

Next Sunday's Reading Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Deuteronomy 30-:10-14

Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 69:14, 17, 30-31,

33-34, 36, 37

Second Reading G Colossians 1:15-20 L

Gospel Luke 10:25-37

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14

The Lord communicates to Isaiah a vision for a new Israel in which all who love her can be glad. Israel will prosper and her people will find comfort in the Lord. God will comfort his people as a mother comforts her child. The Lord's power is in his care for his people. How joyful our hearts will be when we experience this!

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul shares in the sufferings of Jesus and the marks on his body provide evidence of this. Only in the Cross can Paul and others who follow Christ boast. Nothing else the world gives us or religions require of us, including circumcision, holds meaning. Followers of Jesus, regardless of their background, find meaning in aligning themselves with his Cross.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

The second episode of Jesus sending his followers on a mission is today's Gospel reading. In the first episode in Luke, Jesus commissions the Twelve (9:1-6), whereas in this episode, occurring a chapter later in Luke, Jesus sends forth seventy-two of his followers to go out in pairs to carry out his mission. The longer form of the reading includes Jesus' advice to the newly sent to shake off the dust of any resistance they encounter. It also includes the report the seventy-two give Jesus upon their return and describes their amazing joy at the power of Jesus at work in them.

BE A GOOD STEWARD OF YOUR LEISURE TIME

The air in July seems to be filled with the music of birds and the hum of insects. We hear the happy sounds of picnickers, boaters, golfers, fireworks, kids splashing in the pool, and concerts in the park. It's a celebratory time, a time when many people take vacation or welcome visitors from afar or young adults home from college. We think of July as a fun time, a time for rest and relaxation, a time for leisure.

It's important to be a good steward of the wonders of summer, a good steward of our time of rest and renewal, a good steward of leisure. A time to recharge our batteries is all part of leading a healthy, balanced life. After all, we recall that Jesus directed his disciples to "go off to a secluded place and rest" (Mark 6:31).

Stewardship calls us to nurture and care for God's gifts which include taking care of the gift that is ourselves. So, make leisure a priority this July. Simplify your activities and focus on relationships, resting, recreating, and enjoying the beauty of God's world. Ease up on planning the perfect party or barbecue and instead focus on the fun of everyone chipping in to spend time together. Give yourself space to be alone in the midst of summer's fun.

Be healthy in eating and drinking. Long walks at dawn or dusk and plenty of exercise will aid both your body and your spirit, as will enjoying the wealth of summer's bounty and the produce of our gardens and farmers' markets. Consider activities that add variety to our lives and relationships. Make time for those books piling up on the bookshelf. Do something out of the ordinary. Plan a long lunch with an old friend or enjoy jazz "on the green." But don't add heavy burdens of preparation and commitment.

Scale down. Relax. Let go. Be spontaneous. Be a good steward of your leisure time. Bask in the glory of summer's long days. This will not only prove restorative but will reveal more acutely the blessings of God's creation and help us discover in new ways the wonder of our loved ones and ourselves.







LEADERSHIP RETREAT -"GO AND DO LIKEWISE"

"Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." (Mark 6:31)

Jesus invited his disciples to come apart for a time of rest and renewal. Retreats are a time away from our normal activities to spend time getting reacquainted with God, to examine the priorities of life and to make concrete and practical resolutions for improvement. Retreats can be a powerful step toward personal conversion.

The Diocese of Honolulu is sponsoring a *Leadership Retreat* (*ILR*) which is an opportunity for adults (ages 18+) who work with youth and/or young adults in the Diocese of Honolulu to refresh and renew their vigor for ministry. The retreat includes Mass, confession, silence, presentations, and fellowship
