


MARIAN MONTH OF MAY

Next Sunday's Reading The Ascension of the Lord

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

Second Reading

Ephesians 1:17-23

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 47:2-3. 6-9

Gospel Matthew 28:16-20

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8

In this Reading, we hear of Philip's successful evangelization among the Samaritans. Luke tells us that Philip performed signs (exorcising demonpossessed people and curing those who were paralyzed or crippled). Because of this, the Samaritans listened to Philip as he "proclaimed Christ to them" and they were "baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus." As a result, Peter and John were sent to lay hands on the Samaritans so that they too would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:15-18

Peter tells his audience that suffering for doing good, if it is God's will, is better that suffering for doing evil. Peter looks to Christ as the source for hope and turns to Christ as the model for those who suffer for doing good. Christ's suffering and death, in accord with God's will, was the necessary path to resurrection. Christ, once put to death in the flesh is now alive in the spirit. He is the reason for their hope.

Gospel: John 14:15-21

Today's Gospel prepares us for the Ascension and the culmination of Easter in Pentecost. Christ, in the Spirit, is already present and abiding in us. We should reflect on how we are called to examine the ways the Lord is present in our lives. Where can we see and welcome him? Where do we still not want to let him in? Where are we afraid to let Christ dwell within us and transform our living? Lord gives us the gift of Easter joy so that our neighbors will recognize that we do nothing on our own, but rather are acting in the faith of Christ and the Church.

RE: DIRECTIVES & GUIDANCE IN PREPARATION FOR THE REOPENING OF CHURCHES AND THE RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASSES

"Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

The following directives are given to provide guidance on how to prepare for the reopening of our churches for public Masses and other liturgies or devotions. Pastors, administrators and staff are obliged to follow these directives as well as to continue enforcing all legitimate state requirements with regard the safety and health of our parishioners and those whom we may encounter. This will assure consistent practice throughout our diocese. Moreover, this makes clear that any variation from normal liturgical practice will be temporary.

These are not normal times and our number one priority is the health and safety as well as the spiritual care of our parishioners, volunteers and staff. We do understand that many are eager to return to Mass in our churches, however we need to take into consideration those most vulnerable members of our communities, including the elderly and those with chronic illnesses. The continuation of live-streamed Masses is highly recommended as a benefit to those who are homebound, sick, or otherwise vulnerable.

Bishop Larry Silva will be extending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday through June 30, 2020 for all the faithful. Thus, when our churches are open for Mass, no one is obliged to attend until further notice. Those who are symptomatic or who have been exposed to another person with the virus are not permitted to attend church services until they are cleared by their doctor. Those at risk because of an underlying health issue are strongly encouraged to avoid the risk of attending public celebrations of the Mass.

Understandably, everyone is anxious to return to normalcy. But the threat of the coronavirus is still very much with us. Social distancing, the wearing of masks (with the exception of very small children) and increased cleaning procedures will be important at this time. Pastors and staff need to start planning and acquiring enough supplies for their parishes.

These DIRECTIVES are items that should be followed for the safe celebration of Mass. Each venue, however, will need to make prudential decisions about its particulars, as long as the general principles of social distancing and minimization of contact are intact.

GUIDANCE FROM THE CHURCH

WHAT WE CAN DO AS GOD'S FAITHFUL: During the COVID-19 Pandemic Crisis

1> Keep the Lord's Day holy by participating in the live streaming or telecast of the Mass in the EWTN TV channel or other stations in the comfort of your living room. Pray the *Prayer for Spiritual Communion* (printed below) when it's time for Holy Communion. For live-streaming log in to: *Facebook.com/Diocese-of-Honolulu-Evangelization-TaskForce*.

2> Pray individually or as a family at home your favorite novenas or devotions such as the Holy Rosary, Chaplet of the Divine Mercy, or Novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

3> Reflect on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord thru the Stations of the Cross.

4> Go to *myParish* app and say the prayers or read the Scripture readings of the day's liturgy and other spiritual menu found in there. You can also read our Parish Bulletin there and the Hawaii Catholic herald. There are also current church news to keep yourself abreast with what's happening in the Catholic world. To download *myParish* app – Text "app" then 88202, then scroll the list of parishes to "Our Lady of the Mount".

5> Pray the *Prayer for Deliverance from the Coronavirus* (printed below) composed by Bishop Larry Silva and the other relevant prayers.

* SPIRITUAL COMMUNION *

St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embrace him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion. With the absence of public Masses in the Diocese of Honolulu, the opportunity for receiving spiritual communion is particularly appropriate.

Spiritual communion only requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the sacrament and a turning to Jesus with the heart. To help focus a proper intention, recitation of a prayer is suggested. One of the most popular is that composed by St. Alphonsus Liquori below:



Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You, Amen.

Subject: Updated General Directives and Liturgical Guidelines Due to the COVID-19 (Update #5)

Peace be with you!

"How long, O LORD?" (Psalm 13:1) These words, which we find in several places in the Scriptures are the words we cry out as we experience the effects of this global coronavirus pandemic. We long to physically encounter the Lord in the Eucharist and to gather once again with the other members of the Body of Christ to celebrate the sacraments and to witness the full initiation of the Elect in our diocese. It is a lament, but also a prayer of hope that the terrible situation we are in will soon end with the Lord's healing touch.

I am well aware of the great pain that many are experiencing because we cannot yet safely gather for the celebration of the Eucharist. I have been doing extensive consultations and research on how we can safely reopen our churches for Masses, but the matter is not as simple as some suggest. As you know, Governor Ige has extended the order of stay-at-home lockdown until May 31 to continue the mitigation of the effects of the virus and stop its spread. After consultation with my staff and the Presbyteral Council, I am extending the directives promulgated in my last memorandum dated March 27, 2020. The extension of the Directives will go into effect immediately and until May 31, 2020. Therefore, I am dispensing all Catholics in the Diocese of Honolulu from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass through May 31, 2020.

We are working on various scenarios that might enable us to have Masses with limited numbers of people in the near future. As soon as the plan is ready, we will present it to our government officials for their concurrence. In the meantime, we ask everyone for your patience and understanding as we are trying our best to bring our parishioners back to our churches.

The following directives are in force through May 31, 2020:

Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions are to be closed to the public through May 31, 2020 (inclusive), or until further notice.

All liturgical celebrations (e.g. Confirmation/First Holy Communion) from now through May 31 are canceled. The Office of the Vicar General will contact parishes which need to reschedule once the "all clear" is indicated by the civil authorities.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday is dispensed through May 31, 2020. [Priests are to continue the celebration of private Masses, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, especially for the intentions of their people. We encourage parish priests to continue the live-stream of their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information.]

Parishes are invited to inform their parishioners of opportunities to view the Mass and other services via livestream or the parish's Facebook. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org. The faithful are encouraged to keep the Lord's Day holy. Some ways to do this include: reading the Scriptures of the day, especially

Some ways to do this include: reading the Scriptures of the day, especially the Gospels, praying with your families, and to joining yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. For more information and resources, please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.

Priests are reminded that they can still hear confessions by appointment only. Please observe good spacing between the penitent and priest, while at the same time observing absolute privacy for the penitent. Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. General absolution is not permitted, because it presumes a gathering of people.

The Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum will only be administered, if possible, in situations where there is the danger of death. Please consult your parish priest, who will be given instructions on when and how to celebrate these sacraments during this time in which great prudence is needed for the safety and well-being of all.

Ăll funerals, weddings and baptisms for the month of May should be postponed until further notice. If desired by the family, a memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date.

Liturgies at which Bishop Larry Silva will preside will be private, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, but will be live-streamed for all to see at www.hictv.com or https://www.facebook.com/HonoluluCathedralBasilica.

Mass for the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord: May 24, 9:00 a.m.

Mass for Pentecost Sunday: May 31, 9:00 a.m.

❖REPAIR & MAINTENANCE

***RENOVATION OF THE CONVENT — We are glad and grateful to the Lord for the completion of the 3-phased renovation of the convent under the supervision of *Joyce Oliveira*, the chair of the *Parish Planning & Building Committee (PPBC)*, and of the project manager, *Roger Isidro*. All labor and material costs were duly defrayed with no debt incurred. Thanks to the faithful stewardship of parishioners and the productive fundraising spearheaded by *Becky Jandoc* and her *Finance and Fundraiser ad hoc committees*. *Bishop Larry Silva* will come to bless it as the new *Pastoral Center*.

The remaining minor jobs on plumbing, electrical and carpentry are handled by volunteers. *Adriano Daligcon* and *Kalolo Tuihalafatai* prepped the works on plumbing and electrical installation. *Roger Isidro* continues to maintain the structures with repainting and upgrading deteriorating fixtures. Together with *Rudy Fiesta*, they painted the entrance porches of the church and convent after doing the same on the concrete staircases to the back and side entrances of the convent. Meanwhile, *Daniel Kang*, an RCIA catechumen who first volunteered and eventually hired continues working on the upgrading of plumbing and electrical fixtures under the supervision of *Roger Isidro*. *Aida Isidro* assists them by bringing food for the workers. She also provided a new stand fan for use in the Center. On their part, the ladies which include *Becky DeCorte*, *Joyce Oliveira*, *Becky Jandoc & Tita Calizar* are eyeing the best way to restore order inside the renovated convent as well as give a fresh look with additional carpentry works and new sets of furniture in the *Kokua Ministry* office and display rooms.

*CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – In the midst of the pandemic crisis when there are no public services in church, some faithful parishioners continue to come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the livestreamed and private celebrations. They clean the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. We do appreciate Marivic Palting, Bella Miranda, Doi Facuri, Gloria Rodrigues and Fran Kovaloff for their dedication and devotion.

For the Easter and baptismal fountain, the father and son tandem of *Jun & Gene Cortez* did a wonderful creation. It will be on display throughout the Easter season.

*LITURGY - The live-streamed Mass every Sunday is ably produced by Dominic Olaso, head-servant of the Diocesan Evangelization Task Force. It is made more solemn and lively with the music of Mary Ann Llamedo assisted by the cantor and lector, Gloria Rodrigues. The sacristans, Bella Miranda and Doi Facuri prepare the daily Mass and clean up afterwards. They all faithfully provide their respective services during the shutdown lightening the effect of the covid-19 pandemic.

*GARDENING - As the world continues to lie low in this crisis, some people don't want to remain idle. Aside from attending to their personal and family concerns they come to help with the upkeep of the church grounds. Clemente Fontanilla mows the grasses; the couple tandem of Lito and Lia Centino planted new plants by the side of the Hall and Rectory while Eddie Lucero continues to keep the hibiscus blooming with flowers with his regular watering.






KOKUA OFFICE & PANTRY IS CLOSED
