RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

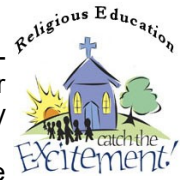
*This is a course for non-Catholics who want to know about the Catholic faith and interested to receive the sacraments. Sessions will be once a week and will start on September 9.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



A **MEETING FOR ALL THE CATECHISTS AND YOUTH MINISTERS** will be held this Sunday, July 29, after the 8:30am Mass. They will plan the calendar for the year and prepare for the **registration of our children** in the month of August. **Classes will begin** on the Sunday after Labor Day, September 9.



Beginning this coming Catechetical Year 2018-2019, we shall have a minor revamp of the structure of our RE program. As mandated by the Diocese, we shall now implement the **Comprehensive Youth Program** which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. Grade VI to VIII will go through the **Life Edge** youth formation while Grades IX to XII will follow the **Life Teen** formation. The two systems have been put in trial by the combined force of our Catechists and Youth Minister last year and they are to be more thoroughly followed up this year. The online program has been purchased and donated to our Church by a generous supporter and benefactress of our children and youth. The lower classes will be handled as usual by our volunteer Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion*.

Let's keep praying for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values. We are happy to welcome them all back in the coming Catechetical Year including *Dorothy Pregil* who is returning from a brief family leave.

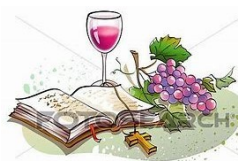

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 78:3-4, 23-25, 54

Second Reading
Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

Gospel
John 6:24-35

First Reading: 2 Kings 4:42-44

Twenty barley loaves and some fresh grain the man from Baal-Shalishah brought to Elisha to feed a hundred people. Who would believe that this would be enough food for that many people? Elisha's servant did not. But Elisha, the prophet who succeeded Elijah, refuses to rescind his instructions to the servant. Indeed, there was enough food and even some left over. The miracle story of Elisha feeding the one hundred pairs with the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish in the Gospel reading. God's abundant care for his people is evident in both. In God, we will never go hungry.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6

Ephesians 4 begins a section of the letter that offers moral instructions to Christians. The verses we proclaim today provide a list of virtues that teach us what it means to live as Christians. The statement of unity that includes seven "one" statements reveals how deep the communion among Christians within the Church is. The Church makes visible the unity founded on the "one Lord, one faith, one baptism," one God, and one Spirit because the Church is the one Body of Christ.

Gospel: John 6:1-15

From today through the end of August, the Gospel readings come from John 6 concern Jesus' identity as the Bread of Life. We begin in this chapter with the story of the multiplication of the five barley loaves and two fish. At the beginning of the story, Jesus inquires of Philip where they are going to procure enough food for the large crowd. Philip's response does not provide a practical solution, but simply restates the problem in monetary terms. Andrew notes the boy with the barley loaves and fish. Foreshadowing the Eucharist, Jesus give thanks and distributes the food. The disciples gather the leftovers. Through the miracle, Jesus provides more than enough for everyone to have their fill. Jesus rejects the earthly kingship he knows this great sign would bring, so he withdraws to the mountain again. His work is a ministry of nourishment for it is the will of his Father that he should feed people, even with his very life.

Growth in Stewardship

A Biblical Stewardship Principle: Everything We Have Is A Gift From God

The biblical notion of stewardship is rooted in a concept that is difficult for us inhabitants of the 21st century to accept – God is the owner of everything! In Genesis 2:15, we are given the roots of stewardship, "...God took the man and settled him in the garden of Eden to cultivate and take care of it" (The New Jerusalem Bible). God made the earth; God made Adam and Eve. Then he loaned the world to them so that they could care for it. Adam and Eve are the first stewards of creation. Their eating of the forbidden fruit has many meanings but one meaning is certainly that they tried to make themselves gods. They wanted to "own" what was "loaned" to them as gift for safekeeping. We have been repeating their sin ever since. The biblical concept of a jubilee year, every fifty years, as explained in Leviticus 25 makes it clear that everything belongs to God and is merely loaned to us as tenants, trustees or stewards. Debts were forgiven, and land was returned to its original owner to serve as a reminder that God, not we, owns the land. The Old Testament concept of the tithe was likewise a reminder that God owns everything, and it is merely loaned to us.

The concept of stewardship next appears in the earliest New Testament writings. Saint Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, offers powerful witness to his vision of stewardship, "People should think of us as Christ's servants, stewards entrusted with the mysteries of God. In such a matter, what is expected of stewards is that each one should be found trustworthy" (1 Cor. 4:12). Paul sees all believers as "stewards entrusted with the mysteries of God." I don't know about you, but I find that job description for believers to be both awe inspiring and frightening. It is a concept that will require much meditation and even more commitment on our part. Saint Peter continues the notion of stewardship: "Each one of you has received a special grace, so, like good stewards responsible for all these varied graces of God, put it at the service of others. If anyone is a speaker, let it be as the words of God, if anyone serves, let it be as in strength granted by God; so that in everything God may receive the glory, through Jesus Christ, since to him alone belong all glory and power for ever and ever. Amen" (1 Peter 4:10-11). I hope you are beginning to understand the challenge of stewardship as a spirituality. It is rooted in the Bible and based on the principle that everything we have is a gift from God.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

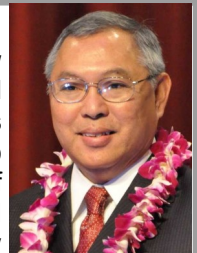
