


Pastor's Corner

First Reading Isaiah 50:4-7

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 22:8-9,17-20,23-24

Second Reading Philippians 2:6-11 Gospel

Luke 22:14-23; 56

First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

During the Babylon Exile, our Judean ancestors struggled with despair. Forced exportation from their homeland and the destruction of the Temple left them feeling without identity, land or God. Many of them longingly looked back to the Exodus, when God freed them from landless slavery in Egypt and brought them to the promised land. Would they ever experience God's care again? Would they ever again be a nation? Isaiah answers their questions with this prophecy. God does not want them looking to the past and yearning for what was lost. Rather, God wants them to see the future as God-filled. God will bring them through a new Exodus from Babylon to their homeland. The wilderness that stretches between Babylon and Judah will not prove a barrier for them. The story also lives for us today. Like Israel, God continues to be with us; we are still God's people. What matters most is that we look to the future with hope knowing that God goes before us.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

From prison Paul writes to the Philippines about what he values most. He reminds them that he was raised as a Jew with education and privilege. He became a devoted follower of God and strove to please the Almighty One he loved by zealously keeping the Law and persecuting those he thought strayed from God's way. In the midst of persecuting the church, he encountered the Risen Christ in an intimate and lifechanging experience. What he previously valued no longer mattered, and Paul left it all "because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus." Knowing Christ and "the power of his resurrection" enables Paul to look to the future with hope, whether or not it brings release from prison or further suffering and death.

Gospel: John 8:1-11

The plot of John's story is deceptively simple. The Pharisees ask Jesus his opinion on a case concerning a woman who was caught committing adultery, a capital offense in Israel. The real action is in the plot beneath the plot. Those Pharisees are not interested in the woman or her alleged crime. They are more interested in trapping Jesus. They know that because Rome rules Galilee, they have no power to invoke the death penalty, even if Jesus agreed to it. They also know that the Law had stringent requirements for a capital case, and their case against the woman met none of those requirements. The evidence against her simply was not enough to convict her. Jesus, however, is not interested in legal machinations. He wants instead to demonstrate God's forgiving love and the new life that love offers to all willing to receive it. He begins with the Pharisees. He very gently but firmly holds a mirror before their faces, hoping that when they see themselves, they will have more compassion for others just like them. And it works, to a degree. Each of the Pharisees ends up leaving quietly. Jesus then turns to the woman. She, too, sees herself in Jesus' eyes, hut instead of walking away, she turns to Jesus and hears those beautiful words, "Neither do I condemn you."

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

Good Stewards Learn to Develop God's Gifts

God has blessed each of us with many gifts and our task is to discover, acknowledge and develop those gifts. Some of our gifts we discover ourselves; other gifts have to be pointed out by others. One of life's

greatest challenges involves discovering and developing all of our God-given gifts. Parents, siblings, teachers, coaches, scout leaders and friends play an important role in this journey. Once we know we have a gift, we have to believe in the gift and commit ourselves to developing it.

We have to work on our gifts and have the discipline to hone them to perfection. Blessed John Cardinal Newman once said, "Nothing would be done at all if one waited until one could do it so well that no one could find fault with it." Many people are afraid to test their gifts. Fear of failure, it seems, is pervasive. We are not born with a fear of failure. Fear grows on us. Fear wears many disguises – fear of failure, fear of success, fear of ridicule, fear of not belonging, fear of looking foolish – to name but a few of fear's disguises. All of fear's disguises lead to stagnant energy. Fear always brings with it inertia and inertia always leads to stagnation. No one develops their gifts responsibly without risk-taking, hard work and overcoming fear.

Allow me to offer an example. Do you remember what it was like to learn how to ride a bicycle? We start off with a tricycle and for a while that is enough but soon we want more. We want a bicycle and the day comes when we get our first bicycle but our joy quickly fades when we realize that the bicycle comes with training wheels. So instead of going from three wheels to two wheels we go backwards to four wheels. Finally the fateful day comes when the training wheels are taken off. A person we thought loved us, usually a mother or a father, puts us on the bicycle, puts one hand on the back of the seat and the other on the handlebar, tells us we can do it and pushes us off to fend for ourselves. The result is always the same – we fall to the ground. Then the person we thought loved us picks us up and repeats the process. Eventually we get the hang of it but not before we have fallen and picked ourselves up more often than we choose to remember.

The gift of balance is key to being able to ride a bicycle; the process of discovering that gift is repeated many times in our lives. Life is a series of failures that morph into successes sometimes without our realizing it or knowing how it happens but it does. We had to learn how to be brothers and sisters, we had to learn how to be husbands and wives, and we had to learn how to be friends and neighbors. We need to learn how to be good stewards of the many gifts God has given us; to discover them, cherish them and not be afraid to develop them.

Dear Friends in Christ, Peace be with you!



God invites us to reach out beyond ourselves and encounter God in the experience of sharing with other vulnerable persons. Through the Lenten Rice Bowl, the U.S. Conference of Bishops invites us to join nearly 14,000 faith communities in 180 dioceses around the U.S. in prayer, fasting and almsgiving to support those worldwide who are forced to flee their homes to find safety or better opportunities. CRS Rice Bowl is not just about collecting money in an empty cardboard box. It is a box full of stories of hope, prayers and opportunities to help put our faith into action and to share our Lenten journey with others in need, transforming all our lives. 
