



Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading 2 Kings 4:42-44

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 145:10-11, 15-18

Second Reading Ephesians 4:1-6

Gospel John 6:1-15

First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

Jeremiah's prophetic words in the first oracle are a warning to those who mislead the Lord's people. The shepherds who did not care tor their people, the Lord will punish. No longer will they have their jobs, for the Lord will replace them with shepherds who will tend to their flocks. In the second oracle, Jeremiah communicates the Lord's promise that he will raise up a "righteous shoot" to David. The king will save both Israel and Judah through his reign of justice. As Christians, we believe Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of this oracle. He is our justice, the justice of the world.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18

Christ Jesus abolishes the wall that once divided Jews and Gentiles. They are now one Body in Christ existing in peace. All the legalities and detailed commands of the Mosaic law are no longer necessary. What is necessary is that we strive as a people to live the unity of the one Church in reality. We can remind each other of the peace Jesus brought so as to overcome factionalism when it does appear.

Gospel: *Mark* 6:30-34

Last Sunday, Jesus sent the Twelve out to proclaim repentance, to exorcise demons, and to heal the sick. In this Sunday's Gospel, the Twelve return and provide Jesus with a summary report. True to his form as an evangelist of few words, Mark does not describe to us what the Twelve reported. Their mission, however, must have exhausted them because Jesus invites them to come away and rest by themselves. Crowds followed them even when they left by boat. Jesus' mercy took over as he responds to crowds who desperately need a shepherd. Perhaps the Twelve were still able to rest and Jesus' mercy extended to them as well as the crowds he taught.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

A MEETING FOR ALL THE CATECHISTS AND YOUTH MINISTERS will be held on July 29, after the 8:30am Mass. They will plan the calendar for the year and prepare for the registration of our children in the month of August. Classes will begin on the Sunday after Labor Day, September

Beginning this coming Catechetical Year 2018-2019, we shall have a minor revamp of the structure of our RE program. As mandated by the Diocese, we shall now implement the Comprehensive Youth Program which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. Grade VI to VIII will go through the Life Edge youth formation while Grades IX to XII will follow the *Life Teen* formation. The two systems have been put in trial by the combined force of our Catechists and Youth Minister last year and they are to be more thoroughly followed up this year. The online program has been purchased and donated to our Church by a generous supporter and benefactress of our children and youth. The lower classes will be handled as usual by our volunteer Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of First Reconciliation,

Confirmation and First Communion.

Let's keep praying for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values. We are happy to welcome them all back in the coming Catechetical Year including *Dorothy Pregil* who is returning from a brief family leave.

We urge the parents, grandparents, guardians and all parishioners to join hands in encouraging their children to attend

the Sunday Mass during vacation and act as primary catechists and models in living the Christian faith.

Growth in Stewardship The Spirituality of Stewardship: A **Process of Conversion**

Recently, I have found myself in conversation with leaders who truly grasp the responsibility of leading others to embrace stewardship as a deeply spiritual way of life. As one noted, "It is one thing to take the call to live and grow as a steward to heart in my own life. It is guite something else to lead others to put stewardship into practice." Stewardship requires an ongoing process of conversion. This is true in our own lives, and in the life of our parish or diocese and involves four inter-related steps (see United States Bishops' pastoral letter, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response (USCCB Publishing, Washington, D.C. Quotations are cited in the tenth anniversary edition, 2002)):

- 1. Commitment. Living as disciples requires us to make a "conscious, firm decision, carried out in action, to be followers of Jesus Christ no matter the cost to themselves." (Stewardship, p. 5). As stewardship leaders, we grow in our own commitment to Christ and invite others to do so as well. Our commitment as Christians becomes the vision and purpose for our lives.
- 2. Call. Disciples answer the call of the Lord in their daily lives. Jesus does not only call once, but over and over, throughout the course of our lives. This truly is life-changing! When people grasp that they are called to carry out Christ's mission in the world, their lives take on new and greater meaning.
- 3. **Discernment**. Discernment is more than simply deciding to do something. It is a process of prayerfully aligning our heart and life with God, recognizing our many blessings, and responding out of gratitude by sharing the gifts that have been entrusted to us. Discernment is sometimes a straight-forward process of doing what we know is right, but often needs and benefits from the companionship of others, as we listen for and respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Action. It is not enough to know ourselves as Christ's people and to become attentive to the Lord's call. "This commitment is expressed not in a single action, nor even in a number of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life..." (Stewardship, p. 5).

From my perspective, this conversion process is about having a vision of ourselves and our faith communities as disciples and stewards firmly in mind and moving more toward the vision every step of the way. Over the next few months, we will explore the implication of this process more


NOVENA TO PERPETUAL HELP


