
The Church needs faithful families who will support their children in pursuing the priesthood and religious life.

# **Next Sunday's Reading**

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading Malachi 3:19-20 **Responsorial Psalm** 

Psalm: 98:5-9

Second Reading

Gospel

2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Luke 21:5-19

First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7;1-2, 9-14

This is the account of eight Jewish martyrs, a mother and her seven sons, who attest to their belief in the resurrection of the dead. Their martyrdom took place at the time of Greek rule over Palestine. These brave martyrs chose death rather than to disobey the law of the Lord. Encouraged by their mother the brothers confessed their belief raised up by God after their death.

**Second Reading:** 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5

The first part of this reading is actually a prayer for the Thessalonians to be strengthened in what they say and do. In the second, Paul asks the Thessalonians to pray for him and his companions in the ministry of evangelization (note the specific mention of deliverance which echoes today's Responsorial Psalm). The last part of the reading expresses confidence that the Lord will strengthen and protect the community.

**Gospel:** Luke 20:27-38

In today's Gospel, like our First Reading, looks to the resurrection in the age to come. The Sadducees were a sect within Judaism who, unlike the Pharisees, did not believe in resurrection. The Sadducees held only to what was revealed in the Law of Moses, and resurrection was a later development in understanding. Our resurrected life will be completely other than what we know now in this life. In the age to come, we will be gloriously transformed like the Risen Christ.

# CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP - STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

\*I was born and raised in Kalihi Valley. All my family came to OLM Church. I received the sacraments here including matrimony. My mom and dad, *Elaine and Fermin Cruz*, were active parishioners and my dad even served as president of the Filipino Catholic Club.

My testimonial is about stewardship as it relates to income taxes. I always had to pay taxes. I had to pay so much taxes that I eventually paid quarterly throughout the year so I would not owe large amounts to the IRS.

Back then I thought tithing was only for rich people who had lots of money to give. I really did not understand tithing. I only gave God what I had left after paying bills, groceries, and things I didn't actually need.

Not so long ago, during the span of one year, I gave more than my usual offering to the Church. It was not exactly tithing or ten percent yet of my earnings. When tax time came, I was wondering again how much I would pay this time. To my surprise, the accountant smilingly told me that I was going to get a refund. When he noticed my disbelief, he showed the tax form and said. "This is the amount of tax refund you will get." I asked if the tax laws were changed. He replied: "No. It was because you had a large amount of deductible from the donations you made to the Church. That amount lowered your taxable income and increased immensely your deductible which is why you are getting a tax refund." Although still in disbelief, I told him, "You mean all I have to do is give more to the Church and I don't have to pay for my tax?" He said "Yes," and I then grinned at him saying, "Why didn't you tell me about this sooner."

As you may have guessed it, the following year, I gave even more to the Church for my stewardship offering. Every amount to the cent was accounted for and recorded in the tax-deductible letter that was sent to parishioners by the church before tax time. You won't believe it but my tax refund was even more than the previous year.

Since then, every year I get a refund just by keeping steady with my generous stewardship. I no longer pay additional taxes to the Federal govern-

Stewardship is acknowledging that all we have are gifts from God and so we show our gratefulness by returning a portion of those gifts to God through sharing of our time, talents and treasures to our church and others in need.

Everything we have is from God. All he asks is 10% back. The Book of Proverbs 3:9 urges us: "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce."

Tax time is coming soon. There are remaining 2 months to add more to your stewardship offering to the Church. You will never regret it for God in his generosity repays a thousand-fold.



# SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Letter from Bishop Larry Silva:

While this very important celebration is usually on <u>December 8</u>, since that is a Sunday this year, all the Masses for December 7/8 will be for the Second Sunday of Advent. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to <u>Monday</u>, <u>December 9</u>. Since the Diocese of Honolulu only celebrates two holy days of obligation throughout the year (Immaculate Conception and Christmas), the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception WILL be celebrated on <u>Monday</u>, <u>December 9</u>, 2019, as a <u>HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION</u> in the Diocese of Honolulu.

Pastors are asked to schedule Masses so that all may observe this holy day of obligation and to publicize that it is a holy day of obligation well in advance of December 9.

\*At OLM, there will be two Masses at 6:30am and 6:00pm on December 9, in observance of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception as holyday of obligation.
