

First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

Today's passage from a few verses later in the same and final chapter of Isaiah speaks of God gathering the nations from distant lands together on his holy mountain in Jerusalem. All will acclaim the Lord's glory and live together in the Lord's house where the Lord will care for them as a mother cares for her children.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Using a citation with Old Testament roots in Deuteronomy and Proverbs, the author of Hebrews encourages his audience to remain firm in their commitment to the way of faith. Christians are to take the Lord's discipline as a sign of his fatherly love for them. In the end, an unwavering commitment of faith in word and in deed will lead one to share in the peace righteousness brings.

Gospel: Luke: 13:22-30

An unidentified person who Jesus met as he journeyed to Jerusalem asked him the question that many today still wonder about: Will only a few people be saved? As is often the case, Jesus responds indirectly with a short metaphorical statement and parable. From the first, we learn that may will attempt to enter through the narrow gate, but it will not have enough strength to do so. From the second, we learn that our actions toward others matter in relation to our future. Will we chose to be first or last according to Jesus' wisdom?

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

STEWARDSHIP: Source of Deepening Spirituality

God never stops giving! If we truly seek a deeper relationship with God, our response is to praise God for this great treasure and to demonstrate our gratitude by taking care of, and sharing, God's wonderful gifts every day.

Stewardship-it's not just about giving money. It's about giving everything.

And serve each other according to the gift each person has received, as good manager of God's dwarse gifts. -- I Peter 4:10, CEB

I began thinking about stewardship in the early 1990s and had the great privilege of learning about stewardship from the late Seattle Archbishop Thomas J. Murphy, who at that time was chairman of the United States bishops' ad hoc committee on stewardship and the principal architect of the bishops' pastoral letter, Stewardship: A Disciple's Response. Stewardship describes a Christian steward as "one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, and returns them with increase to the Lord" (SDR, p. 9).

Because God never stops giving, a Christian steward is constantly being invited, and challenged, to receive, cherish, share and return-withincrease the fruits of God's abundant generosity. This is why stewardship is a lifelong responsibility. As long as God keeps giving, we are called to be open and responsive to all his gifts, both spiritual and material.


Stewardship is a source of deepening spirituality because it challenges us to let go of any false notions that we are somehow in control of our lives, our skills and our talents, or our material possessions. We are not the authors of our own existence. We are not the owners of our spiritual and material gifts. We are stewards (caretakers or custodians) of what belongs exclusively and entirely to God.

God has given us the gift of life and the gift of intelligence. We are responsible for taking care of ourselves and developing our minds and growing in wisdom and understanding. We have been given the skills and abilities that allow us to earn a living, care for those we love, and contribute to the common good by our work and by our service to others in the Church and in our community. These gifts of time and talent make it possible for us to acquire the material possessions that we need and enjoy. All God's gifts are good. They are meant to be used responsibly and shared generously with others.

Stewardship helps us develop what Archbishop Murphy called a lifestyle of sharing. When we respond to God's goodness by growing in gratitude, responsibility and generosity, we can experience the difference stewardship makes in our daily lives. As the archbishop said, stewardship invites us to reflect on what is most basic and fundamental in our lives—and to respond from the heart. Stewardship is not a program. It is a way of life.

Stewardship helps us recognize that the ordinary experiences of daily living are gifts from God to be cherished and shared with others. Since God never stops giving, our opportunities to respond from the heart are truly endless. That's why Archbishop Murphy believed that stewardship is a way of life-and a lifelong source of grace and deepening spirituality.



The project is under the charge of the Parish Building & Maintenance Committee chaired by *Joyce Oliveira* and supervised by *Roger Isidro*.

*Much thanks go to *Jun Cortez* and *Paul Valbuena*, for installing the lines for the internet connection at the parish hall. *Fidel Flores* offered to donate routers for wi-fi connections in the church and parish hall. Our sincere gratitude to them all.

CHURCH CLEANERS – Every Saturday a group of men and women parishioners prepare the Church for the weekend celebrations. They clean the altar and the floor, wipe the pews, arrange the books, flowers and linens, put up the seasonal banners and other tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. We do appreciate them for their dedication and devotion. SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING – The fulfillment of the Safe Environment requirements for our parish ministers and volunteers on Saturday, <u>August 3</u>, was made possible thru the technical assistance of *Fidel Flores* and *Jun Cortez* who set up the wi-fi connections in the hall and assisted by *Maryann Llamedo, Andy Llamedo, Mark Correia, Joyce Oliveira,* and a few others who lent their extra computer and tablet units.
