Next Sunday's Reading The Epiphany of the Lord

First Reading Isaiah 60:1-6

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13

Second Reading Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6

Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

First Reading: 1 Samuel 1:20-22, 24-28 Hannah's fervent prayer is rewarded with the birth of a son, Samuel. She and her husband Elkanah take him to the Temple to dedicate him. There she encounters Eli, who overheard her desperate plea to God for a child, and true to her promise, dedicates him in service to the Temple.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-2, 21-24

This section of the first letter of John addresses the pain of the community in the wake of losing members in a split. John is reassuring those he writes to that they are the children of God, not those who have departed. They keep God's commandments and remain in Christ.

Jesus' adolescent escapade of hanging behind his community and remaining at the Temple is resonant for countless people who have misplaced a child or dealt with a rebellious adolescent. Jesus is nearing manhood, but not yet a man. We are reminded of Samuel's life as a servant of God in the Temple. The story illuminates for us the already developed relationship between Jesus and his Father, and places him within the Jewish story.



"Serving Compassionately" *Testimony by: Andrea Baptista

My Catholic life started with the arrival of the American Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette in our province. The missionaries built schools and churches from donated lands and labors. Through them I had my first taste of Catholic education and

received First Confession, First Communion and Confirmation.

My profession of faith demands action which is best demonstrated through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. My college education at the Catholic University of Santo Tomas and Philippine Normal College prepared me to teach children and young people in the public schools where I modeled the act of giving.

When my husband and I migrated to Hawaii in 1968 we went through the struggles of adjusting to the new standard of living where we rented rooms and moved a number of times. We could not even settle on one church until we moved to Kalihi Valley in 1971 and became OLM parishioners.

When our girl was at St. Anthony's kindergarten in the old orphanage, I volunteered as teacher's aide by preparing visual aids, teaching Filipino folk dances and sewed costumes and graduation attires. When I became a US Citizen in 1976, I was recruited as community outreach worker, serving as bilingual teacher in English, acculturation and assimilation to immigrant children, elderly folks and refugees

Being in the school, I discovered many children with multiple talents. So, I organized in my home a talent search program which aimed to explore, develop and enrich their talents in the performing arts. The program made a positive impact on the community that little donations trickled in to provide scholarships to students. Our activities expanded to creative writing and musical recording and covered a fun-filled period of 18 years. At the same time, I was volunteering at my daughter's school taking charge of the cheerleading squad's accommodation during their training sessions.

I couldn't believe how I managed my time between my full-time job and my pro-bono services and how I stretched my modest income between my personal needs and charity donations. Through them all, I felt self-fulfilled. They were not directly done for the church, but I felt I have served and contributed to humanity. I knew I made a difference and gave my all in gratitude to God for his blessings of good health, energy, talents and modest possessions.

I have toned down from being a dynamo to a retired status because of physical and medical issues but I still continue my personal commitment of providing low income families with affordable shelter whenever available. I give to the church and to charities monthly donations to the extent I'm able to. And I still continue to help especially those who strive to help themselves teaching them how to fish and not just give dole-outs.

I call upon the young bloods to step up the plate and respond to the call of Christian stewardship. They can join the church ministries and discover the benefits of volunteering not just to the people they serve but also to themselves. On the other hand, I ask the older volunteers to recruit and train younger ones and step back to give them space to experience the joy and essence of volunteerism and Christian stewardship.

*Andrea is from San Mateo, Isabela and married to Alfredo. They have one daughter. At OLM. Andrea serves as Lector and loves to belt out her original compositions during community programs. She also enjoys cooking and usually shares her favorite dinuguan/daran-daran (chocolate meat) with the priests.
