




HONORING THE VIRGIN MARY

As a Marian parish here at OLM, we dedicate again this month of October in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary to pray daily the holy rosary before the start of the Holy Mass.

A public rosary under the banner of "America Needs Fatima" will also be held in front of the Church this Sunday at 12:00pm to mark the last apparition of Our Lady of Fatima to the 3 children.

Like what we did at the Diocesan Rosary Congress last Friday, October 11, we shall be holding another night vigil of Reparation as the International Centennial Pilgrim Image of Our Lady of Fatima comes

At 6:30pm we shall start with a welcome procession followed by the celebration of the Holy Mass. There will be blessing and investiture with the Brown Scapulars of Our Lady of Mount Carmel which are known for their solemn assurance of a happy death when worn devotedly and consistently. There will be an Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and followed by the hourly recitation of the decades of the holy rosary. The consecration of the family and our parish to the Two Hearts of Jesus and Mary will also be administered. The event will conclude with a Benediction and Farewell to Our Lady. The Pilgrim Image was blessed by Pope Francis and is brought to Hawaii by a group of the Alliance of the Holy Family International from Australia and US Mainland.

We earnestly invite you to join these sacred Marian events with fellow parishioners. "The family that prays together, stays together."

First Reading
Exodus 17:8-13

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17


Today's reading begins midway through the story of Naaman, whose skepticism in the face of the prophet's command, is omitted. The focus is rather on the moment of healing. Elisha's selflessness in the face of Naaman's gratitude reminds us of the servant's response in last Sunday's Gospel reading. He was only doing what was required. Overwhelmed by the power of God at work in his life, Naaman, the Gentile, promises to worship him alone.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Never forget, writes Paul to Timothy, that Jesus Christ rose from the dead. One wonders, how could we? This belief is the cornerstone of his Christian faith. It spurs Paul on in his ministry even though it meant imprisonment; it is the source of his endurance. Paul knows that we can depend on the promises of Christ.

Gospel: *Luke 17:11-19*

What faith these lepers had - first in approaching Jesus, believing he could cure them, and then obediently doing what he told them. A priest would have to declare them clean before they could reenter the Israelite community. Realizing that he had been healed, one returned to thank Jesus before going to the priest.



CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP: STEWARDS OF A MISSIONARY CHURCH

Jesus said to his apostles, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). The month of October is an ideal time to focus our prayers on the world and to reflect on how we might follow Christ's call to proclaim his teachings to "the whole world." The people of the world are a gift from God and this global community is a gift to be received with gratitude and held in stewardship.

World Mission Sunday is celebrated this year on October 20 and the entire month of October offers Catholics world-wide the opportunity to renew their commitment to proclaim the Gospel and to give a greater missionary focus to parish activities. It is time to reflect on the global impact of our stewardship, and to express our gratitude to missionaries who bear witness to Christ in the



most remote and challenging places. The month of October can remind us that being witnesses to Jesus Christ is a stewardship responsibility of us all, and that in a world experiencing increasingly disturbing forms of alienation and indifference, our communion of faith can offer signs of hope and work to make the planet a home for all people. We are "communion" because of the gift of the Eucharist. And this gift that we celebrate in the sacrament is not something we can keep to ourselves. By its very nature it demands to be shared with everyone. That is one reason the missionary impulse of our Church has always been a sign of vitality in its unique witness of unity around the world. There are a number of ways you can focus on the missionary activity of the Church:

- Include petitions for the Church's missionary work in your daily prayers.
- Increase your awareness of the wider global mission of the Church.
- Discover ways to participate in specific missionary activities taking place in your parish or diocese.
- Give generously on World Mission Sunday, celebrated this year on October 20.

The Church's work around the world is as important as the work in our own neighborhood. Let us be mindful this month that we are stewards of the Gospel, called to proclaim it to the ends of the earth, bringing hope to a world that is desperately hungry for Christ's loving presence.




gious and Most Creative. But all contestants will be given special gifts.
