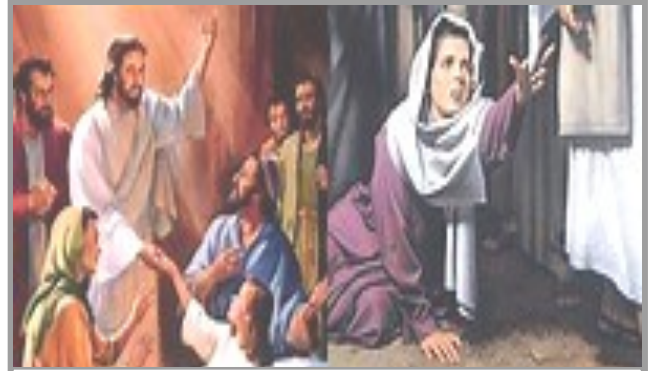

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

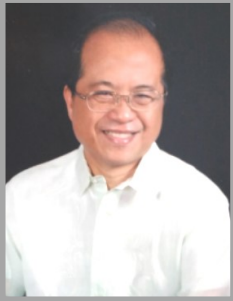
As the Catechists and children take their summer break we wish them a safe and enjoyable vacation. Let's keep praying for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values. We thank especially Sr. Clemence Mira, SPC, who has served with apostolic dedication for 10 years as Religious Education Coordinator. We are forever grateful to her.

Beginning this coming Catechetical Year 2018-2019, we shall have a minor revamp of the structure of our RE program. As mandated by the Diocese, we shall now implement the *Comprehensive Youth Program* which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. Grade VI to VIII will go through the **Life Edge** youth formation while Grades IX to XII will follow the **Life Teen** formation. The two systems have been started to be implemented by the combined force of our Catechists and Youth Minister last year and they are to be more thoroughly followed up this year. The online program has been purchased and donated to our Church by a generous supporter and benefactress of our children and youth. The lower classes will be handled as usual by our volunteer Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion*.

We urge the parents, grandparents, guardians and all parishioners to join hands in encouraging their children to attend the Sunday Mass during vacation and act as primary catechists and models of living the Christian faith.

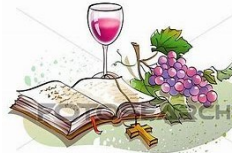

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Ezekiel 2:2-5

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 123:1-4

Second Reading
2 Corinthians 12:7-10

Gospel
Mark 6:1-6

First Reading: *Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24*

Death does not come from God. The jealousy of the devil brought death into the world. There is neither anything within God's creatures nor in the way he created them that causes harm. From the beginning, God fashioned us for immortality. We were not made to perish because he made us in his own image - the divine image. Notice the echoes of the creation accounts from Genesis 1 and 2 in the reading.

Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15*

Paul invites the Corinthians to a "gracious act" of economic stewardship in support of the community at Jerusalem. He supports his invitation with the theological underpinning of Jesus Christ's own example. Out of his richness, Jesus became poor, and through his poverty, he became rich. God became human in Jesus Christ so that our humanity could be taken up into divinity through his Death, Resurrection, and Ascension.

Gospel: *Mark 5:21-43*

As Jairus and Jesus were making their way to the synagogue official's home, a woman who was part of the large crowd following them, reached out and touched Jesus' cloak. She was now free from her twelve-year hemorrhages. Others then announce the death of Jairus' daughter, but Jesus pays no attention to their request, for Jesus took his daughter by the hand and upon his word to arise she did. These two healing miracles testify to the power of Jesus and his word. In Jesus, is the presence of life, not death. This provides a connection to the passage from Wisdom in the First Reading.

C. Ceria-Ulep, OLM Pastoral Council President, June 23-24, 2018

The Pastoral Council chairpersons and I along with the Finance Council and the Stewardship Committee will be providing you the Annual Good News Report!

Much of the Pastoral Council activities this past year have been implementing the Pastoral Plan and OLM Five Year Plans that we presented during the successful visit by Bishop Silva in May, 2017.

A Brief report on FACE that we have been a member of since 1996.

For 22 years, FACE has been working on legislation to help family take care of our elders. Last year, we finally succeeded! Act 102, the Kupuna Caregivers Act, created the Kupuna Caregivers Program, to help working family members take care of their kupunas. The intent of the bill was to provide \$70 per day to covers costs for services including: transportation, personal care services, respite care, adult day care, chores and homemaking services. This year, there was \$1.2 million appropriated for this program with the restriction of \$70 per week per recipient which was not the intent of the program. This will not keep working family members to stay in the workforce. FACE, Caring Across Generations, and others that worked with us wrote letters to the Governor not to put this restriction. We are waiting for the response.

On Monday, June 25, Mrs Ige, the Governor's wife, was happy to report that the Governor had consulted with the Attorney General, who determined that such a proviso (\$70 per week restriction) is unconstitutional in Hawaii. Consequently, the Kupuna Caregivers Program will continue to be implemented as it was originally intended.

A victory of FACE during this year's legislative session is the passage of House Bill 2748 that will commit \$200 million to the affordable housing fund! This is to address the homelessness issue in our state.

At this time, we have our FACE Annual Investment Drive. Connie DeSantos, Jennifer Jandoc & I will be approaching you to invest in FACE. Thank you in advance for your support of FACE! OLM Church also gives to FACE through our annual dues.

To meet the goals that we have set in our Pastoral Plan, we need you all to participate—big or small. In particular, as Marc has reported, we are about to launch our Stewardship Program which will need everyone to participate to be successful. So, when any of the Committee chairpersons ask you to become members of their committees, or participate, please say, "yes!"

In closing, thank you all Our Lady of the Mount co-parishioners for contributing your time, talent and treasure in our efforts to make OLM a welcoming and vibrant parish and for your part in making the **Save our Convent Raffle Fund-Raising** a success this year! Thank you as well to Fr. Edgar and Fr. Adrian, our shepherds, for guiding our OLM faith community and to Sr. Clemence for directing our Religious Education.

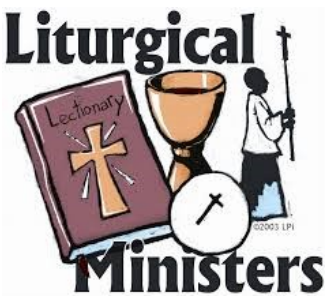

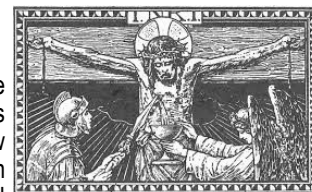


In their Annual Convocation, the priests were again reminded by the Bishop on working in concert to spread the biblical message of stewardship and implement it as a way of life among all parishioners.

Spirituality of Stewardship

I believe that the best and most barebones definition of spirituality is:

"The lens through which we encounter and respond to God's presence in our lives."

In the many years I have served Christ's church as a priest, I have noticed that lay people are frequently afraid to share their spirituality. I have come to the conclusion that many laypeople expect religious men and women to have spirituality, but they don't expect to have one themselves. I firmly believe that spirituality of stewardship can help correct this false premise. Let's begin the corrective process by *coming up with a definition of spirituality*. I believe that the best and most barebones definition of spirituality is: *"The lens through which we encounter and respond to God's presence in our lives."* My interest in stewardship was first piqued because I was looking for ways to get members of the parish more involved in the life of the parish. It was while I was searching for ways to present the spirituality of stewardship to members of the parish that it dawned on me that if I were going to ask others to do something, I had to be willing to do it myself – always a good philosophy. My journey from introducing stewardship to embracing it for myself was an axial moment in my life as both a believer and as a priest.

When the parish leadership team first introduced stewardship and when I first embraced it, we asked members of the parish to become stewards of the Good News of Jesus Christ. In the parish bulletin, we did not ask for volunteers; we asked for stewards. I embraced stewardship before the American Bishops wrote their wonderful 1992 pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciples Response*. That document gave me a vocabulary to better explain stewardship and a format to help me evaluate my efforts to both embrace and live stewardship. The bishops explained stewardship as a four-step process: *"What identifies a steward? Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is generously giving of time, talent and treasure. But being a Christian steward means more. As Christian stewards, (1) we receive God's gifts gratefully, (2) cultivate them responsibly, (3) share them lovingly in justice with others, and (4) return them with increase to the Lord."* In subsequent chapters, we will look at each aspect of this process.

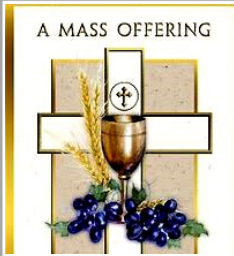

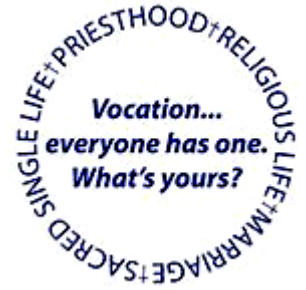

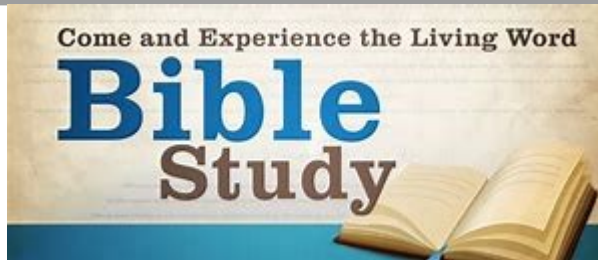

CHARISMATIC PRAYER MEETING

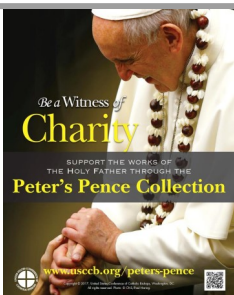
