Next Sunday's Reading

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Gospel

First Reading Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 Responsorial Psalm Psalm 128:1-5

Second Reading Colossians 3:12-21

Matthew:2:13-15, 19-23

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14; Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Although Isaiah spoke to God's people of his own time, more than seven centuries later Matthew discerns in this prophecy the hidden but now fully accomplished, intention of God. Significantly the angel addresses Joseph as "son of David." In Jewish law, Joseph was considered Jesus' legal father, and so Jesus was also designated as a member of the house of David. Thus, Matthew again reassures his audience of mostly Jewish Christians that all of Israel's hopes and expectations will be fulfilled in the son to be born of Mary, however mysterious her pregnancy.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

Matthew's primary focus rests not on Mary, however, but on the child she carries and his true origin. Twice we are told that \(\) Mary's son has been conceived "through the Holy Spirit." Matthew thus presents Jesus, even in his conception, as coming from and so bearing within himself the powerful presence and action of God, or "Holy Spirit." In this way, Matthew suggests another fulfillment of prophecy that Isaiah could not have imagined. Jesus will indeed be "God with us;" in him, divine power will speak and act to establish God's final reign.

SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD Viqil - December 24

Isaiah 62:1-5; Psalm 89:4-5, 16-17, 27, 29; Acts of the Apostles 13:16-17, 22-25; Matthew 1:1-25

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas Day) carries such importance within the life of the Church that it is in an entire period of liturgical time lasting nearly three weeks. The doctrine of the Incarnation states a fundamental Christian belief that God's divine nature assumed a human nature. In other words, the unseen God became human. Both human and divine natures come together in the person of Jesus Christ. This became known as the "holy exchange," which tells us that the divine became a human being so that humans could become divine.

Matthew, in the genealogy of Jesus, zeroes in on part of the history of God's chosen people. He presents the lineage of Joseph, who faithfully takes Mary and her unborn child into his home, thereby grafting them onto his family tree and fulfilling ancient promises. Salvation history has come to a climax with the Incarnation. God has come among his people in the flesh. Today, we speak of Jesus as the bridegroom of the Church. Isaiah's glorious vision has been fulfilled.

Midnight Mass - December 25

Isaiah 9:1-6; Psalm 96:1-3, 11-13; Titus 2:11-14; Luke 2:1-4

At the Mass during the Night celebrating Christ's coming into human history, the Scriptures once again call us to reflect upon past, present and future. Titus bids Christians to live today as Christ taught us when he was on earth, while we wait, stretching toward a final "appearance" of Christ. Luke announces that God fulfills human hopes in ways both complete and exceed our expectations.

At the beginning of the Gospel, Luke describes the situation of God's people some seven centuries later: they live in occupied territory, under control of that era's dominant power, Rome. The evangelist indicates God's definitive fulfillment of all prophecy by referring to Bethlehem, "the city of David" (Luke 2:11). The child born here begins the final act of God's plan of salvation, and this son of David exceeds all Israelite hopes and expectations.


Morning Mass - December 25

Isaiah 52:7-10; Psalm 98:1-6; Hebrews 1:1-6; John 1:1-8

In the First Reading, heralds hasten to Jerusalem to announce God's victory over Israel's enemies. The men keeping watch over the city echo the good news, which reverberates throughout the city until everyone is singing for joy. God has liberated his holy city, once besieged and destroyed by Babylon, for all to see. God's people no longer need to lament their circumstances nor feel ashamed of past misdeeds.

The Second Reading complements the prologue of John's account of the Gospel, which presents Jesus in exalted, cosmic language. Just as in the beginning God created by the power of his Word, so Jesus, the embodiment of God's Word, finally and forever saves people from the sin that endangers creation.

John the Baptist, as well as the author and community of the fourth account of the Gospel, have testified that God's Son came among us, as did the author of Hebrews. Today, we raise our voices in joyful song at all that God has done, and we pray that our jubilant cries will reverberate to the ends of the earth.



Christmas: A Stewardship Reflection

"Bah! Humbug!" was the attitude of Ebenezer Scrooge toward the two gentlemen who came looking for a Christmas donation to help the poor and homeless in the streets of London. "All I want to do is eat, drink and be merry!" was the attitude of the rich fool in Jesus' parable. Neither the wealthy but miserly Scrooge in Charles Dickens' classic, A Christmas Carol, nor Jesus' miserly fool in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 12:16-21), would find good company with Christian stewards who know those attitudes draw us away from God, not closer.

As we await the coming of Jesus at Christmas, the Advent season is the perfect time to reflect on our own attitudes toward the things we possess and our need to share with oth-

ers who are less fortunate. There is, of course, no season quite so full of wild abundance as the Christmas season. We are entering a joyful, exuberant time, full of music, family, parties, good food and friends. But every Christian steward knows that there is a shadow side to abundance, particularly material abundance, which brings its own challenges. Poverty, in North America and indeed worldwide, is growing, not diminishing. In the United States alone, one in six Americans now lives below the poverty line. The poor among us become invisible and the poverty that overtakes them becomes a scourge that brings a whole host of societal problems such as hunger, homelessness, crime and domestic violence.

Moreover, a culture that is focused on consuming more and more and built on satisfying the self and ignoring the needs of other people is a culture that impoverishes the soul. A preoccupation with our own wants and possessions fosters a spiritual poverty that has no room for the Lord at its center. That kind of spiritual poverty neglects the true meaning of Christmas in its joy and abundance. Despite the great spiritual significance of this feast, the season becomes a time of material excess.

Scrooge told his charitable solicitors that he wished to be left alone, and all the rich fool wanted was to be left alone with his material abundance. Christian stewards know that these attitudes are not compatible with being followers of Christ Jesus. Let us embrace the joy and the delightfulness of the Christmas season and at the same time remain mindful that the true joy of Christmas is not tied in to the wealth of goods under the tree, but to the abundance of love and generosity that fills our hearts and spills out to others, especially those most in need of our generous spirit.

Bishop Larry Silva is enjoining all the faithful in the Diocese of Honolulu to celebrate with the Filipino people the 500 Years of Christianity in the Philippines. The Bishop's letter was printed in whole at the previous issue of our Parish Bulletin.

Aside from directing the priests to develop in their Misa de Gallo or Simbang-Gabi homilies the themes that the Philippine Church has been celebrating, the Feast of Santo Nino was also mentioned as part of the milestone events. The Santo Nino is an image of the Child Jesus which was the first Catholic symbol given as gift by the Spaniards to the first Filipino baptized Catholics in 1521. The Santo Nino Visayan Ministry in OLM will spearhead the celebration. We enjoin all Catholics, Filipinos or not, in praying that the Philippines being the only Christian nation in the Far East may continue to uphold the Catholic faith in all areas of their lives.
