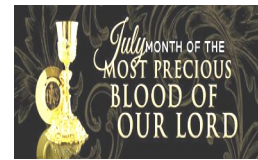

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



A **MEETING FOR ALL THE CATECHISTS AND YOUTH MINISTERS** will be held on July 29, after the 8:30am Mass. They will plan the calendar for the year and prepare for the **registration of our children** in the month of August. **Classes will begin** on the Sunday after Labor Day, September 9.

Beginning this coming Catechetical Year 2018-2019, we shall have a minor revamp of the structure of our RE program. As mandated by the Diocese, we shall now implement the *Comprehensive Youth Program* which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. Grade VI to VIII will go through the **Life Edge** youth formation while Grades IX to XII will follow the **Life Teen** formation.

The two systems have been put in trial by the combined force of our Catechists and Youth Minister last year and they are to be more thoroughly followed up this year. The online program has been purchased and donated to our Church by a generous supporter and benefactress of our children and youth. The lower classes will be handled as usual by our volunteer Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion*.

Let's keep praying for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values. We are happy to welcome them all back in the coming Catechetical Year including *Dorothy Pregil* who is returning from a brief family leave.

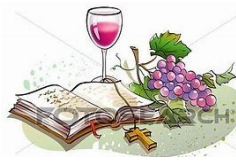

Next Sunday's Reading 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Jeremiah 23:1-6

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 23:1-6

Second Reading
Ephesians 2:13-18

Gospel
Mark 6:30-34

First Reading: Amos 7:12-15

Amaziah, a priest of Bethel, flatly rejects Amos' words and orders him to leave town and go to the land of Judah. Amos was one of the twelve minor prophets. He proclaimed the Lord's words in the northern kingdom during a relatively successful period in Israel's history. Yet Amos' prophetic words disgruntled many affluent kings, priests, and other leaders whose greed caused them to trample the poor. While Amaziah aligns Amos with the professional class of prophets in today's reading, Amos is clear that he was working as a shepherd when the Lord called him. From within our ordinary, daily work, the Lord calls us, too.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14

What gifts God gives us! Spiritual blessing from the heavens belongs to us. Adoption through Jesus Christ is ours. Redemption by the Blood of Christ and the forgiveness of sins is also ours. The knowledge of his will, he gives us. This great hymn of blessing that opens the letter to the Ephesians invites us to consider the many ways God the Father blesses us through Jesus Christ and give thanks. There is a longer and shorter form of today's reading.

Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

Not alone does Jesus send the Twelve out, but with a partner. He sends them out in mission with authority over demonic spirits, the same authority he had that comes from God. What are the Twelve to take with them for the journey? Nothing. They do not have to worry about carrying the weight of possessions. Proper footwear is essential, but they will not need a second tunic. They are only to stay where people welcome them, following Jesus' example of leaving places that take offense at their preaching and miraculous deeds. The message of the twelve is repentance, a change of heart akin to Amos' message to those who acted unjustly.

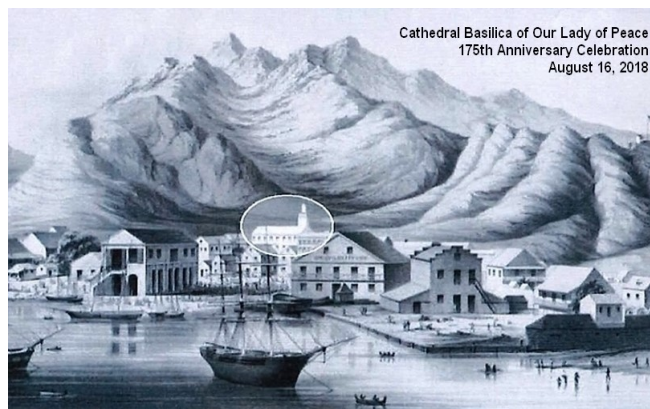

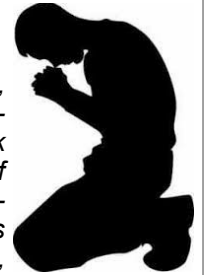
STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Growth in Stewardship

The Spirituality of Stewardship: A Process of Conversion

Recently, I have found myself in conversation with leaders who truly grasp the responsibility of leading others to embrace stewardship as a deeply spiritual way of life. As one noted, *"It is one thing to take the call to live and grow as a steward to heart in my own life. It is quite something else to lead others to put stewardship into practice."* Stewardship requires an ongoing process of conversion. This is true in our own lives, and in the life of our parish or diocese and involves four inter-related steps (see United States Bishops' pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response* (USCCB Publishing, Washington, D.C. Quotations are cited in the tenth anniversary edition, 2002)):

- 1. Commitment.** Living as disciples requires us to make a *"conscious, firm decision, carried out in action, to be followers of Jesus Christ no matter the cost to themselves."* (Stewardship, p. 5). As stewardship leaders, we grow in our own commitment to Christ and invite others to do so as well. Our commitment as Christians becomes the vision and purpose for our lives.
- 2. Call.** Disciples answer the call of the Lord in their daily lives. Jesus does not only call once, but over and over, throughout the course of our lives. This truly is life-changing! When people grasp that they are called to carry out Christ's mission in the world, their lives take on new and greater meaning.
- 3. Discernment.** Discernment is more than simply deciding to do something. It is a process of prayerfully aligning our heart and life with God, recognizing our many blessings, and responding out of gratitude by sharing the gifts that have been entrusted to us. Discernment is sometimes a straight-forward process of doing what we know is right, but often needs and benefits from the companionship of others, as we listen for and respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Action.** It is not enough to know ourselves as Christ's people and to become attentive to the Lord's call. *"This commitment is expressed not in a single action, nor even in a number of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life..."* (Stewardship, p. 5). From my perspective, this conversion process is about having a vision of ourselves and our faith communities as disciples and stewards firmly in mind and moving more toward the vision every step of the way. Over the next few months, we will explore the implication of this process more extensively.

FINANCE COUNCIL - Rebecca Jandoc, Chairperson

On behalf of your Finance Council, I am pleased to report that the parish maintained expenses and spent within or well below allocated amounts. Overall offertory collections received were very close to projection. We will continue to keep a close watch on expenses as we begin the next fiscal year. We have not yet finalized next year's budget but will do so soon.

In the area of training and workshops, the allocated funds are always underutilized. Still we did not decrease the amount as *Father Edgar* encourages everyone to attend the educational sessions made available throughout the year for your personal and spiritual development.

This year we held our first major fundraiser in more than 10 years to raise funds towards the much-needed convent repairs. Together we raised \$100,000. After expenses and other donations, almost \$90,000 is immediately available to begin the convent repairs. We are not done fundraising for the convent and will need to have a few more fundraisers.

When evaluating possible fundraisers, the goal is to have one that would be the most profitable, but more importantly, the most engaging where most of our parishioners will be able to participate in one way or another. Some suggested that we should consider selling popular food items.

To give you an idea of the profit margin, for every \$10 raffle ticket that was sold we made \$9.00. As an example, if we sold Zippy's chili or Koala Moa chicken, our profit might be around \$3.00 maybe \$4.00 for every \$10.00. To make the same profit as the raffle we would need to sell around 25,000-33,000 pieces versus the 9,000 raffle tickets. That's a lot of chili and chicken but we can consider it if the parish want to do this as a future fundraiser. Just some food for thought.

Before I close, I would like to say thank you to the current Finance Council members for your support and commitment to the oversight and safeguarding of the parishes funds. They are: *Fran Kovaloff, Jane Baron, Pamata Liua* and *Yolanda Rucker* who also serves as secretary.

The Finance Council would like to thank *Yvonne Tuihalafatai* who volunteers countless hours after her own workday as our parish bookkeeper. She is not only responsible for paying our bills on time, she also keeps the parish financials current and compliant and is an invaluable support and resource to the team.

Thank you for your continued generosity. Your offerings are important to sustain the ongoing operations and upkeep the parish.



PARISH PLANNING & BUILDING COMMITTEE - Joyce Oliveira, Chairperson

On behalf of Planning and Building Committee, we extend our sincere appreciation to the members of the Finance Council and most especially to all of you for participation and contributions towards the convent fundraiser drive.

This past fiscal year the Committee was able to complete the convent floor under the direction of *Kalolo Tuihalafatai*.

The completion of this flooring project kicked off our faith community's enthusiasm to raise additional funds for the remaining phases of our convent renovation.

Efforts are currently underway to (1) inspection and repair of the convent roof, followed by (2) replacement of all window frames, jalousies, and repair of all interior cabinetry in our convent building.

As additional funds become available, future phases also include (1) an update to the electrical and plumbing parts and (2) fixtures and finally interior and exterior painting of the convent.

It will be a busy year for the Planning and Building Committee and for those of you who are interested in participating in the planning efforts of these important Capital Improvement Projects, I invite you to attend our Committee's monthly meetings on the THIRD Monday of each month from 6-7:30 pm in the Rectory Office.

Finally, I'd like to recognize the efforts of each member of the Planning and Building Committee. *Roger Isidro, Rudy Fiesta, Kalolo Tuihalafatai, Jose and Daniel Jandoc, Pamata Liua* and *Silver Palting* under the leadership of *Father Edgar*.

There are also those who also take the initiative to plan individual projects, like the installation of fans in the church hall by *Father Adrian, Jun Cortez* and *Paul Valbuena*.

These gentlemen are our unsung heroes who work throughout the year on projects with very little fanfare. But I hope you will join me in personally thanking them for their efforts to improve and maintain of church facilities for your families and the next generation of parishioners of Our Lady of the Mount.

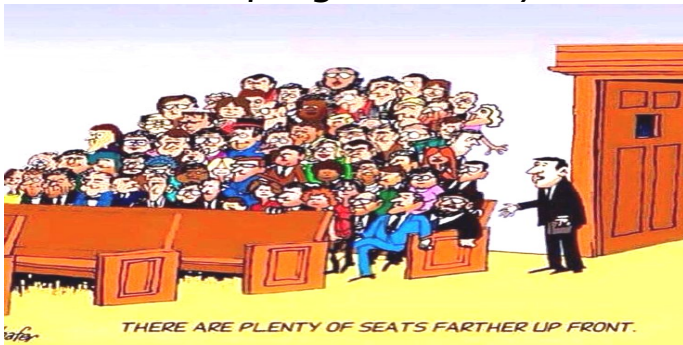
