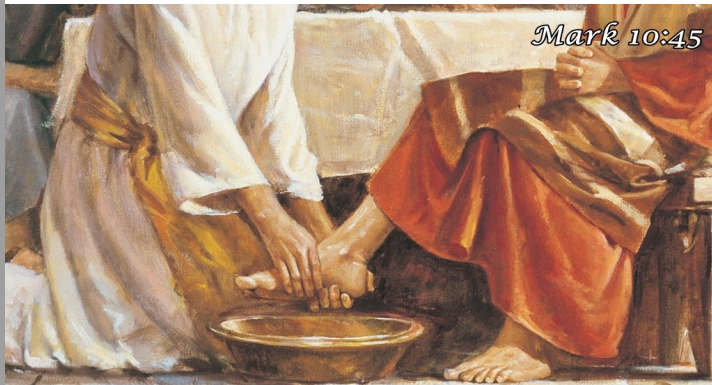

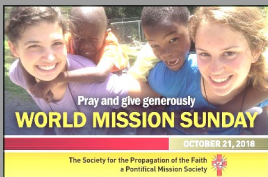

### TODAY IS WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

\*Second Collection: October 20-21

The theme for World Mission Sunday 2018 is "Through Youth To The World: Voices for Mission." Pope Francis addresses his message for this year's celebration to young people saying, "In speaking to you, I also address all Christians who live out in the Church the adventure of their life as children of God. What leads me to speak to everyone through this conversation with you is the certainty that the Christian faith remains ever young when it is open to the mission that Christ entrusts to us."

World Mission Sunday joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. Together with children of God in every corner of the globe, we become voices for mission, providing the prayerful and financial support necessary. We celebrate this day by remembering the revitalizing mission at the heart of our Christian faith – to bring the Gospel to all! The second collection today for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith ensures the work and service of the Mission Church, as it supports priests, religious and lay leaders who offer the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions. ### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CORNER

In the Catechists' monthly meeting last Sunday, October 14, the Coordinator, *Lucille Mohika*, reported that there are 56 students enrolled ranging from Grade 1-12. The Grade 2 students will be prepared for the sacraments of *Confirmation* and *First Communion* together with the higher-ups that have not yet made it. The Bishop will administer Confirmation to the candidates around April or May next year.

Our returning catechist, *Dorothy Pregil*, was asked to lead the *Comprehensive Youth Ministry* program of the Diocese for Grade 6-12 students. The former Youth Minister, *Ropati Liua*, is relocating to the Mainland together with his family. While we are most grateful for *Ropati's* outstanding leadership and services for our parish youth we hope to be able to find a replacement who can be a single adult or a couple. We are also looking for more catechists in the wake of the departure of two valuable catechists, *Arnie Kikkawa* and *Arlene Nishimura*. We are likewise very grateful to them for sharing their time, care and teaching skills to our children at OLM for many years.

Just as they led the communal rosary last Sunday, the RE students will start their *monthly Mass* this Sunday where they will serve as lectors, altar servers, collectors and gift-offerers during the Mass.

On October 28, they will hold the *HALLOWEEN Parade and Costume Contest* with prizes awarded to the *Most Original, Most Artistic and Most Spiritual*. The parents are encouraged to help their children dress up for the occasion and the parishioners and all are invited to distribute candies to them for the *Trick or Treat*.

In November, the children will bring at their monthly Mass their gifts for the poor as their *Thanksgiving Day offering* to be distributed at the Food Pantry and will also make their *Commitment Cards* in support of the parish stewardship program.

For December, the students will engage in *Christmas craft-making* which they will present as gifts to elderly folks in Care Centers. They will also participate in the *Christmas tableau* at the *Christmas Vigil Mass* on December 24.

Books for the catechists and students have been ordered and provided for and the Safe Environment requirements are being duly complied to.

Fr. Edgar extended, on behalf of all the catechists, prayers and condolences to *Dorothy Pregil* & her family on the untimely demise of her mother, +*Beatrice Lomam*. May she rest in peace.

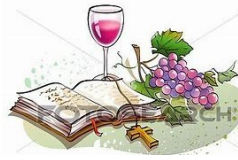

#### First Reading: *Isaiah 53:10-11*

The two verses from the fourth and final servant song in Isaiah describe how the sinless servant of the Lord justifies many through his own suffering. He gives his life as a sin offering. The Lord accomplishes his will through his servant.

#### Second Reading: *Hebrews 4:14-16*

Despite being without sin, Jesus our high priest, can sympathize with our weaknesses for he shares in the fullness of humanity. With confidence we approach the throne of our high priest to receive his gifts of mercy and grace. We confess Jesus, the Son of God, risen and reigning forever with the Father in heaven.

## OLM STEWARDSHIP: "Praying Gratefully"

First and foremost, I thank God for my mother, who was my inspiration, my rock, my model and example. She truly nurtured my faith life.

In my formative years (pre-Vatican), we had the Latin Mass and had catechism classes in the old wooden church which was where the hall now stands. I learned about Jesus and embraced the faith, received the sacraments, and memorized all the prayers.

We had Religious Sisters who checked and signed our Mass attendance card after Sunday Mass. Even as children we had our own collection envelopes. Part of my allowance from home chores went into the collection as well as my savings from giving up ice cream and the like during Lent.

I loved the Latin Mass but what I relished the most was the sense of the sacredness, respect and reverence during the Mass. When the priest came to our home to give communion to my grandma on First Fridays, all of us present would kneel in front of our altar.

The priests and the Sisters inspired and mentored me. *Fr. Lawrence Mampaey* taught us Latin music and songs. On one Vocation Day, the *Sisters of St. Joseph Carondelet* dressed me like a nun and that's the closest I got to realize my dream to be one of them.

Aside from my personal prayers and devotions I attended retreats, missions, parish renewal weekends, prayer groups and workshops. I attended a *Cursillo* weekend where I had an intense experience of the Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Family rosary was prayed every evening at home. We watched *Fr. Patrick Peyton* on TV proclaiming: *"The family that prays together, stays together."* Like my Mom, the Holy Mass was a daily part of me, that if I miss a day, I feel incomplete.

I served as catechist for ten years. Then I got more involved in the Music and Lector ministries. We are made in God's image, but we are all unique and have our own special gifts that we use wisely and share as good stewards. I am so thankful to God and our Blessed Mother for all their blessings. I pray to them often and pray gratefully for healing and other special needs because prayer is power that can work miracles. In sum, I do stewardship of praying, serving and giving as a way of life in grateful response to God's care and love for me.

*\*Gloria has been a member of OLM since birth and intends to remain so till death. She attends the daily Mass and is an exemplary volunteer in a number of activities and ministries in the church. She is the coordinator of the Lector ministry, a cantor and member of both the parish and diocesan choirs and serves as receptionist at the parish office. In her Outreach Ministry she brings Holy Communion to the homebound and helps provide food for the homeless. This year, she coordinated the Diocesan Rosary Congress at OLM and the public rosary under the aegis of America Needs Fatima.*
