

*SEPTEMBER 9: WELCOME TO THE START OF THE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM YEAR 2018-2019.

After the 8:30am Mass, *all catechists, parents, guardians and children* shall proceed to the Parish hall for opening activities, instructions and guidance,



and review of important policies and guidelines. *Lucille Mohika*, who is appointed RE Coordinator to assist *Fr. Edgar*, will facilitate.

Next Sunday, <u>September 16</u>, is **Catechetical Sunday**. *All catechists and Youth Ministers* will make their *commissioning rite* during the 8:30am Mass.

Beginning this Catechetical Year 2018-2019, the *Comprehensive Youth Program* as mandated by the Diocese will be implemented which starts with Grade VI up to Grade XII. The lower classes (K-Gr 5) will be handled as usual by the regular Catechists who will prepare them for the sacraments of *First Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Communion* in Grade II. Students in higher grades who have not received the said initiation sacraments will also be included and prepared.



Next Sunday's Reading 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Isaiah 50:5-9

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 116:1-6, 8-9

Second Reading James 2:14-18 Gospel Mark 8:27-35

First Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7

The prophet's message offers hope to a frightened people. God will come to save them. What marvelous healing will take place when God comes: the blind will see, the deaf will hear, the lame will leap, and the mute will sing! Nature will reflect God's coming, too, as life-giving waters will appear in deserts and grasslands, on dry ground and within burning sands.

Second Reading: James 2:1-5

Favoritism has no place in Christian assemblies. Our attention should go equally to the rich and the poor, for human distinctions matter not in God's community. In fact, James reminds his beloved brothers and sisters n faith, that God chose the poor to acquire the riches of faith and inherit God's Kingdom.

Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

Jesus fulfills Isaiah's words and heals a deaf man with a speech impediment. In Jesus, the deaf hear and the mute speak! Jesus opens our lives to the gift of salvation he offers. Time after time, he astonishes us, like he did the crowds centuries ago. Will we proclaim him as they did?


