disciples, this charge should be enough to bring hope and joy. Indeed, Christian stewards are exhorted to celebrate and be joyful for Christ our Savior is risen and he is with us. Alleluia!
