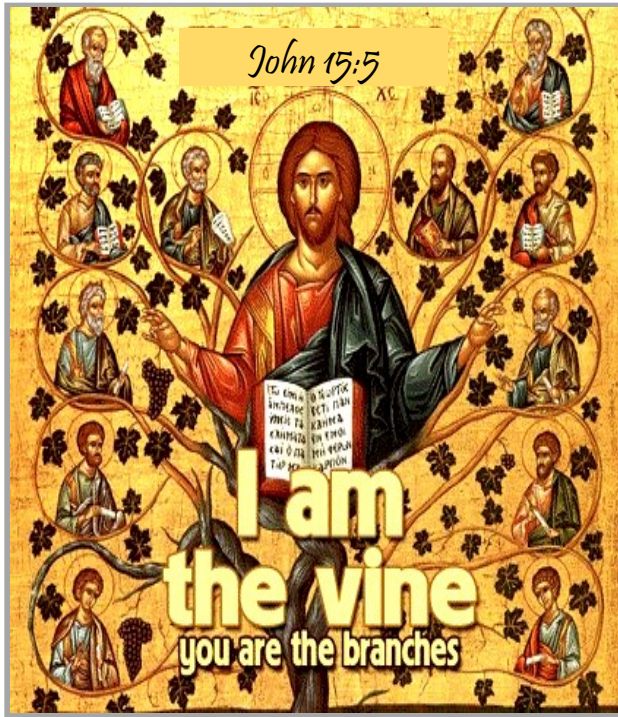

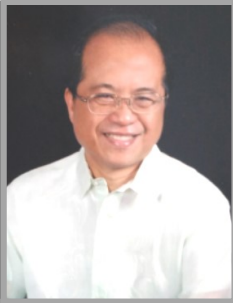

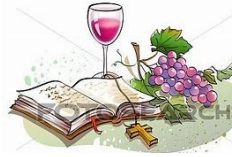

Next Sunday's Reading Sixth Sunday of Easter

First Reading
Acts of the Apostles
10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 98:1-4

Second Reading
1 John 4:7-10

Gospel
John 15:9-17

First Reading: *Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31*

Saul (Paul) comes to Jerusalem and wants to join the community of disciples. Since he had a history of persecuting followers of the Way, the disciples feared him. Barnabas, however, sponsored him to the Apostles. He brought Saul before the Apostles so they could hear of his conversion. The passage recounts no debate about Paul joining the community of disciples. All we read is that he went about proclaiming the Lord with the Apostles. New disciples, faithful followers are always welcome in the community of believers. We nurture each other, as the Hellenists tried to kill him. Together in the Lord, we build up the Church.

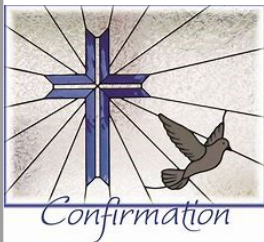
Second Reading: *1 John 3:18-24*

Believe in God's Son, Jesus Christ. Keep his commandments. Love one another. Love by your actions. When we do these things, we can have confidence that we will remain in Jesus Christ. We will know his Spirit alive in us! We will be Easter people for the world and for one another.

Gospel: *John 15:1-8*

Jesus' call for us to glorify the Father by bearing fruit and becoming disciples is clear. The way we do this is by remaining united with Jesus, the true vine and the Father who is the vine grower. Stay the course is essentially Jesus' message. He will always remain in us. Ours is the call to remain in him and bear luscious fruit for the world. Ours is the consolation that we do not have to do anything on our own. In fact, we cannot do anything without the true vine. His is the support and encouragement as we live our Easter faith.

Putting the Eucharist into Action

The re-discovery of stewardship as an ancient New Testament teaching is one of the good news stories in our Catholic life of faith. Catholics in increasing numbers are being introduced to the message of stewardship and are studying how this concept informs their understanding of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. As Saint Paul writes: "We are servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God" (1 Cor. 4:1).

As stewards, we understand that a grace-filled potential dwells within each of us that is constantly open to conversion and responsive to the love of God. Also, within every human heart, the mystery of God lays dormant, waiting to be awakened by our words, our example or our actions. As individuals, we have power we do not realize. Even our generous acts have power. Like the poor widow whom Jesus esteemed for placing two seemingly insignificant coins in the temple offertory, we have the power to build our community of faith through our generosity. Today, the witness to this power is most evident in those communities of faith that profess and practice stewardship.

What we learn from Christian stewardship is that we have an openness to change and respond, to let ourselves be new persons. As stewards, we recognize that all is gift, all is grace, and all things manifest the mystery of God's presence. Once we come to this conclusion, then we are more fully able to live the rest of our days in gratitude by celebrating and becoming Eucharistic people. Our work of stewardship is ultimately our way of saying thanks to God; our way of putting the Eucharist into action.

Wake and Funeral Services: Before making arrangements with the mortuary.

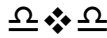
