First Reading

Responsorial Psalm

Acts of the Apostles: 2:14,

Psalm 23:1-6

36-41

Gospel

Second Reading 1 Peter: 2:20-25

John 10:1-10

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 22-33

This Reading tells of Peter's speech that he delivers after the disciples experience Pentecost. Peter makes two important points about Jesus' Resurrection. First, that everything about Jesus, from his mighty works and signs to his Resurrection from the dead, was accomplished by God. Second, that Jesus' Resurrection from the dead fulfills God's "oath" to David. That God would not abandon him to the netherworld nor let God's holy one see corruption, two ways of referring to death.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:17-21

In this Reading, directed to the Gentile churches of Asia Minor, Peter knows that the recipients of this letter, as believing Christians, must break from their past way of thinking in order to embrace what God has offered them in the Resurrection of Jesus. Peter points to God as the source and foundation of the Gentiles' faith and hope.

Gospel: *Luke* 24:13-35

Today's Gospel opens with two dejected disciples leaving the community in Jerusalem, and closes with the two of them, rejoicing, back in Jerusalem. Between the opening and the closing is the story of their encounter with Jesus, unrecognized, and his walking with them. On the road, Jesus explains the Scriptures to them, and in the evening shares in the breaking of the bread when they finally recognize him. All this happens on the first day of the week, the very day that the women had discovered Jesus' empty tomb. Now as he walks and breaks bread with them, it becomes apparent that the risen Jesus is just as present to them as was the earthly Jesus to his disciples. The two disciples met Jesus in both word and sacrament, so too does the Church. Like these two disciples who told how Jesus was made known to them, now all who participate in the liturgy also go forth to bring the Good News to others.

On Friday, May 1st, Archbishop Gomez, USCCB President, will lead the nation in a prayer at 3:00 pm EDT (9 A.M. Hawaii time) on which he will re-consecrate the United States to Our Lady under the title of Mary, Mother of the Church. The Bishops of Canada, too, has chosen this day to offer prayers and to consecrate their country to Mary, Mother of the Church.

"This will give the Church the occasion to pray for Our Lady's continued protection of the vulnerable, healing of the unwell, and wisdom for those who work to cure this terrible virus," said Archbishop Gomez in a letter to the U.S. bishops. Each year, the Church seeks the special intercession of the Mother of God during the month of May. "This year, we seek the assistance of Our Lady all the more earnestly as we face together the effects of the global pandemic," he continued.

Archbishop Gomez has invited the bishops to join in from their respective dioceses and asked them to extend the invitation to the faithful in their dioceses for their participation. Here in our diocese, Bishop Larry will guide us in the prayer of the rosary, follow with a rerun of Archbishop Gomez prayer service and finally the celebration of the holy Mass (in honor of the feast of St. Joseph the Worker, praying especially for those who have lost jobs or had their jobs severely curtailed) from the Cathedral Basilica starting at 6:00 p.m. Please see attached flyers with information of our local celebrations. Please use the attached flyers to help us promote in our diocese this event. We ask that you add them to your own parish/ school/community websites and Facebook pages. We hope to have our whole diocese praying together to our Mother in Heavens. FREE RESOURCES: "PRAYING TOGETHER, PRAYING APART"

The COVID-19 virus forces us and our parishioners to grapple with a difficult reality. Amid self-isolation and "stay-athome" orders, an increasing number of people are experiencing sickness and death separated from other people. Liturgical Press (Collegeville, MN) has posted more free resources in their website that relate to healing and grief. *Praying Together, Praying Apart*: *At-Home Prayers for Times of Healing, Illness, and Death* is a new resource available for free download in their website and at the links below for praying in times of healing, illness and death. I also attached it for your convenience. A free Spanish language edition of this resource is coming shortly as well on this page: https://offers.litpress.org/coronavirus-response-to-customers. Please consider sharing this on your own parish websites for your community's use.

The attached provides the following:

Part I: Prayers of Comfort, Hope, and Healing: These texts can be prayed by individuals, families, or other groups.

Part II: <u>Lucernarium for Healing</u>: Lucernarium, or "service of light," grows out of the tradition in the early church of lighting lamps for evening prayer. This celebration of light rejoices in Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, the Light no darkness can overcome.

Part III: **Rosary for Healing with Luke the Evangelist**: The rosary is a prayer pathway that invites us to meditate on significant events in Jesus' life. The Rosary for Healing with Luke the Evangelist focuses on the healing mission and ministry of Jesus Christ, allowing us to enter more fully into the healing experiences within Luke's Gospel. Begin each decade by reading the corresponding Scripture passage.

Part IV: <u>At-Home Service of Prayer when Someone Has Died</u>: One of the realities of social distancing is the inability to gather as a community for wakes, funerals, and other memorial services when someone has died. This service of prayer is intended to give people a way to pray in their own homes as they grieve the loss of a loved one. I hope this is helpful!

WHAT WE CAN DO AS GOD'S FAITHFUL: During the COVID-19 Pandemic Crisis

- 1> Keep the Lord's Day holy by participating in the live streaming or telecast of the Mass in the EWTN TV channel or other stations in the comfort of your living room. Pray the *Prayer for Spiritual Communion* (printed below) when it's time for Holy Communion. For live-streaming log in to: *Facebook.com/Diocese-of-Honolulu-Evangelization-TaskForce*.
- 2> Pray individually or as a family at home your favorite novenas or devotions such as the Holy Rosary, Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, or Novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help.
- 3> Reflect on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord thru the Stations of the Cross.
- 4> Go to *myParish* app and say the prayers or read the Scripture readings of the day's liturgy and other spiritual menu found in there. You can also read our Parish Bulletin there and the Hawaii Catholic herald. There are also current church news to keep yourself abreast with what's happening in the Catholic world. **To download** *myParish* app *Text "app"* then 88202, then scroll the list of parishes to "Our Lady of the Mount".
- 5> Pray the *Prayer for Deliverance from the Coronavirus* (printed below) composed by Bishop Larry Silva and the other relevant prayers.

* SPIRITUAL COMMUNION *

St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embrace him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion. With the absence of public Masses in the Diocese of Honolulu, the opportunity for receiving spiritual communion is particularly appropriate.

Spiritual communion only requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the sacrament and a turning to Jesus with the heart. To help focus a proper intention, recitation of a prayer is suggested. One of the most popular is that composed by St. Alphonsus Liquori below:



Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

To: Clergy, Parishes and Catholic Faithful

Date: March 27, 2020

Subject: Updated General Directives and Liturgical Guidelines Due to the COVID-19

Peace be with you!

As we continue to adapt to a different way we live our daily lives, as well as to the way we worship during the rapidly evolving COVID-19 pandemic, our Diocese's top priority remains the spiritual welfare, health, and safety of our faithful, employees, and the vulnerable of our community. Our Governor has ordered a stay-at-home lockdown until April 30 in order to mitigate the effects of the virus and stop its spread. After consultation with my staff and the Presbyteral Council, I am issuing the following directives, which go into effect immediately:

- Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions are to be closed to the public through <u>April 30</u>, <u>2020</u>, <u>or until further notice</u>. (This is more restrictive than the last notice, which encouraged that they remain open, and is based on the restrictions recently imposed by Governor Ige.)
- There will be only one **Chrism Mass** for the Diocese on <u>Thursday, April 2, at 7:00 p.m.</u>, but it will be celebrated in private with only the Bishop and the handful of ministers needed for the liturgy. The invitation of priests and deacons issued earlier is rescinded in light of new developments. The Office of Worship will see to the distribution of the sacred oils to the parishes on all islands.
- All liturgical and sacramental celebrations from now through April 30 are canceled, including those during Holy Week, the Paschal Triduum, and Easter Sunday. The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays is dispensed through April 30, 2020. [Priests are to celebrate private Masses, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, especially for the intentions of their people. We encourage parish priests to live-stream their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information.]
- The celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, First Communion) for the Elect, normally celebrated at the Easter Vigil, are postponed to a future day after the Covid-19 crisis subsides. A future date when these sacraments may be rescheduled will be announced by the Bishop.
- Parishes are invited to inform their parishioners of opportunities to view the Mass and other services via *livestream or the parish's Facebook*. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.
- The faithful are encouraged to **keep the Lord's Day holy**. Some ways to do this include: reading the Scriptures of the day, especially the Gospels, praying with your families, and to joining yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. For more information and resources, please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.
- Sacramental confessions will not be offered, for the safety of penitents and priests, Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. General absolution is not permitted, because it presumes a gathering of people. Because confessions will be curtailed during this time, the following should be noted from The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1452: "When it arises from a love by which God is loved above all else, contrition is called 'perfect' contrition of charity. Such contrition remits venial sins; it also obtains forgiveness of mortal sins if it includes the firm resolution to have recourse to sacramental confession as soon as possible."

What the Apostolic Penitentiary said about the Sacrament of Penance might be applied analogously to the **Sacrament of the Sick**: "Where the individual faithful find themselves in the painful impossibility of receiving sacramental absolution, it should be remembered that perfect contrition, coming from the love of God, beloved above all things, expressed by a sincere request for forgiveness (that which the penitent is at present able to express) and accompanied by votum confessionis, that is, by the firm resolution to have recourse, as soon as possible, to sacramental confession, obtains forgiveness of sins, even mortal ones."

The following **Act of Contrition**, sincerely prayed, might be used:

Father of mercy, like the prodigal son, I return to you and say: "I have sinned against you and am no longer worthy to be called your child." Jesus Christ, Savior of the world, I pray with the repentant thief to whom you promised Paradise, "Lord, remember me in your kingdom." Holy Spirit, fountain of love, I call on you with trust, "Purify my heart, and help me to walk as a child of light."

- · All funerals, weddings and baptisms should be postponed at this time until further notice.
- All Confirmations/First Holy Communions scheduled from now through April 30 are postponed. The Office of the Vicar General will contact parishes which need to reschedule once the "all clear" is indicated by the civil authorities.

Liturgies at which Bishop Larry Silva will preside will be private, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, but will be live-streamed for all to see at www.hictv.com or https://www.facebook.com/HonoluluCathedralBasilica.
