

Next Sunday's Reading The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

First Reading Exodus 24:3-8

Hebrews 9:11-15

Psalm 116:12-13, 15-18 Second Reading

Gospel

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Responsorial Psalm

First Reading: Deuteronomy 4:32-34; 39-40

Moses addresses the people and asks them to reflect about the greatness of their experience with God. His rhetorical questions about the people hearing the voice of God in fire and God taking and rescuing the people from slavery in Egypt, lead Moses to declare there is no other God— Father, Son and Holy Spirit—is the same God who chose the people of Israel as his own. May we keep his commandments today and always so that we may know his promise of prosperity.

Second Reading: Romans 8:14-17

Paul gives testimony to our familial relationship with God. Through the working of the Holy Spirit we are children of God, God's sons and daughters. Paul reaches us that because we are God's children, we are heirs, and will inherit everlasting life with Christ. We suffer earthly trials with Christ, but in the end we will share in his glory.

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

Even the eleven remaining disciples who went to the mountain with Jesus and worshipped, doubted. Matthew does not explain why they doubted, but just that they did. Perhaps they were concerned about what was to come. Perhaps they were concerned about Jesus leaving them. When Jesus came near and spoke to them he gave them what is known as the "Great Commission." Power in heaven and earth was given to Jesus, and now he sends his disciples forth to form more disciples. They are to baptize the disciples-to-be in the "name of the Father, and of the Son," and of the Holy Spirit" - the Trinitarian formula the Church has used for centuries when the baptismal water is poured. Jesus concludes with words of reassurance to his disciples. He will go forth in mission and will remain with them forever, until the end of time.

Stewardship: A Life-Giving Spirituality



During my forty-seven years of priestly ministry, I have had a variety of experiences and met some truly wonderful people. In these different settings one thing was constant, the people with whom I ministered had a shared hunger for a deeper relationship with God.

What most people lacked, however, was a spirituality that would allow them to have a deeper relationship with God. Most people did not think they had or needed a spirituality. The definition of spirituality that I use is "the lens through which we encounter and respond to God's presence in our lives." Stewardship is a spirituality that will enrich the lives of all Christians. My first experience with stewardship was before the American bishops wrote their 1992 pastoral letter, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response. Before that pastoral letter, stewardship was for many a code word for money. Stewardship was always about "Time, Talent and Treasure." Nevertheless, before the bishops' pastoral letter, the approach was grab their money and their time and talent will follow. After their pastoral letter, people were invited to share their time and talent and their treasure would follow.

Growing are the people who believe what the bishops said at the beginning of Stewardship: A Disciples Response, "The Christian vocation is essentially a call to be a disciple of Jesus. Stewardship is part of that. Even more to the point, however, Christians are called to be good stewards of the personal vocations they receive. Each of us must discern, accept, and live out joyfully and generously the commitments, responsibilities, and roles to which God calls him or her."

I embraced the spirituality of stewardship more than twenty-five years ago. My life has never been the same. Over the years, I have witnessed the profound transformation in people's lives when they embraced the spirituality of stewardship. I encourage you to enter more deeply into the spirituality called Stewardship.
