

MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP WITH HIGH IMPORTANCE To all Priests in the Diocese of Honolulu and Parishes:

A National World War I Remembrance – Bells of Peace

This year our nation is commemorating 100 years since World War I. In Honolulu, we will have a single event on Veterans Day, honoring the 116,516 Americans who died in *"The War to End All Wars."* The National WWI Commission is encouraging all churches nationwide to participate in the "Bells of Peace", tolling church bells 21 times, at 5second intervals on November 11, 2018 at 11:00 a.m.

Bishop Larry Silva is asking that parishes participate in this event. Perhaps the bells could be rung at the end of Mass with a moment of silence or a prayer for peace. Please include this in your announcements. If your parish does not have bells, look for a downloadable app at: ww1cc.org/bells

TODAY IS STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY

Who is a steward? He/She is somebody's manager. We are all stewards of God because, as Psalm 24 reminds us, God is the sole owner of everything we have: "The Lord's are the earth and its full-ness" (Ps 24:1). St. Peter reminds us of our duty of stewardship: "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1Peter 4:10). The New Testament refers to our stewardship to God 87 times. Paul claims that he is the steward of Christ's Gospel. The good steward never forgets that God is the Source of all he possesses and that all his possessions are given to him in trust, so he handles them accordingly.



There are three areas of stewardship: time, talents and treasure. Accepting the Biblical model of returning 10% of the "first fruits" to the Lord, we attempt to utilize at least 10% of our time for prayer, reflection, and works of mercy and ministry. Our talents are to be used to glorify the Giver by using them wherever they are needed, in our parish or in our community. Our treasure, taken from our earnings, is offered as tithing for the maintenance of the parish Church, worship, Sunday school, youth formation, Bible study classes, outreach activities in the community and evangelization programs.

A word of thanks to all dear parishioners who are actively involved in our various parish ministries, committees and organizations, which impact the lives of many people. Special thanks to our faithful parishioners who sacrificially and regularly make their financial contribution to our parish by tithing or giving 10% of their treasure.

"Praise the Lord, my soul!" Psalm 146:1

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16

Will God provide enough? While the widow of Zarephath worries she does not have enough to provide for herself, her son, and Elijah, the prophet announces to her that her jar of flour and jug of oil will not go empty. Her trust in the Lord's words from Elijah bore fruit as all could eat for a year.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The author of Hebrews reiterates Christ's "once for all" sacrifice that we proclaimed last Sunday. The reading concludes with a statement of our belief that Christ will come a second time in order to bring salvation to those who wait for him. Christ resides in heaven, appearing before God for us, until he comes again.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

The shorter form of the Gospel reading includes Jesus' condemnation of the scribes for their lavish and arrogant lifestyle and their destruction of the homes and lives of widows. The longer form continues with Jesus offering a concrete example to illustrate his point. A poor widow gives to the treasury from the little she has, but the rich people give from their surplus. Which is truly giving? There is a longer and shorter form of today's reading.

After a decade, I accepted to be the EM Coordinator to do such things as making the schedule for the serving ministers in a given weekend Mass. I thank God for giving me patience and wisdom to do His will until the day I can no longer do the job.

I sincerely thank all the EM ministers for their kind hearts and understanding with my flaws knowing that I always do my best and trust God to do the rest. Together we are stewards of service to our Redeemer.
