# Pastor's Corner

#### Next Sunday's Reading First Sunday of Lent

First Reading
Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 51:3-6, 12-13, 17

Second Reading Romans 5:12-19 Gospel
Matthew 4:1-11

#### First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2. 17-18

In this Reading the Lord commands that the community of Israel be holy because their God is holy. A long section in Leviticus, from which today's reading is taken, is called the Holiness Code, a collection of numerous directives that explain how people are to live in holiness. Underlying all the commandment is the core belief that human persons are holy because they belong to God. As well as relating to God with awe, reverence, and right worship, God's holy people are also to care for one another.

#### **Second Reading:** 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

"Temple of God" is the third image Paul uses to promote unity in the fractured Corinthian community. First he told them they are the field belonging to God, suggesting the many seeds, grains, and plantings needed for a rich harvest. Next, they are God's building, where each member builds on the foundation laid by Paul. In today's reading, they are a particular building: God's temple.

#### Gospel: Matthew 5:38-48

From today's Gospel reading come familiar expressions: "turn the other cheek." "the shirt off your back," and "go the extra mile." All of them concern going beyond mere equity toward a justice that gives more than it receives—even to the point of responding to an attack with an offer of friendship. Jesus wants us to stop the cycle of confrontation and turn it around with generosity. When Jesus tells us to love our enemies, he's not talking about an intangible emotion. Love is a verb—an action word—and to love your enemy means to respond with loving action. When Jesus tells to be perfect, he's telling us to show unconditional generosity in any conflict, even to those who are ungrateful, just as our heavenly Father would.

#### PARISH STEWARDSHIP

February is a transitional month, especially in 2020 with its 26th day as Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. Many of us also begin to hope that spring will be around the next corner. The first seed catalog we find in the mail reminds us this must be true, yet we know it's not time to turn the soil. We wait in the quiet of late winter.

What better time than February, before Lent and the advent of spring, to settle in for some reading and praying with sacred scripture? February can be a quiet time of patient reflection for the Christian steward. The psalms, like so many biblical passages, remind us of the benefits of reading God's



word: "Your word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path" (Ps 119:105). Our liturgical year offers us a wonderful pathway to the Bible by providing Lectionary readings for each day. Our Sunday Gospel readings this year come to us mainly from Saint Matthew. In the month of February, we have an opportunity to reflect on Christ's teachings in his Sermon on the Mount with its hope-filled Beatitudes. This Gospel is ideal for spending time with the Lord in quiet meditation.

In the Gospel of Saint Matthew Jesus gives us a guide to Christian living. If you choose to read this great book of the Bible, consider just one episode in the Gospel each time you read it. Put yourself into the scene. See what words strike a chord in you. Ask the Lord to help you know him through the Gospel reading. One of the hallmarks of Saint Matthew's Gospel is his emphasis on discipleship and what it means to follow Jesus. Christian stewards look to this Gospel to gain new insights into their journey of faith; and much like the desires of gardeners, long for the seeds of the Gospel, especially the Beatitudes, to be planted in their own hearts.

Find some quiet time. Pick up your Bible. And use God's gift of these quiet February days to deepen your knowledge of Christ through sacred scripture.

#### **❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE**

\*\*RENOVATION OF THE CONVENT — The Facilities & Maintenance Committee headed by Joyce Oliveira finalized an agreement with Okamura Contractor, Inc. to continue the renovation of the old convent. Specifically, the areas that are covered are the carpentry and repainting. The contract price is \$44,263.86. The works on plumbing and rewiring of electrical lines will be done by the members of the parish committee with free labor but the parish has to purchase the materials. The funds used are taken from the proceeds of the last fundraising in November which garnered \$40,000. The remaining expenses will be shouldered by the parish from its Repair & Maintenance stewardship collection.

\*\*REPLACING THE WINDOW SCREENS – Roger Isidro, member of the Parish Facilities & Maintenance Committee, installed new screens on the windows in the sacristy and rectory offices. They have to be replaced because of wear and tear.

Anointing of the Sick is a Sacrament of the Church and is offered to Catholics who are dangerously ill due to sickness, injury, or old age, starting 70 years old. While we should not be excessively concerned about the degree of seriousness of the condition, the casual participation in the Sacrament must be avoided in good conscience.

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#### DIOCESE OF HONOLULU 2020 LENTEN REGULATIONS

\*By the Diocesan Office of Worship

#### **♦**FASTING

In the dioceses of the United States, Catholics age 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (Feb. 26) and Good Friday (April 10).

To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) are not permitted on fast days.

#### ❖ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

#### ❖EASTER DUTY

All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled, for a just cause, at some other time during the year. This period is extended to include all the weeks of Lent and the Easter Season up to Trinity Sunday (June 7).

#### ❖LENTEN PRACTICES

The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution; to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged and the poor; to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls this year on Feb. 26. Ashes are to be blessed and distributed as a sign of our entry into a season of conversion, repentance and reconciliation. Ashes are to be blessed by a bishop, priest or deacon. Others may be associated with the clergy in the distribution of ashes.

*Funeral Masses* may not be celebrated on Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Saturday, nor on the Sundays of Lent. When pastoral reasons require that a funeral be celebrated on these days, only a *Funeral Outside of Mass* may be held.

To afford the faithful opportunities to participate in Lenten prayer services, pastors are encouraged to have such prayer services at least twice a week, including the *Way of the Cross on Fridays, Exposition and Benediction, Evening Prayer, and evening Masses*. A homily or instruction should be included.




