

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading 1 Kings 19:16, 19-21 Responsorial Psalm Psalm: 16:1-2, 5, 7-11

Second Reading
Galatians 5:1-1, 13-18

Gospel Luke 9:51-62

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

The king of Salem and priest, Melchizedek, blessed the bread and wine, and offered a blessing upon Abram in celebration of his victory over Chedorlaomer and the other kings on his side. In return, Abram provided Melchizedek one-tenth of everything he had. And, though in the verses that follow today's passage, the king of Sodom commands Abram to give him the people that are the Lord's, Abram refuses remaining faithful to the Lord.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

This reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians was also the Second Reading on Holy Thursday for the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. This brief passage is the earliest account of the institution of the Eucharist. We see its pattern of taking bread, giving thanks, breaking bread, and proclaiming the bread is Jesus' Body given for us and repeating it with the cup in the Church's Eucharistic Prayer. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we do so in remembrance of Jesus as the early Christian community did.

Gospel: Luke 9:11-17

With five thousand men (we do not know the total number in the crowd because Luke does not tell us how many women and children were present) to feed, all the Twelve have are five loaves and two fish. Jesus asks the Twelve to divide the masses into groups of fifty, and without arguing about whether or not there would be enough food, the Twelve follow his instructions. Jesus took, blessed, and broke the provisions, and the disciples share them. Everyone ate. Everyone was satisfied. Even more could have shared in the meal Jesus provided. Such is how Jesus feeds us in the Eucharist today. There is always enough of Jesus for others to join the assembly.

BENCHMARKS FOR A HEALTHY PARISH

On January 2019, *Bishop Larry Silva* issued the "Benchmarks for a Healthy Parish" in the Diocese of Honolulu. These benchmarks are meant to be used as a self-assessment tool for the pastor and parish leadership to evaluate and monitor the overall health of the parish.



The principles for assessing the parish health is based on the following assumptions: 1) A Healthy diocese has healthy parishes that provide for the spiritual well-being of its people by making the Gospel and sacramental life the core of all parish endeavors. 2) There are no perfect parishes. But every parish in the diocese can be a more vibrant, healthy parish. An assessment of parish health must be perceived to be fair, understanding of the diversity and history of the people and communities and have as its goal the continuous improvement of the parish health. 3) Best practices that have been identified in catholic parishes elsewhere are refined to fit the Diocese of Honolulu context. 4) Positive or negative trends can indicate whether a parish is meeting best practices. 5) there is no one fact/number that defines a healthy or not so healthy parish, but some facts and numbers are more critical than others. 6) Taking the above assumptions is helpful to describe key characteristics of a model healthy parish.

The ideal is that all parishes are healthy entities. Since this may not always be the case, it is helpful to have diocesan principles/policies that can guide decision makers and achieve workable outcomes.

Use of this benchmark assessment tool will allow for the systematic collection and analysis of data that can be aggregated and result in useful information that affirms and identifies parishes that are: 1) Overall healthy (Green mark) according to benchmarks. 2) Moderately healthy (orange mark) but needing improvement in some areas 3) Unhealthy (red mark) and needs remedial attention, actions, and a better understanding of the best practice indicators in order to determine whether a healthy parish status can be achieved.

The benchmarks are: *1) Pastoral Council *2) Finance Council *3) Stewardship *4) Competent Lay Employee Compensation *5) Repair, Maintenance & Renovation *6) Schools *7) Parish Budget *8) Reporting of Parish Financial Condition *9) Bills are paid when due *10) Sunday Giving.

In tune with the "Good News Report" this weekend, we are proud to report that as assessed by the Diocesan Team for the fiscal year 2018-2019, OLM got orange ratings (moderately healthy) for two benchmarks - #4 and #10, 8 green ratings (overall healthy) and no red marks (unhealthy). The main overall healthy rating of our parish is evidently due to the dynamic engagement, close collaboration and faithful stewardship among the clergy, parishioners and the parish leaders.

This review of the parish by the Diocese will be done annually and the benchmarks will guide the pastor and parish leaders to proactively strive for the best practices and achieve an overall healthy rating.

NEW NORMS FOR PARISH LEADERSHIP

and the Holy Spirit, One God, forever and ever.

Amen.

On November 15, 2018, *Bishop Larry Silva* issued a decree promulgating the new *Norms for Parish Pastoral Councils*. The goal of these norms is to assist pastors and parishes with greater pastoral planning, guided by the pastoral plan of the Diocese of Honolulu. The norms were promulgated in accordance with the Code of Canon Law (Canon 536 &1) regarding mandating a pastoral council in each parish and in consultation with the Presbyteral Council. The norms would take effect immediately and each parish is expected to to have a fully functioning pastoral council with statutes no later than Pentecost Sunday, June 9, 2019.

Among the items treated is the section on "Terms of Office" which states that "All members who are not ex officio will serve a term of three years (renewable once if they are selected). A mandatory one-year break, at least, is required after two terms." This and the rest of the entire Norms have been adopted for our OLM Parish Pastoral Council as deliberated upon and approved by our current pastoral council members. They submitted the final copy to the Diocese.

To implement the decree, some of our current members have to step down. At the same time we need to have replacements for them. The outgoing ones are: *Dr. Clementina Ceria-Ulep, Tom DeCorte* and *Fran Kovaloff*. They have served in various capacities either as chairpersons or an officer. Actually, they have served longer than two terms and according to them it's not that they are tired serving but that it's time they pass on the baton of leadership to other parishioners and give them chance to share their gifts and resources. Indeed, both the outgoing and remaining ones have shown such genuine dedication and outstanding service in helping our pastor steer our parish towards achieving its mission and vision as well as the diocesan pastoral plan. Even though they are stepping down from the Parish Pastoral Council they, nevertheless, continue to serve in their respective current parish committee, organization or ministry.


