

THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

*COVID-19, or *coronavirus disease-2019*, started in China and evolved into a pandemic that is wreaking havoc and chaos in our human world. Tens of thousands have been afflicted and thousands have perished worldwide and still counting. To contain the spread of the virus and prevent further casualties and fatalities, some countries have opted for lockdown where no one could get in or out. Some cities and states in the United States have imposed curfew, 'stay-at-home' orders and shutdowns where most business establishments and institutions not related to health and security are closed. The national and local leaders in the government and health care system, while scrambling for the right and effective antidote, issued advisories discouraging large-group gatherings where the maximum allowed is only ten people and imposed social distancing which keeps people apart for at least 6 ft away from each other. Next Sunday's Reading Fifth Sunday of Lent

First Reading Ezekiel 37:12-14 Responsorial Psalm Psalm 130:1-8

Second Reading Romans 8:8-11

Gospel John 11:1-45

First Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13

This Reading recounts the anointing of the young shepherd boy, David, as king of Israel. In the story God directs Samuel to Jesse of Bethlehem, who had eight sons. From Jesse's sons would come the next king of Israel. To the surprise of everyone, God choses Jesse's youngest son., David. It was what God saw in David's heart that made him different from his brothers. Israel was learning to rely on divine vision to guide its history and its destiny.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

In his Letter to the Ephesians, Paul presents teaching and exhortations that are applicable to all of the baptized. He encourages them to "live as children of the light, producing "goodness and righteousness and truth."

Gospel: John 9:1-41

The divine vision of Jesus drives today's Gospel reading from John, the healing of the man born blind. The blind man's healing begins with a simple and logical question from the disciples: Was the man born blind because he or his parents had sinned? It is only Jesus alone who sees that the man was born blind not because of sin; rather, the man was born blind "so that the works of God might be made visible through him."

"The man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and told me to go to Siloam and wash. I went there and washed and was able to see." John 9:11

❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

***RENOVATION OF THE CONVENT – The 4th phase of the renovation which includes carpentry and repainting is ongoing and being done by the Okamura Contractor, Inc. Joyce Oliveira, head of the Parish Planning & Building Committee (PPBC) and Roger Isidro as the Project Manager are supervising the job. Doing the prep work were Kalolo Tuihalafatai and Roger Isidro with the help of Frankie Cabral and Lito Dullin.

The remaining works on plumbing and upgrading of power lines and electric installations will be done by *Kalolo Tuihalafatai*, *Rudy Fiesta*, *Adriano Daligcon*, *Roger Isidro* and the volunteer members of the *PPBC* but the parish has to purchase the materials. The funds are taken from the proceeds of the last fundraising in November spearheaded by *Becky Jandoc* and the *Finance Council Team*. The remainder of the expenses will be taken out from Parish Repair & Maintenance stewardship collection.



***GUIDANCE FROM THE CHURCH**

On March 16, 2020, Bishop Larry Silva of the Diocese of Honolulu issued a directive that in light of the COVID-19 pandemic and in compliance with the Center for Disease Control's most recent strong recommendations for the containment of the contagious deadly coronavirus – "The public celebration of the Holy Mass will be canceled in all locations, effective at noon on March 17 through Tuesday, March 31, inclusive. The faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays during this period." All other services are cancelled except Funeral Masses or services and weddings that have been scheduled before the crisis struck. The bereaved families, however, are urged to limit the number of guests and that social distancing be observed.

WHAT WE CAN DO AS GOD'S FAITHFUL:

- 1> Keep the Lord's Day holy by participating in the live streaming or telecast of the Mass in the EWTN TV channel or other stations in the comfort of your living room. Pray the *Prayer for Spiritual Communion* (*printed below*) when it's time for Holy Communion.
- 2> Pray individually or as a family at home your favorite novenas or devotions such as the Holy Rosary, Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, or Novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help.
- 3> Reflect on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord thru the Stations of the Cross.
- 4> Go to *myParish* app and say the prayers or read the Scripture readings of the day's liturgy and other spiritual menu found in there. You can also read our Parish Bulletin there and the Hawaii Catholic herald. There are also current church news to keep yourself abreast with what's happening in the Catholic world. 

Subject: RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC IN THE DIOCESE OF HONOLULU

As we are all aware, we are in a unique time in which a pandemic that has had deadly effects needs to be halted. The Diocese of Honolulu has already sent out directives about how to keep as safe as possible during our liturgies and our spiritual, educational and social gatherings. The situation has rapidly changed, however, and in light of the Center for Disease Control's most recent strong recommendations for containment of this contagious virus, I am now offering these directives to be followed in all parishes, ethnic communities, and oratories in the Diocese of Honolulu.

The public celebration of Mass will be canceled in all locations, effective at noon on March 17 through Tuesday, March 31, inclusive. I am dispensing all the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays during this period. (Please see below for more information.)

Funeral Masses/Services and Weddings that are already scheduled to take place during this period may proceed as scheduled, but families are encouraged to limit the number of guests so that the necessary social distancing can be accomplished. Baptisms and other services scheduled during this time are to be postponed, and no other such services are to be scheduled during this period.

Communal Penance Services are canceled. Priests will avail themselves for individual confessions by appointment or according to the schedule published by each parish.

Pastors are to do all they can to have their churches open throughout the day for private prayer.

All other gatherings of people in our parishes and schools are to be canceled so that social distancing can be practiced. Consideration should be given to meetings via social media platforms, if needed.

The Chrism Masses scheduled on Hawaii Island (March 24), Kauai (March 26), and Maui (March 31) are canceled. The Chrism and holy oils will be consecrated and blessed on Oahu on April 2, but at this point only the clergy and the liturgical ministers of that Mass will be invited to attend. The holy oils will later be sent to the Neighbor Islands.

The Mass for the Launch of 500 Years of Christianity in the Philippines Hawaii Celebration scheduled for April 4 is canceled and will be celebrated at a later date after the current crisis subsides.

The decision to cancel Masses is a very serious decision that was not taken lightly and that was made after consultation with the members of the Priests Council. Priests are to offer private Masses for the spiritual welfare of the people they serve, and pastors especially are still obliged to offer the Mass *pro populo* (for the people of the parish) every Sunday.

On Friday, March 27, we will reassess the situation and decide about the best course of action after March 31.

While nothing can fully replace the celebration of the Eucharist, in which we physically encounter the risen Lord Jesus as he offers us his Body and Blood for nourishment, all are encouraged to keep the Lord's day holy by spending time in prayer and reflection. Mass will be celebrated without the congregation and live-streamed from the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace in Honolulu each Sunday at 9:00 a.m. and can be accessed at https://www.facebook.com/HonoluluCathedralBasilica or www.hictv.com. In addition, other parishes may livestream the private Mass of the priest, so check your parish's website to see if this service is offered. EWTN (Eternal Word Television Network – Channel 30 for cable customers; Channel 261 for Dish customers) broadcasts Mass daily.

The Scripture readings for Sunday, Solemnity, and Weekday Masses are available at usccb.org/bible/readings. All are encouraged to spend time reflecting on these Scriptures, especially on Sundays.

During this time of crisis, let us pray for one another and for the health and safety of all in our community. For many, "fasting" from the Mass will be the most difficult fast they have undertaken, but we pray that it will help us be even more appreciative of this great gift of Christ's ongoing presence with us.

Finally, I present the Prayer for the COVID-19 Pandemic to you for your daily reflection and for sharing with your friends.
