# **DIVINE MERCY**

**Divine Mercy Sunday** is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter, the eighth day of the Easter Octave. It is based on the private revelations to *St. Faustina Kowalska* and it also has links to the Bible and the readings of this day.

In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and during the ceremony he declared: "It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called 'Divine Mercy Sunday'...In the various readings, the liturgy seems to indicate the path of mercy which, while re-establishing the relationship of each person with God, also creates new relations of fraternal solidarity among human beings" [Homily, April 30, 2000].

To ensure that the faithful would observe this day with intense devotion, the Supreme Pontiff [Pope St. John Paul II] himself established that this Sunday be enriched by a *plenary indulgence*, so that the faithful might receive in great abundance the gift of the consolation of the Holy Spirit. In this way, they can foster a growing love for God and for their neighbor, and after they have obtained God's pardon, they in turn might show a prompt pardon to their brothers and sisters.

A plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any Church or Chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. "Jesus Christ, King of Mercy, I trust in you!").

The Divine Mercy image is a depiction of Jesus based on a vision St. Faustina had in 1931. A basic explanation of the image is: Jesus is raising his right hand in blessing and pointing with his left hand on his chest from which flow forth two rays: one red and one white. The depictions often contain the message "Jesus, I trust in You!" (Polish: Jezu ufam Tobie). The rays streaming out have symbolic meaning: red for the blood of Jesus which is the Life of Souls, and pale white for the water which justify souls (Diary #299). The whole image is symbolic of charity, forgiveness and love of God, referred to as the "Fountain of Mercy." The Divine Mercy image depicts Jesus at the moment he appears to the disciples in the Upper Room, after the Resurrection, when he empowers

The Divine Mercy image depicts Jesus at the moment he appears to the disciples in the Upper Room, after the Resurrection, when he empowers them to forgive or retain sins. This moment is recorded in John 20:19-31, which is the Gospel reading for this Sunday in all three yearly Sunday liturgical cycles (A-B-C). This reading includes the appearance of Jesus to the Apostle Thomas in which Jesus invites him to touch his wounds. This event occurred on the eighth day after the Resurrection (John 20:26), and so it is used on the liturgy eight days after Easter.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a set of prayers used as part of the Divine Mercy devotion. They are usually said using a standard set of Rosary beads, often at 3:00 pm (the time of Jesus' death), but with a different set of prayers than those used in the Marian Rosary.

### First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47

In this Reading, Luke describes communal relations reborn in the power of the enlivening Spirit. A once fearful, scattered, and disillusioned group of disciples is guickly unified into an inclusive community, sharing prayer, table fellowship, and material goods. "All who believed" continued the teaching of Jesus: each member's needs were met.

### Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

This Reading is from the beginning of the First Letter of Peter, which will continue through the Sundays of Easter. In the letter, it deals with emerging realities of Christian communities whose "raised" way of life conflicted with that of the prevailing Greco-Roman culture. Consequences included counter-cultural way of life of social estrangement and economic harassment. Christians are reminded of the foundation of their faith and encourages them to remain steadfast despite opposition. The Christian way of life is born through Jesus' Resurrection, which will grant salvation for our soul.

### Gospel: John 20:19-31

In today's Gospel, it is the evening of the first day of the week when Jesus stands in the midst. His presence, unrestrained by the locked doors is sudden and mysterious. He begins with a traditional greeting of peace, with his peace transforming their fear into joy. To assure the gathered community of his identity, Jesus shows them his hands and side. Jesus then gives his disciples a mission based on his own mission from his Father. Along with peace, Jesus gives his followers the Holy Spirit, God's life-giving and permanent presence. By breathing the Holy Spirit on them, Jesus inaugurates a new creation, comparable to God giving the breath into humanity. Empowered by the Spirit, his followers will continue Jesus' mission of forgiveness, going into the world, no longer fearful behind locked doors.



There are also prescribed prayers that we can use individually or as a family. We need to get connected all the more with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

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#### **\***GUIDANCE FROM THE CHURCH**\***

#### WHAT WE CAN DO AS GOD'S FAITHFUL: During the COVID-19 Pandemic Crisis

1> Keep the Lord's Day holy by participating in the live streaming or telecast of the Mass in the EWTN TV channel or other stations in the comfort of your living room. Pray the *Prayer for Spiritual Communion* (printed below) when it's time for Holy Communion. For live-streaming log in to: *Facebook.com/Diocese-of-Honolulu-Evangelization-TaskForce*.

2> Pray individually or as a family at home your favorite novenas or devotions such as the Holy Rosary, Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, or Novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

3> Reflect on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord thru the Stations of the Cross.

4> Go to *myParish* app and say the prayers or read the Scripture readings of the day's liturgy and other spiritual menu found in there. You can also read our Parish Bulletin there and the Hawaii Catholic herald. There are also current church news to keep yourself abreast with what's happening in the Catholic world. **To download** *myParish* app – *Text "app" then* 88202, *then* scroll the list of parishes to "Our Lady of the Mount".

5> Pray the *Prayer for Deliverance from the Coronavirus* (printed below) composed by Bishop Larry Silva and the other relevant prayers.

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#### **\*** SPIRITUAL COMMUNION **\***

St. Thomas Aquinas described it as *"an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embrace him"* at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion. With the absence of public Masses in the Diocese of Honolulu, the opportunity for receiving spiritual communion is particularly appropriate.

Spiritual communion only requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the sacrament and a turning to Jesus with the heart. To help focus a proper intention, recitation of a prayer is suggested. One of the most popular is that composed by St. Alphonsus Liguori below:



## Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

#### **MEMORANDUM**

To: Clergy, Parishes and Catholic Faithful

From: Most Reverend Larry Silva, Bishop of Honolulu

Date: March 27, 2020

Subject: Updated General Directives and Liturgical Guidelines Due to the COVID-19

Peace be with you!

As we continue to adapt to a different way we live our daily lives, as well as to the way we worship during the rapidly evolving COVID-19 pandemic, our Diocese's top priority remains the spiritual welfare, health, and safety of our faithful, employees, and the vulnerable of our community. Our Governor has ordered a stay-at-home lockdown until April 30 in order to mitigate the effects of the virus and stop its spread. After consultation with my staff and the Presbyteral Council, I am issuing the following directives, which go into effect immediately:

• Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions are to be closed to the public through April 30, 2020, or until further notice. (This is more restrictive than the last notice, which encouraged that they remain open, and is based on the restrictions recently imposed by Governor Ige.)

• There will be only one Chrism Mass for the Diocese on Thursday, April 2, at 7:00 p.m., but it will be celebrated in private with only the Bishop and the handful of ministers needed for the liturgy. The invitation of priests and deacons issued earlier is rescinded in light of new developments. The Office of Worship will see to the distribution of the sacred oils to the parishes on all islands.

• All liturgical and sacramental celebrations from now through April 30 are canceled, including those during Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum, and Easter Sunday. The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays is dispensed through April 30, 2020. [Priests are to celebrate private Masses, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, especially for the intentions of their people. We encourage parish priests to live-stream their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information.]

• The celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, First Communion) for the Elect, normally celebrated at the Easter Vigil, are postponed to a future day after the Covid-19 crisis subsides. A future date when these sacraments may be rescheduled will be announced by the Bishop.

• Parishes are invited to inform their parishioners of opportunities to view the Mass and other services via livestream or the parish's Facebook. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.

• The faithful are encouraged to keep the Lord's Day holy. Some ways to do this include: reading the Scriptures of the day, especially the Gospels, praying with your families, and to joining yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. For more information and resources, please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.

• Sacramental confessions will not be offered, for the safety of penitents and priests, Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. General absolution is not permitted, because it presumes a gathering of people. Because confessions will be curtailed during this time, the following should be noted from The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1452: "When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called 'perfect' — contrition of charity. Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible."

What the Apostolic Penitentiary said about the Sacrament of Penance might be applied analogously to the Sacrament of the Sick: "Where the individual faithful find themselves in the painful impossibility of receiving sacramental absolution, it should be remembered that perfect contrition, coming from the love of God, beloved above all things, expressed by a sincere request for forgiveness (that which the penitent is at present able to express) and accompanied by votum confessionis, that is, by the firm resolution to have recourse, as soon as possible, to sacramental confession, obtains forgiveness of sins, even mortal ones."

The following Act of Contrition, sincerely prayed, might be used:

Father of mercy, like the prodigal son, I return to you and say: "I have sinned against you and am no longer worthy to be called your child." Jesus Christ, Savior of the world, I pray with the repentant thief to whom you promised Paradise, "Lord, remember me in your kingdom." Holy Spirit, fountain of love, I call on you with trust, "Purify my heart, and help me to walk as a child of light."

All funerals, weddings and baptisms should be postponed at this time until further notice.

Aloha!

At today's city briefing on the coronavirus Mayor Kirk Caldwell was asked specifically if Catholic Churches were exempt from his "order #3" regarding private gatherings issued on April 9<sup>th</sup> (see below). The question was in reference to our live-stream Masses and services.

["Religious gatherings: Under Order #3 of the Stay at Home Order, all public and <u>private gatherings of any</u> <u>kind</u> are prohibited during the term of the Stay at Home Order (as may be extended). This broad, facially neutral prohibition on gatherings <u>includes secular and non-secular gatherings</u>."]

The Mayor clarified that live-streaming of religious services in general is permitted. HOWEVER, they need to be limited to a minimum amount of people (e.g. preacher, camera person) and follow the "social distancing" practices.

Because this is a mandatory order by the Mayor, we ask that you minimize the number of people assisting at your live-stream Masses as follows (we are doing the same at the Cathedral Basilica): Celebrant - One Lector – Videographer - One Musician.

\*NO concelebrants - NO deacon(s) - NO server(s) - NO MC(s)

Thank you for your understanding! We are appreciative of all that you are doing to keep your communities connected via the live-stream Mass and services, but we need to be careful and follow the rules. Let me know if you have any questions!




