NEW BOOKKEEPER



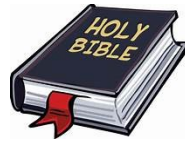

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Genesis 18:1-10

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm: 15:2-5

Second Reading
Colossians 1:24-28

Gospel
Luke 10:38-42

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses addresses the people and lets them know the Lord's commandments written in the book of the law are not far from the people. They are neither abstract statutes nor mysterious decrees that the people would need to search out in the sky or the sea. Rather, the Lord's word is close to them. They already know it. They have already taken it in. Their challenge at this moment is to live the word in their daily lives. Our challenge is the same.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Christ Jesus holds everything together, the author of Colossians writes in the early Christian hymn from the letter's opening chapter. It is in the beautiful, poetic language of these verses that the author identifies Christ Jesus as the head of the body the Church. Here the author also intimates a comparison between Christ Jesus and Wisdom in the Old Testament. Both were present at creation and all things were created through them.

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

Two questions from a legal scholar shape today's Gospel reading. At the outset, the legal scholar asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus' question back to him logically points him to what he finds in the law, to which the scholar cites the commandment of love - of God and love of neighbor as yourself. Jesus is satisfied with his response and tells him to follow the law to receive life. But the scholar pushes forward with a clarifying question about who his neighbor is. In response, Jesus tells what we have come to cherish as the parable of the Good Samaritan. No doubt the scholar did not anticipate the parable that teaches us to equitably extend God's boundless mercy to everyone as an answer to his question.

BE A GOOD STEWARD OF YOUR LEISURE TIME

The air in July seems to be filled with the music of birds and the hum of insects. We hear the happy sounds of picnickers, boaters, golfers, fireworks, kids splashing in the pool, and concerts in the park. It's a celebratory time, a time when many people take vacation or welcome visitors from afar or young adults home from college. We think of July as a fun time, a time for rest and relaxation, a time for leisure.

It's important to be a good steward of the wonders of summer, a good steward of our time of rest and renewal, a good steward of leisure. A time to recharge our batteries is all part of leading a healthy, balanced life. After all, we recall that Jesus directed his disciples to "go off to a secluded place and rest" (Mark 6:31).

Stewardship calls us to nurture and care for God's gifts which include taking care of the gift that is ourselves. So, make leisure a priority this July. Simplify your activities and focus on relationships, resting, recreating, and enjoying the beauty of God's world. Ease up on planning the perfect party or barbecue and instead focus on the fun of everyone chipping in to spend time together. Give yourself space to be alone in the midst of summer's fun.

Be healthy in eating and drinking. Long walks at dawn or dusk and plenty of exercise will aid both your body and your spirit, as will enjoying the wealth of summer's bounty and the produce of our gardens and farmers' markets. Consider activities that add variety to our lives and relationships. Make time for those books piling up on the bookshelf. Do something out of the ordinary. Plan a long lunch with an old friend or enjoy jazz "on the green." But don't add heavy burdens of preparation and commitment.

Scale down. Relax. Let go. Be spontaneous. Be a good steward of your leisure time. Bask in the glory of summer's long days. This will not only prove restorative but will reveal more acutely the blessings of God's creation and help us discover in new ways the wonder of our loved ones and ourselves. 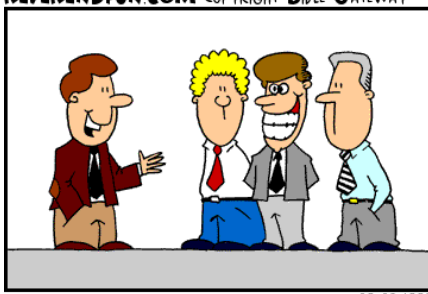
