

### Next Sunday's Reading 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
1 Kings 17:10-16

Second Reading Hebrews 9:24-28

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 146:7-10

Gospel Mark 12:38-44

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses instructs the people of Israel to keep the Lord's commandments. Land, prosperity, and progeny will be theirs. Only the Lord is God. The Lord is the God of Israel whom the people shall love with their heart, soul, and strength. Moses' words call us to take the Lord's statutes into our hearts this day,

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Jesus the high priest is unlike the Levitical priests who needed to offer repeated sacrifice for their sins and the sins of their people, and whose priesthood ceases at death. Jesus' Death on the Cross is a "once for all" sacrifice, which he never needs to repeat. His priesthood is eternal and the salvation he offers to people, constantly available.

Gospel: Mark 12:28-34

Jesus' words in response to the scribe who inquires about the most important commandment echo the Moses' words in the First Reading. To the commandment of honor the Lord God alone with love of one's heart, mind, and strength, Jesus adds the second commandment to love your neighbor as yourself. Understanding these commandments brings one near to the Kingdom of God.

#### **OLM STEWARDSHIP: "Witnessing Joyfully"**

My life has been a series of divine interventions. First, my mother died early leaving us 6 siblings. My dad became a single parent and the only breadwinner for the family. He was a prayerful man who would gather us 6 children at dusk in front of our altar to say our prayers after which we would line up to do *mano* and receive his blessing. On Sundays we would go as a family to Mass then have a treat in a restaurant or a movie.

I was still a young girl when my aunt, Dad's elder sister, took me to their home in another town where she was a teacher and had a well-to-do life. She pampered me somehow with the better things in life but she was also a strict disciplinarian who constantly corrected my manners and conduct. I would get scolded and punished if I did not obey.

My aunt's care and concern and the values she instilled in me were blessings in my life. She sent

me to the Catholic school where I learned basic catechism on prayers, virtues, commandments. sacraments etc. Together with Mass attendance God slowly formed my Christian faith. It was God's intervention in my life.

I was 15 years old when my dad took me and my brothers with him to Hawaii. Our father's strong faith and determination saw us all in college. My brothers joined the military services while I applied as a self-supporting student. After I got married, I worked in real estate which was quite lucrative at that time. Our business success drove us to strive for the high ends in life but which caused us to veer away from God and stop going to church.

Then the crunch happened. The 9-11 tragic attack and the economic downturn led us to file for bankruptcy. It was a total wreck and we realized nothing is permanent in this life.

My father passed away and at his funeral I was reminded, "there is heaven and there's life after death" It brought back the good old days when life was simpler and we're happier because we could pray and go together as a family to church. I suddenly yearned to get back to my true God. I wanted to have that special intimate relationship again with the Lord. I embraced back my Catholic faith and I soon realized how lucky I have been to be given another chance. Indeed, it is through pain that we gain, through agony that we have victory, through the Cross that there is Resurrection.

Despite my failings, I surely received many graces and blessings and I would like to be a joyful witness to God by gratefully offering my time, talent and treasure for his greater honor and glory. It's been 2 years since I joined the OLM Choir. I'm not a good singer, but I truly enjoy singing for God. Although scared at first to do cantoring, I took it as my opportunity and personal way to thank God for his love. I only have to try my best and God will do the rest. My faith has grown in a good and loving God who has been always with me along the way. With God in me and I in him, I have nothing to fear.
