
We pray for them and for a great revival of our Youth Ministry program and the Altar Server Ministry in OLM.

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Genesis 18:20-32 Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 138:1-3, 6-8

Second Reading Colossians 2:12-14 Gospel Luke 11:1-13

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10

Abraham and Sarah extend hospitality to the three men who appear near their tent. The two provide water for bathing, the shade of a nearby tree, and food in abundance. As the encounter with the men comes to a close, Abraham's and Sarah's hospitality returns to them in kind. One of the men promises to return in a year and when he returns, the elderly Sarah will have a son. Certainly, the Lord was present in the three men: conceivably the Lord was also preset in Abraham and Sarah, for their hospitality mirrored God's own.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul speaks about his apostolic ministry to the Colossians. As he does so, he tells them he rejoices in the sufferings he has endured not for his own sake, but for theirs. His ministry is to proclaim Christ to them. As believers, their ministry is also to proclaim Christ and to teach others of the wisdom they have found in him.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Martha is all about comparison. She wants to make sure the Lord judges her and her sister fairly, and it seems that the Lord finds himself more concerned about Martha's anxiety than about the fact that she is doing the hard labor of serving while Mary simply listened to the Lord talk. The point of Jesus' words that Mary has chosen the "better part" is not to hierarchically, judge the sisters for their different choices, but to teach Martha to root herself in the Lord's Word and rather than to worry herself over many, many things. Then she will have abundant energy to serve in the Lord's name.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

SAINT MARY MAGDALENE, STEWARD OF CHRIST'S MINISTRY

Saint Mary Magdalene is one of the most revered saints in the history of the Church and her discipleship emphasizes the complementary roles of women, Saint Peter and the other disciples as witnesses to the Risen Christ.

From the New Testament, one can conclude that Mary came from Magdala, a village on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. She was a friend of Jesus of Nazareth and a leading figure among those who were his disciples. She was one of the women who accompanied and financially supported Jesus and the twelve apostles which suggests that the women were respectable, well-to-do members of the community.

At the time Jesus was executed on Golgotha, when the men in his company had already run away and abandoned him, Mary Magdalene is specifically identified in the Gospels as one of the women who refused to leave him. She was present at the Crucifixion and burial.



What is by far the most important affirmation about Mary Magdalene, however, is that she is mentioned in all five of the Resurrection narratives of the Gospel tradition (Mark 16:1-8, Matthew 28:1-10, Luke 23:55-24:12, John 20:1-18, and Mark 16:9-20). In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and John, she is the primary witness to Christ's Resurrection. All four Gospels explicitly name her as being present at the tomb and she was the first person to preach the "Good News" of that miracle. From other texts of the early Christian era, Mary Magdalene's status as a disciple in the years after Jesus' death is as prominent as the twelve apostles.

For many centuries Mary Magdalene was the symbol of Christian devotion, especially that of repentance. However, Christian traditions that came after the New Testament era erroneously equated Mary Magdalene with both the sinful woman in Luke 7 who anointed Jesus and with Mary of Bethany in John 11 and Luke 10 who also anointed Jesus. The tradition that Mary Magdalene was a repentant prostitute has been dismissed by modern biblical scholarship as almost certainly untrue.

Saint Mary Magdalene has been celebrated throughout Christian history in art and literature. There are many famous depictions of her in art such as Rembrandt's Christ and St. Mary Magdalene at the Tomb and Titian's *Noli Me Tangere* (Latin: "Do not touch me"). Her feast day is July 22.

Help us never to be too busy to pause and realize your gracious presence all around us: in nature, in other people, in ourselves.


Slow us down and teach us to be better stewards of our time of recreation. We pray this in Jesus' name.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Diocesan Office on Safe Environment issued a directive to implement the US Bishop's Charter on the Protection of Children & Young People that all ministers and volunteers in every parish should undergo background screening and safe environment training to protect children from abuse. It states: "All adults volunteering with an organization or ministry whose duties include or may include ongoing, unsupervised contact with minors must comply with the Diocesan Safe Environment requirements."

Bishop Silva's office has provided the list of positions included in the memo for compliance: Accountants
* Altar Servers and Trainers * Catechists/Religious Education Teachers * Children's Choir * Confirmation Team *
Custodians*Eucharistic Ministers and Outreach Ministers to the sick and homebound) * Facilities / Maintenance
Workers*Hospitality * Ministers*Lectors*Liturgy Ministers * Music / Cantors / Music Coordinator * Receptionists
* Sacristans *Secretary * Social Ministers * Thrift Shop Staff * Youth Ministers

They must complete the requirements through VIRTUS Online and Employment Screening Resources (ESR) using a computer.
