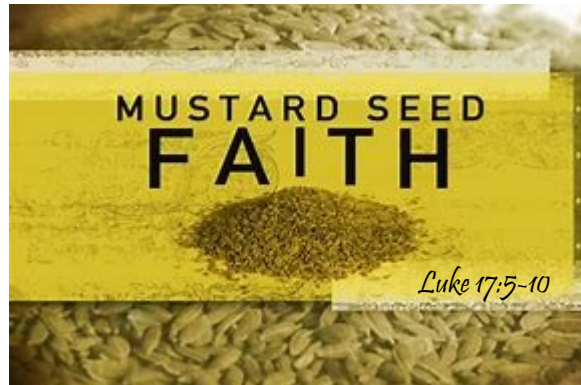

TODAY IS RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

Each *October* is designated as *Respect Life Month* by the *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB)*. It launches a new cycle of the *Respect Life Program*, which is a year-round, nationwide effort to help Catholics understand, value and help cultivate respect for human life.



This year's theme is *Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life*. The attacks against human life seem to grow more numerous and callous by the day. Next Sunday's Reading Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading
2 Kings 5:14-17

Responsorial Psalm
Psalm: 95:1-2, 6-9

Second Reading
2 Timothy 2:8-13

Gospel
Luke 17:11-19

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

It takes great faith not to lose hope in God in times of deep suffering and affliction. Habakkuk, in today's First Reading, exhorts his hearers to faith and hope. We may think of the word "vision" (which occurs twice) as all God has promised, all that hope encompasses. This hope has its time - it will come to fruition. The promises will be fulfilled. We must only have faith.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Bear your hardships, encourages Paul, fan into even stronger flames the fervor of your zeal for the Gospel. Embrace in your heart the rich deposit of faith the Church teaches.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

Today's Gospel consists of two rather independent sayings or teachings. The first begins with a request or prayer. "Increase our faith." Jesus' response points out the strength and power of even a little faith. The second part of the Gospel is the parable of a servant. How easy it is to think only of what we shall receive in return for whatever we do. Before the Lord, however, we are servants and whatever we do is only what we have been commanded.

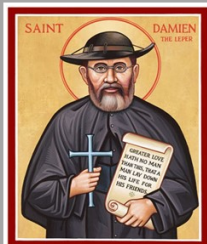

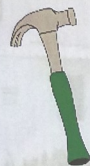

STEWARDSHIP OBSERVANCES IN OCTOBER



October 7 – *Month of the Holy Rosary* is dedicated to one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. Catholics are encouraged to pray the rosary. It is a form of contemplative prayer which brings down God's blessings on the faithful. It is a biblically inspired prayer which is centered on meditation of the salvific mysteries of Christ in union with Mary, who was so closely associated with her Son in his redeeming activity.

October 6 – *Respect Life Sunday* kicks off a month-long celebration of human life by our family of faith in the United States. *Respect Life Month* proclaims the immeasurable value of every person from conception to natural death. The *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops* assists parishes, schools and other Catholic ministries with helpful resources. The theme is "*Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life*" and highlights the call to build a culture of life as missionary disciples.

October 16 – *World Food Day* reminds us that in a world of plenty, millions go to bed hungry each night. This day seeks to increase awareness, understanding and informed year-round action to alleviate hunger. To find out more, consult *Catholic Relief Services* (www.crs.org), the official overseas arm of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, and contribute to a food pantry near you.

October 20 – *World Mission Sunday*, organized by the *Propagation of the Faith*, is a day set aside for Catholics worldwide to recommit to the Church's missionary activity through prayer and giving. As described by *Saint John Paul II*, it is "*an important day in the life of the Church because it teaches how to give: as an offering made to God, in the Eucharistic celebration, for all the missions of the world.*"

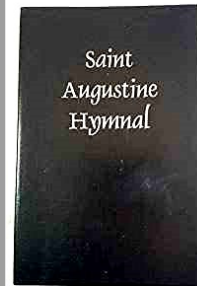
