



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (RE) PROGRAM



*ENROLLMENT of our children and youth for the Religious Education program is open.

Classes will begin on the Sunday after Labor Day, <u>September</u> 9 with a welcome and general meeting with the parents and guardians. Our catechists are available to help you outside the church after the Masses. Enrolment forms can be obtained from the church table.

Beginning this Catechetical Year 2018-2019, the *Comprehensive Youth Program* as mandated by the Diocese will be implemented which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. Grade VI to VIII will go through the *Life Edge* youth formation while Grades IX to XII will follow the *Life Teen* formation. Both the online program and the printed textbooks will be used and followed. The lower classes (K-Gr 5) will be handled as usual by the regular Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion* in Grade II. Students in higher grades who have not received the said initiation sacraments will also be included and prepared. The Grades K-5 program is designed to provide foundational presentation of the Catholic faith through the regular Sunday catechesis from September to May.

The Comprehensive Youth Ministry for Grades 6-12 is designed to attend to the spiritual needs of our youth in order to deepen the sacramental grace received in the initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion.

Our RE program follows the basic principle of supporting, assisting and encouraging parents in their role as the primary educators of their children in the faith. Parents teach informally, but essentially and powerfully, their children at home by example and instructions. So, we urge the parents, grandparents, guardians and all parishioners to enroll their children in the Religious Education and Youth Formation programs and act as primary catechists and models in living the Christian faith.

We thank the generous and joyful services of our ever-caring catechists who mold their minds and hearts with the Christian values. 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time



First Reading: Joshua 24:1-2, 15-18

Joshua, the successor of Moses, gathers the tribes of Israel at Shechem to renew their covenant with the Lord. The choice he presents to them, is also our choice. Who will we serve? Joshua's household will serve the Lord. The people of Israel chose similarly based on the history of God's faithfulness to them. No other god can compare to God's faithfulness to us in Christ Jesus, so may this reading lead us to respond in service to the Lord as Joshua and the Israelites.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:21-32

The mutual love between husband and wife symbolizes the love between Christ and the Church. Such a tremendous mystery is the love between husband and wife and Christ and the Church, that even a lifetime of love with not completely unfold it. There is a longer and shorter form of the reading.

Gospel: John 6:60-29

Last Sunday's Gospel began with the Jews argued among themselves because they did not understand how Jesus could give his flesh for people to eat. This Sunday's Gospel opens with the disciples murmuring about how hard Jesus' saying about eating his flesh and drinking his Blood to have life within them is. Some disciples would return to their previous life and others would remain followers of Jesus. Jesus' question to the Twelve about whether they also want to leave parallels Joshua's question to the tribes of Israel. Simon Peter's corresponds to Joshua's in that it is in affirmation of faith. He believes that Jesus has the words of eternal life.

Stewardship and Missionary Discipleship: Tending Our Faith Responsibly

Saint John Paul II wrote "Life is entrusted to man as a treasure

a talent which must be used well" (*Evangelium Vitae, 52*). Our late pontiff also wrote:

It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives, the will to follow an ideal, the refusal to allow yourselves to be ground down by mediocrity, the courage to commit yourselves humbly and patiently to improving yourselves and society, making the world more human and more fraternal (Prayer Vigil, World Youth Day, August 19, 2000).

Another year of learning begins. Teachers everywhere will assemble students, engaging and encouraging them to discover their talents, recognize and focus on their potential, and understand more about life, faith, and the world. Likewise, "Missionary Discipleship" calls each of us to commit ourselves to learning more about our faith.

The need for ongoing formation and catechesis is not just for the young. It's vital for everyone, throughout our lives. We respond to the call to be Missionary Disciples and gratefully receive the gift of our faith and cherish it. However, before we can share our faith with others in justice and love, we must tend to it, in a responsible and accountable manner.

What are some ways we could tend to our faith? Here are a few ideas from some of our ICSC members:

Join, or lead, a parish Bible study group. Start a book club reading religious books about saints, liturgy and Catholic practices. Subscribe to or download an app for a daily devotional with reflection and commentary. Participate in a diocesan faith-formation course. Check a nearby seminary for courses available to laity. Read religious pamphlets and the diocesan newspaper or magazine. Look for Catholic educational resources online or on DVD. Search for and read online the documents and summaries from the Second Vatican Council. Talk to your pastor, parish life director, or pastoral associate. Pray every day, often.

As regards to prayer, it would be a good idea to set aside time routinely for complete silence in order to listen for God's still, small voice, like Elijah waiting in the cave. He too was humbly and patiently waiting to improve himself and society. The Lord called Elijah with a whisper, sending him on a mission to Damascus (1 Kings 19:12-16). We, too, are summoned to fulfill a role only we can play using the gift of faith entrusted to us. What is God pressing on your heart to do with your faith? How will you respond? The first 3 successive Sundays of the month is the presentation of the speakers' testimony and **on the fourth week**-



end, this weekend, all parishioners will solemnly offer their commitment cards at the altar of the Lord. This is part of the process designed by the Diocese to gear up our parishioners towards making their commitment to stewardship as a way of life in the parish.

A 2018 Commitment Card pamphlet was distributed to parishioners. It shows the Four Aspects of Stewardship: Pray Gratefully, Witness Joyfully, Serve Compassionately and Give Generously and lists ways you can be a good steward.
