Next Sunday's Reading Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

First Reading
Acts 5:12-46

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24

Second Reading
Revelation 1:9-11, 12-13, 17-19

Gospel
John 20:19-31

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43

On Easter Sunday morning, the First Reading takes us to the home of Cornelius, a devout man who was also a Roman centurion. He has had a vision in which he has been instructed to send for Peter, who also has had a vision that calls into question the Jewish food purity rules about which animals are clean versus unclean. In this passage, we hear Peter recount the story of the life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. While all he has accomplished has been witnessed to by the prophets, the redemption of the Risen Christ has been accomplished for all people, including the gentiles. Anyone who believes and bears witness to him will be forgiven.



Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

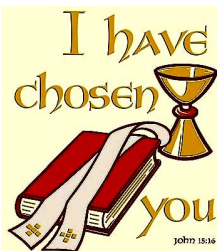
Both of these selections for the Second Reading exhort the followers of Jesus Christ to set aside the old self and old life in favor of the new life they have been given in Christ. In the letter to the community in Corinth Paul utilizes the metaphor of leaven. The image of yeast, a small bit of which can raise a great deal of flour, is one of the predominant images for the role of the laity in the constitutions of Vatican II. Lay people are called, through their faith and holiness, to "work for the sanctification of the world from within as a leaven."

Gospel: John 20:1-9

The Tomb. What is most apparent from the resurrection accounts in the gospels is that the meaning of the event was not immediately intelligible. The empty tomb was not a proof of the resurrection but a fact whose meaning needed to be discovered. Finding the empty tomb made Jesus' followers bewildered and confused grasping for various possible answers to account for it. Only when the disciples experienced the risen Lord did the meaning of the empty tomb become clear. The stone was rolled back not so Jesus could get out, but so we could get in and be assured that his tomb of death will remain empty forever. He is risen!

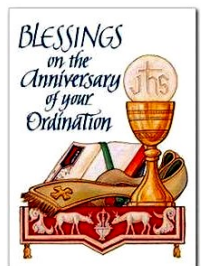

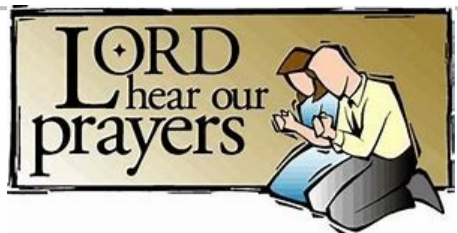
