PARISH PATRONAL FIESTA + ANNIVERSARY

On August 16, 2019, our parish is celebrating the annual feast of our patroness, *Our Lady of the Mount*. We also commemorate the *149th Anniversary* of the foundation of OLM Parish. We have all the reason to celebrate joyfully as one parish *ohana* and as grateful stewards of the Lord.

Preceding the feast day celebration are the novena devotions to Our Lady of the Mount from August 7-15. The holy rosary component will be prayed before the daily Holy Mass and the novena prayers will be prayed after Communion at Mass.

On the feast day itself on August 16, we shall celebrate the Holy Mass at 6:00pm to be presided by *Rev. Fr. Steve Macedo*, Pastor of the Annunciation Church in Kamuela, Big Island. This will be preceded by a presentation of his personal and pastoral experiences in making stewardship work successfully in his parish. He will be speaking on the theme: "*Celebrating Joyfully as Grateful Stewards.*"

We shall also witness the induction and commissioning of the officers and members of OLM Parish Pastoral Council. We shall then have fellowship at the hall to celebrate the patronal feast as well as honor the guest-celebrant and speaker, *Rev. Fr. Steve Macedo* and the newly inducted officers and members of the PPC as well as appreciate the outgoing ones which include *Dr. Clementina Ceria-Ulep* and *Tom DeCorte*.

On Saturday, August 17, at 5:00pm, after gathering in the Church, the congregation will process to the Grotto led by the Knights of Columbus, the altar servers and *Rev. Fr. Edgar Brillantes* while singing Marian hymns. At the grotto, we will present floral offerings to our patroness, *Our Lady of the Mount*, recite the holy rosary, then return to the Church for the Vigil Mass. We shall then have fellowship at the hall and partake of traditional ethnic delicacies.

BLESSING FOR THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR

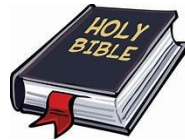

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
Wisdom 18:6-9

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm: 33:1, 12, 18-19, 20-22

Second Reading
Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

Gospel
Luke 12:32-48

First Reading: *Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23*

Most of us have had a day or two when we could relate to Qoheleth's feeling of emptiness that he expresses in the Hebrew phrases translated as "Vanity of vanities!" It is human nature to want our work to be productive. Our human nature also leads us to yearn for a sense of fulfillment and purpose in life. Some days leave us wanting and sorrow and grief find their way into our life. Yet for people of faith, worldly wisdom is insufficient.

Second Reading: *Colossians 3:1-5; 9-11*

The author of Colossians encourages his audience to "seek what is above," rather than "what is on earth." He provides a list of vices that Christians needs to put to death since our old selves have died in Baptism and we have put on a new self. Our relationships with one another must embody our new selves. They must honor the truth that no division exist in Christ.

Gospel: *Luke 12:13-21*

The Gospel reading directly responds to Qoheleth's emptiness as we learn from the parable of the rich fool that earthly wealth does not matter to God. What matters is the direction of one's life. Have we renounced greed? Is our life headed in the direction of the Kingdom of God? Does our life include the riches of Jesus' teaching? Are we utterly dependent on God. PRACTICING GOOD STEWARDSHIP IN OUR PARISHES

We're still in the grip of a hot and sunny summer, but August brings a wake-up call. By August's end, visiting relatives have gone home, schools will be open, swimming pools will be closed, and college kids have packed up and left for the halls of academia. What's all that mean for the Christian steward? As we journey through August, parishes begin to teem with plans and new vitality.

The parish is where the Church lives, and stewards are the lifeblood of a successful parish. In the parish, we find community and support, liturgy and ritual, sacrament and healing. In the parish, we find a way to give and a way to receive. On a practical level, fall is the time when parish planning gears up for the seasons ahead. Now, for a Christian steward, is the time to prayerfully consider your own involvement in the life of the parish in the coming year. How might we serve – and be served? Your parish website or office may provide a list of ministries in the parish. What calls to you? Respond to your deep desire. Maybe you're the party planner who'd love to serve on the social committee. Or perhaps you have a heart for helping the bereaved. Are you called to lector, or perhaps to take the Eucharist to the homebound? Maybe this is the year you need to soak in the fruits of adult education. Possibly you see a ministry missing and want to propose it. Perhaps, as a long time steward, you want to be part of revitalizing the stewardship efforts of your parish. If you take a look at the schedule for ICSC's October conference, you know there are a host of sessions which address how to enliven parish stewardship. Maybe this is the year you're called to attend the conference – another win-win situation in which you learn how to welcome the stranger, bring out the best in your parishioners, and encourage discipleship all while experiencing the community and support of other conference goers. August is a perfect time to reflect on where – not "if"-- you are called. August provides time to decompress from a busy, fun summer and pray about where your own road to discipleship leads you next.

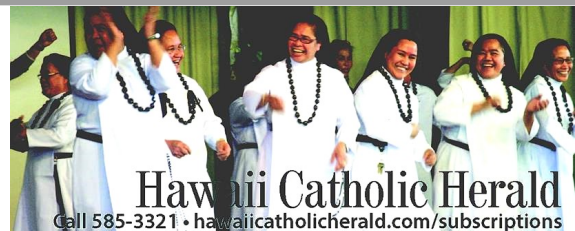

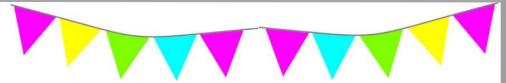

*****MINISTERS & VOLUNTEERS** – Our Parish has been blessed with such responsible stewards who serve and give without counting the cost and we keep praising and thanking God for them.

❖ **BUILDING & MAINTENANCE** – Under the lead of *Joyce Oliveira*, the Parish & Maintenance Committee selected the winning bid for the replacement of the old louver windows in the Convent. The contractor is *KKTF Hawaii* who will install *PlyGem Pro Line*, white vinyl, double-hung with insulated clear low-e sliding glass windows at the contract price of \$40,942.81. The amount is taken from the funds raised from the “*Save the Convent*” fundraising in May and November 2018 as well as from direct donations from parishioners. The materials have been ordered from the Mainland and the installation work will be done in August 12-21 and August 26, 28 & 29.

❖ Much thanks go to *Roger Isidro*, a member of the Facilities & Maintenance Committee, who replaced the gutter over the church sacristy that was blown by strong winds during the thunderstorm. He also does the spraying of unsightly weeds in the grounds.

❖ **CHURCH CLEANERS** – Every Saturday a group of men and women parishioners prepare the Church for the weekend celebrations. They clean the altar and the floor, wipe the pews, arrange the books, flowers and linens, put up the seasonal banners and other tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. We do appreciate them for their dedication and devotion. 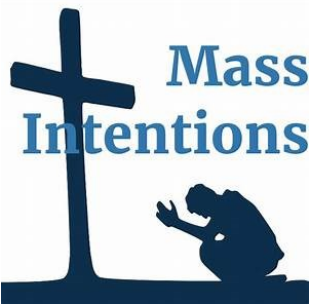

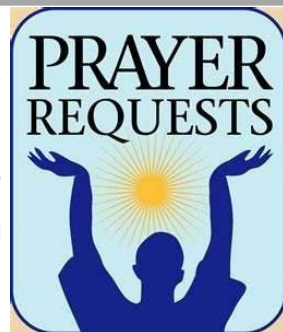

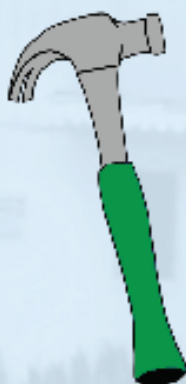
