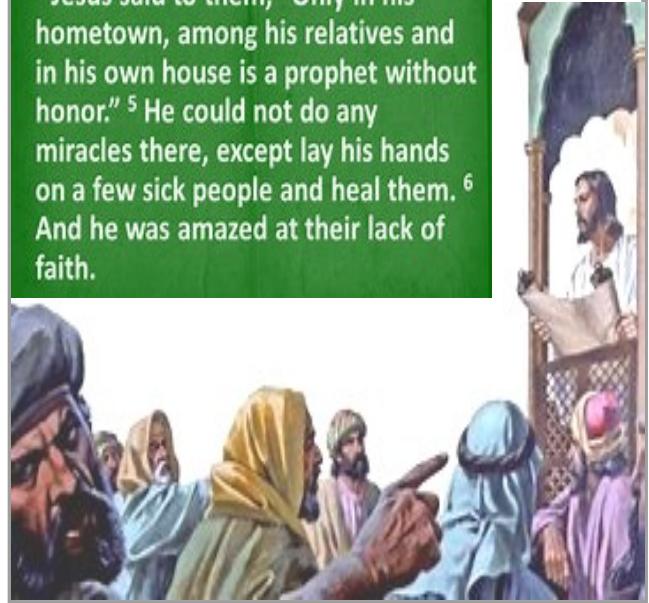

In all the Masses on the weekend of July 21-22, they will be recommissioned for the Eucharistic ministry.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

As the Catechists and children take their summer break we wish them a safe and enjoyable one. Let's keep praying for our children and youths. We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values. We thank especially *Sr. Clemence Mira, SPC*, who has served with apostolic dedication for 10 years as Religious Education Coordinator. We are forever grateful to her.



Beginning this coming Catechetical Year 2018-2019, we shall have a minor revamp of the structure of our RE program. As mandated by the Diocese, we shall now implement the *Comprehensive Youth Program* which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. Grade VI to VIII will go through the **Life Edge** youth formation while Grades IX to XII will follow the **Life Teen** formation. The two systems have been put in trial by the combined force of our Catechists and Youth Minister last year and they are to be more thoroughly followed up this year. The online program has been purchased and donated to our Church by a generous supporter and benefactress of our children and youth. The lower classes will be handled as usual by our volunteer Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion*.



A **MEETING FOR ALL THE CATECHISTS AND YOUTH MINISTERS** will be held on July 29, after the 8:30am Mass. They will plan the calendar for the year and prepare for the **registration of our children** in the month of August. **Classes will begin** on the Sunday after Labor Day, September 9.

We urge the parents, grandparents, guardians and all parishioners to join hands in encouraging their children to attend the Sunday Mass during vacation and act as primary catechists and models of living the Christian faith.



First Reading: *Ezekiel 2:2-5*
 Most of us would have rejected the Lord's call to be a prophet to the Israelites after he calls them rebels, mentioned they have "rebelled" against him, and that even their ancestors have "revolted." As if those words of the Lord would not have also had Ezekiel running, the Lord continues his depressing but realistic depiction of the people, pointing out their stubbornness and "obstinate" hearts. Once more at the close of the reading, the Lord calls the people "rebellious." No doubt Ezekiel wondered what he was getting into, but the Lord's prophetic call is so strong, Ezekiel accepts. The Lord's spirit was within holding him upright on his feet.

Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 12:7-10*
 Paul was worried about his ego growing too large but he had to have a certain amount of confidence in the face of other preachers who proclaimed false gospels. He attempted to steer the Corinthians away from the false preachers, and in order to do so, had to clearly validate his own ministry and the Gospel he preached. In the Old Testament, "thorns" symbolized one's enemies, including Satan. Thus, when Paul faces weakness - including persecution - as when we do the Lord's grace is sufficient for us. It is all we need. It makes us strong.

Gospel: *Mark 6:1-6*
 Following the healings of the woman with hemorrhages and Jairus's daughter, Jesus and his disciples journeyed to his hometown. On the Sabbath, he taught in the synagogue where people question the source of his teachings and wisdom. Four questions populate this short Gospel reading. They center on Jesus' identity for the people in the synagogue who at first recognize his mighty deeds, then turn on him. Jesus' response is the familiar words that acknowledge the only place a prophet has no honor is the place where he grew up. Jesus and his disciples move on from this place whose people lacked faith. Yet it is not that they did nothing there since Mark informs us they healed a few sick people. A majority's lack of faith never silences the power of God in the face of a few who believe.

In their Annual Convocation, the priests were again reminded by the Bishop on working in concert to spread the biblical message of stewardship and implement it as a way of life among all parishioners.

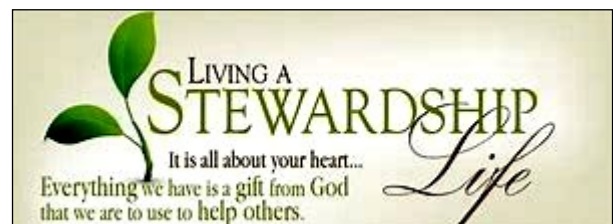

Growth in Stewardship

Christian stewardship is the "core curriculum" of the school of discipleship, from which one never graduates. The bishops' pastoral letter reveals our Blessed Mother to be a model of stewardship par excellence, and even she was called by the Lord's messenger before responding: "I am the Lord's servant, may your word be fulfilled through me" (Luke 1:38).

Our stewardship "vocation" is therefore something that we accept and grow into as we continue to grow in our relationship with God. Growth in stewardship means gradually enhancing our ability to see the whole of life as a sacred trust. It is our developing and ongoing response to the creative activity of God as it is encountered in personal experience, in the church, and in the world. It encourages us to constantly ask the psalmist's question: "What return shall I make to the Lord for all the good He has done for me" (Psalm 116:12)?

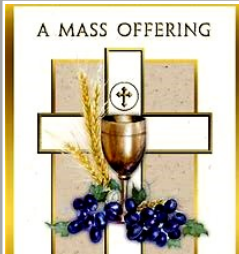

NOVENA TO PERPETUAL HELP


