Pastor's Corner

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

In the reading, Abraham's visitors proceed on toward Sodom, but the Lord still stands before Abraham. The two enter into a back and forth conversation about how many innocent people the Lord must find in Sodom before he relents on destroying the city. Abraham's bargaining skills coupled with the generosity of the Lord's mercy lead to the Lord saying he would spare the city if he found ten innocent people.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Plunging into the baptismal waters we die with Christ. As we arise from the waters, we rise with him. God's power-the same power that raised Christ from the dead-enables us through faith to participate in Christ's death and Resurrection. All the debt we owe to God for our sin, no longer exists. God, through the power of his mercy, wipes the slate clean with his forgiveness.

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Upon observing Jesus at prayer, one of his disciples asks him to teach them to pray. In response, Jesus teaches them what Christians for centuries have known as the Our Father. In Luke's account of the gospel, Jesus follows the words of prayer he teaches his disciples with a parable about a friend in need of bread for a hungry visitor who has arrived at midnight. Disciples will answer the call to friendship by giving bread to those in need. Or, in other words disciples lives the prayer to the Father in their daily life.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP MISSIONARY DISCIPLES: STEWARDS OF THE CHURCH

How does God's Spirit work to uplift us, guide us, transform us and show us the way to be better stewards of the Church? How does the Holy Spirit empower us and give us the strength to be ambassadors of Christ and missionary disciples? What are the gifts we possess that allow God to be actively present in the world through us? Understanding Christian stewardship helps us answer these fundamental questions.

The theme of the 57th Annual Conference of the International Catholic Stewardship Council (ICSC) is "Missionary Disciples: Stewards of the Church." Christian stewards understand that they are entrusted with the missionary call to proclaim the Gospel and sustain the Body of Christ. The ICSC conference offers a host of opportunities to learn how Christian stewardship enhances our lives as missionary disciples and prepares us to minister to our communities of faith and a world hungry for Christ's loving and healing presence.

The 2019 ICSC conference begins with a Eucharistic Adoration and Liturgy of Light on Sunday evening, October 6, 2019 at 8:00 pm. It concludes with a closing Eucharistic celebration on Wednesday, October 9 at 10:00 am. All conference sessions are held at the Sheraton Grand Hotel in downtown Chicago, just blocks from the Navy Pier.

The image adopted this year is the classical painting "The Pentecost" by El Greco. It reveals the familiar scene in the New Testament's Acts of the Apostles (2:1-4) of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on those in the "upper room" at Pentecost. We see Mary, our Blessed Mother dressed in red and blue, seated at the center of the painting with the



apostles gathered around her. We also see Mary Magdalene, at Mary's left shoulder, and Martha.

The men and women depicted in El Greco's masterpiece are the first stewards of Christ's new Church, a legacy we have inherited. We believe today that the Holy Spirit empowers us to be stewards of the Church as well. It is through this stewardship, that we offer a profound spirit-filled witness to Jesus Christ and it is our prayer that the 57th annual ICSC conference will inspire its participants to discover how we all can be better "Missionary Disciples" and stewards of the Church.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT MANDATED REQUIREMENTS



The Diocesan Office on Safe Environment issued a directive to implement the US Bishop's Charter on the Protection of Children & Young People that all ministers and volunteers in every parish should undergo background screening and safe environment training to protect children from abuse. It states: "<u>All adults</u> volunteering with an organization or ministry whose duties include or may include ongoing, unsupervised contact with minors must comply with the Diocesan Safe Environment requirements."

Bishop Silva's office has provided the list of positions included in the memo for compliance: Accountants * Altar Servers and Trainers * Catechists/Religious Education Teachers *Children's Choir * Confirmation Team * Custodians * Eucharistic Ministers and Outreach Ministers (to the sick and homebound) * Facilities / Maintenance Workers * Hospitality Ministers * Lectors * Liturgy Ministers * Music / Cantors / Music Coordinator * Receptionists * Sacristans * Secretary * Social Ministers * Thrift Shop Staff * Youth Ministers

They must complete the requirements through VIRTUS Online and Employment Screening Resources (ESR) using a computer.

The OLM Safe Environment Liaison, *Fran Kovaloff,* is coordinating a group training for all concerned ministers, leaders and volunteers thru the technological assistance of *MaryAnn Llamedo, Fidel Flores* and *Jun Cortez.*

Philippines. He served for 3 years as Associate Pastor at Sts. Peter & Paul Church in Ala Moana then as Chaplain of St. Francis


