

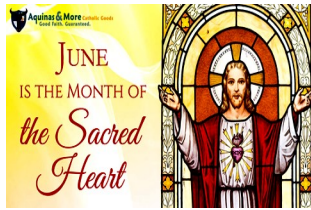

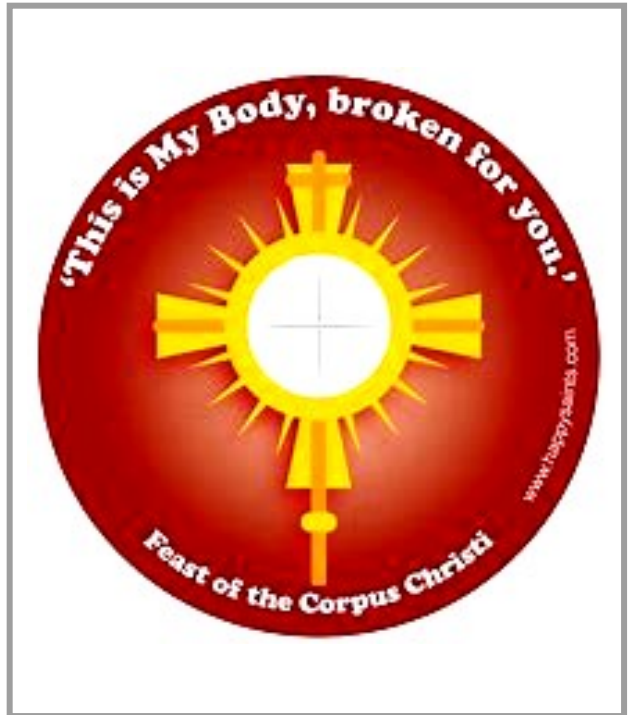

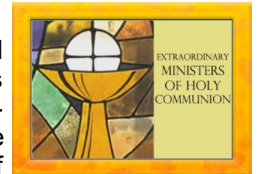

FAITH FORMATION CONFERENCE

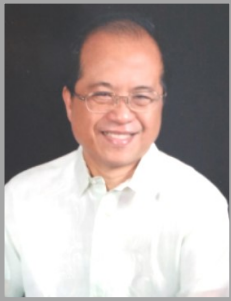

We urge our parish leaders, catechists, ministers, and any interested parishioner to attend. Fees will be paid by the parish.

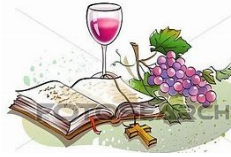

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Genesis 3:9-15

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 130:1-8

Second Reading
2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Gospel
Mark 3:20-35

First Reading: *Exodus 24:3-8*

Moses presents the people the words and ordinances of the Lord. The people acknowledge their acceptance of the Lord's commands saying they will follow everything the Lord tells them. The ritual of Moses writing down the Lord's words, building an altar, sanctifying the altar with the blood of young bulls proclaiming the Lord's word to the people, and sprinkling the people with the blood of the covenant seals the covenant between the Lord and his people. On the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ we celebrate today, we commemorate the gifts of both Christ's Body and Blood that fulfilled the Mosaic covenant.

Second Reading: *Hebrews 9:11-15*

Through his own blood, Christ the high priest mediates a new covenant. If the blood of animals can make holy those who have sinned, the Blood of Christ will cleanse even more. So much more will Christ's blood erase our blemishes that sacrifices animals to the Lord is no longer necessary. Once for all, Christ came into the sanctuary. Through his sacrifice Christ made the gift of eternal redemption available to everyone. His Death delivered us from sin and holds out the grace of new life to us.

Gospel: *Mark 14:12-16, 22-26*

The Gospel reading comes from Mark's account of the Passion. Mark's Passion narrative was also proclaimed on Palm Sunday. Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and shares the bread with his disciples. Then he repeats similar actions with the cup of wine. He takes, blesses (give thanks), and shares the wine with his disciples. Each time we celebrate the memorial of the Eucharist, we remember and make present what Jesus said and did. His own sacrifice is the basis for the meal of the New Covenant. His is the Body we consume; his, the Blood we drink.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

As the Catechists and children take their summer break we wish them a safe and enjoyable vacation. Let's keep praying for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values and prepare them well for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion*. We thank especially *Sr. Clemence Mira, SPC*, who has served with apostolic dedication for 10 years as Religious Education Coordinator. We are forever grateful to her.

The Urgent Call of Jesus Christ

I have often been struck by one paragraph of the U.S. bishops' pastoral letter, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response: "Jesus' call is urgent. He does not tell people to follow him at some time in the future but here and now — at this moment, in these circumstances. There can be no delay" (p. 14). For me, this is a powerful statement that speaks to the practical implications of the call and challenge of discipleship and stewardship. It is easy to tell ourselves that we will get around to living and growing as a follower of Jesus at some future point in our lives — when we are more settled, our children are older, our jobs are more secure, and so on. In doing so, we delay our response to the Lord's continual offer of salvation, mercy, forgiveness, and love. We minimize the impact of faith, falling deaf to God's voice and blind to the needs of others. To accept the urgent call of Christ is to hear the voice of the Lord, and to respond in the way in which we live now, not in some distant future. Not only this. Christ does not call us in an abstract way, but instead within the particular circumstances of our lives. This is not about some vague and ideal future. It is about making decisions, discerning activities, and carrying out our lives as Christ's people at home, in our workplace or school, in our parish, our cities and towns, and the in the world.

In the Easter season, we celebrated Christ's victory over death. We are called again to draw others to the new life that is offered in Jesus Christ. When we hear and respond to Christ's urgent call, we witness to the profound impact of faith in our lives and we evangelize, drawing others to a deep encounter with our Lord. We do this by stewarding our lives, gifts and blessings, and resources, here and now, in this moment, in the very real circumstances of our lives.

In their Annual Convocation, the priests were again reminded by the Bishop on working in concert to spread the biblical message of stewardship and implement it as a way of life among all parishioners.

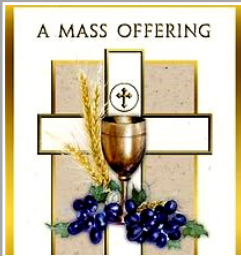

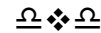





ON VACATION
