

Great job! The re-roofing of the old convent building was done in 1½ days last Tuesday & Wednesday, November 20-21 by Tory's Roofing & Waterproofing Co. They furnished labor to remove existing old shingles and install new materials at the contract price of \$22,390.00 with 50-year extended 5-star warranty. The committee chair, Joyce Oliveira, secured the approval of the Diocese and with her members selected the winning bid for the job. Mr. Jerry Gudenau of the Diocesan Facilities Management Office helped in determining the scope of the work and specifications. Roger Isidro served as the project manager. This project phase depended much on the fundraisings we made.

Next Sunday's Reading

First Sunday of Advent

First Reading
Jeremiah 33:14-16

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 25:4-5, 8-10, 14

Second Reading 2 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

Gospel Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

First Reading: Daniel 7:13-14

"One like a Son of man" comes. He is king! Glory and dominion belong to him! They are everlasting. No one can destroy his reign. Everyone serves him. On this solemnity we acclaim Christ the King of the Universe and see identify him as the One who comes in our midst.

Second Reading: Revelation 1:5-8

The passage from Revelation also includes a reference to Jesus Christ coming in the clouds. He is the past, present, and future. The "ruler of the kings" has made us priests for God, his Father. We are a kingdom people who give glory, honor, and praise to Christ forever.

Gospel: John 18:33-37

Jesus does not identify himself as a king in response to Pilate's question, but Jesus does admit to having a kingdom. His Kingdom, though, does not belong to the world. He only came to testify to the truth of his Kingdom, a kingdom in which the last will be first, and the first will be the servant of all. Do we belong to the truth? Have we listened to his voice throughout this year?

At first, my understanding of stewardship was limited to Sunday donations and contributions to church



developments. When we think of talents, we quickly refer to one's ability to perform a special skill such as dancing, singing or doing extremely well in sports like basketball or football. While these are great examples of God-given talents, Jesus' Parable of the Talents imparts to us more interesting principles. Here, Jesus is emphasizing the importance of accountability. Someday we will give an account to Him on how we have managed everything we have been given such as our time, abilities and wealth.

In 2010, I was asked by two gentlemen, the late *Mr. James Adlawan* and *Mr. Sio Tupou* to become member of the Hospitality Ministry. I had never served in any ministry, so I was quite nervous and felt burdened by the offer. But they were persistent, and I finally agreed. They eventually became my closest friends and *Mr. Tupou* still amazes me with his relentless dedication in serving the church. After eight years of being a Hospitality minister, I moved on to become a Lector, a Eucharistic minister, Feed the Homeless volunteer and member of the Knights of Columbus.

Looking back, I am humbled by the amount of time I have allotted to these various ministries. I never thought it was possible. I found out that by allowing myself the time to serve, God blessed me with the ability to multi-task between my busy life as a student, husband and father and minister in church. Furthermore, God opened my eyes to better manage my finances which was a huge struggle for me. I was always finding myself in a financial strait and all I could drop at the Sunday collection bowl was a dollar or spare change. But when I began to dedicate the first fruits of my labor and give 10% of all my income, God enabled me to overcome my struggles and experience such peace beyond my understanding.

There is also a feeling of totality and fulfillment that come with these dedications. Now, I feel that I can walk the talk and can better interact joyfully and more closely to a lot of parishioners.

As your fellow parishioner, I invite you to embrace this higher calling of stewardship that goes beyond our financial contributions to the church. Let it be our way of saying "Thanks to God" for his many blessings and that He can count on us to share our time and talents to fulfill His designs and plans in furthering his kingdom here on earth.

*Tony is married to Gloria and have five children. They have been OLM parishioners since 2009. Most of the time, they come to church as a family and the children serve as Altar servers. Tony currently serves as Lector, Eucharistic minister, Knight of Columbus and Feed the homeless volunteer at the Kaka'ako Homeless shelter.


