



Gracious and loving God, we thank you for the gift of our priests, especially for Fr. Edgar and Fr. Adrian. Through them we experience your presence in the sacraments.



TODAY IS PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY

The priesthood is a calling from God who chooses and sends on a mission those who respond and gives His Spirit, strength and His grace as they serve Him.

At ordination, the priest is anointed, so that he may anoint others; he is blessed so that he may be a blessing to others, and that grace is renewed every day through his ministry to those entrusted to his care.



A priest is today's shepherd involved in teaching, sanctifying and guiding the People of God through a life of ministerial service and leadership. Priests are preachers of the word, ministers of the Gospel, organizers of Christian communities, social leaders, spiritual guides, worship presiders, among others. The diocesan priest serves the people of God, to bring them Christ's healing love through prayer, the sacraments and by the Word of God. The priest is an 'alter Christus' meaning another Christ. He has the supreme joy and privilege of making Christ present in the Eucharist and in his person.

Priestly ministry is demanding and so to act fully for Christ, the priest must be sustained by his own prayer-relationship with God, as well as rooted deeply in the Sacraments and Scriptures.

On this Priesthood Sunday, let us think about all the Priests in our lives that we have known, our past and present Pastors, both deceased and

As the people of God, we are challenged to make a commitment and promise - *To pray for our Priests every day, not only for those we encounter, but for all Priests, because all Priests are our Priests; *To support and love our Priests! There are few enough Priests as it is, and if we don't support them or even just pray for them, we may lose them to discouragement, and may, in effect, discourage other men from considering the priestly vocation to which God is calling them.

Through Baptism, we all share in the priesthood of Christ. Let us celebrate the common priesthood of the lay faithful and the ministerial priesthood of the ordained!

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9

Joy marks the return of remnant - a large throng - from exile in the desert. The Lord has delivered his people. Their tears of departure contrast with the happiness upon their return. One point could not be clearer: the Lord has always been and will always be the Father of Israel

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

Jesus Christ is the Son of the Father from whom his high priesthood comes. The Father glorifies Christ and makes him a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek. Christ deals patiently with our sins because he shares in the fullness of our humanity. He offers himself for our sins because he also shares in the fullness of divinity.

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

Despite the rebuke of many, the blind beggar, Bartimaeus, would not stop calling out to Jesus for pity. Jesus does not ignore his cries, but rather calls him near and asks him what he desires. Bartimaeus simply wants to see. Jesus heals the blind man, noting that his faith saved him. Bartimaeus responds to his newly-gained sight by following Jesus.

I've been a parishioner of Our Lady of the Mount for over 50 years.

Stewardship begins with an increased focus on prayer in our life. Prayer is communication with God. It is a way of developing our relationship with God and strengthen our Faith. Often when we pray we ask God for his blessings, his help, his guidance, his strength, his forgiveness and much more. As stewards, we recognize that the talents we have are gifts from God and are meant to be shared. And so, we thank God for all that we are and all that we have by sharing these gifts with others.

I have thanked God over and over for my ability to teach, for the gift of patience, kindness, compassion and tolerance when working with children. These prayer-experiences remind me that it is through God's plan that I have been able to educate middle school teenagers for over 30 years as well as serve as a catechist at Our Lady of the Mount for over 20 years. Grateful prayer helps me to focus on the positives in my relationships with God and the children.

Grateful prayer does not need to be formal or scheduled into our lives. We can be spontaneously thankful to God anytime as we go through our day. 



There are two inquirers into the Christian faith - Gerald Bacus and Dave Bacus - who were presented to RICTAN INITIAT the parish community on the start of their precatechumenate period. Today they go through the important Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens. Following the precatechumenate period, the candidates declare publicly their intention to become members of the Church and the Church in turn, car-

rying out its apostolic mission, welcomes and accepts them. God showers his grace on the candidates on their reception and first consecration by the Church.

The prerequisite for this first step is that the beginnings of the spiritual life and the fundamentals of Christian teaching must have taken root in the candidates. They must have manifested some faith and initial conversion and intention to enter into a relationship with God in Christ. They must have started calling upon God in prayer, have some sense of the Church and some experience of the company and spirit of Christians.
