

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading Fifth Sunday of Easter

First Reading Responsorial Psalm
Acts of the Apostles Psalm 23:1-6

6:1-7

Second Reading Gospel
1 Peter 2:4-9 John 14:1-12

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles: 2:14, 36-41

In this Reading, Peter remains focused on what God has done in the Resurrection of Jesus. For Peter the Crucifixion of Jesus did not bring about God's curse, as Jews believed about anyone who "hangs on a tree." Rather, the crucified Jesus brought the complete opposite: God's blessing, in the Resurrection.

Second Reading: 1 Peter: 2:20-25

In this Reading, Peter tells his Gentile audience: "You had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls." Unlike the Jews, the Gentiles did not have the Mosaic Law or the historic record of election from God. Gentiles lacked these privileges that defined the Jewish identity. But Peter urged the Gentiles to see that all of this changed with the suffering, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. Christ's suffering has brought healing to the community—healing from all that had separated Jew from Gentile. In Jesus, the Gentiles have found the shepherd's footsteps to follow.

Gospel: John 10:1-10

Today's Gospel reading presents one of Jesus' more elaborate discussions of the sheep-shepherd metaphor. Here Jesus extends the image of himself as shepherd, stating, "I am the gate for the sheep." In this Gospel, Jesus is not only the shepherd leading the sheep to the heavenly Father; he is also the gate through which the sheep pass to encounter the Father. Like the many who followed Jesus in his lifetime, and the thousands who were baptized in his name following Peter's speech, we are the sheep today who hear and follow the voice of our shepherd.

* SPIRITUAL COMMUNION *

St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy sacrament and lovingly embrace him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion. With the absence of public Masses in the Diocese of Honolulu, the opportunity for receiving spiritual communion is particularly appropriate.

Spiritual communion only requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the sacrament and a turning to Jesus with the heart. To help focus a proper intention, recitation of a prayer is suggested. One of the most popular is that composed by St. Alphonsus Liquori below:



Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Subject: Updated General Directives and Liturgical Guidelines Due to the COVID-19 (Update #5)

Peace be with you!

"How long, O LORD?" (Psalm 13:1) These words, which we find in several places in the Scriptures are the words we cry out as we experience the effects of this global coronavirus pandemic. We long to physically encounter the Lord in the Eucharist and to gather once again with the other members of the Body of Christ to celebrate the sacraments and to witness the full initiation of the Elect in our diocese. It is a lament, but also a prayer of hope that the terrible situation we are in will soon end with the Lord's healing touch.

I am well aware of the great pain that many are experiencing because we cannot yet safely gather for the celebration of the Eucharist. I have been doing extensive consultations and research on how we can safely reopen our churches for Masses, but the matter is not as simple as some suggest. As you know, Governor Ige has extended the order of stay-at-home lockdown until May 31 to continue the mitigation of the effects of the virus and stop its spread. After consultation with my staff and the Presbyteral Council, I am extending the directives promulgated in my last memorandum dated March 27, 2020. The extension of the Directives will go into effect immediately and until May 31, 2020. Therefore, I am dispensing all Catholics in the Diocese of Honolulu from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass through May 31, 2020.

We are working on various scenarios that might enable us to have Masses with limited numbers of people in the near future. As soon as the plan is ready, we will present it to our government officials for their concurrence. In the meantime, we ask everyone for your patience and understanding as we are trying our best to bring our parishioners back to our churches.

The following directives are in force through May 31, 2020:

Parish churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions are to be closed to the public through May 31, 2020 (inclusive), or until further notice.

All liturgical celebrations (e.g. Confirmation/First Holy Communion) from now through May 31 are canceled. The Office of the Vicar General will contact parishes which need to reschedule once the "all clear" is indicated by the civil authorities.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday is dispensed through May 31, 2020. [Priests are to continue the celebration of private Masses, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, especially for the intentions of their people. We encourage parish priests to continue the live-stream of their liturgies to their parishioners via social media platforms and to communicate to them the times of these services and log-in information.]

Parishes are invited to inform their parishioners of opportunities to view the Mass and other services via livestream or the parish's Facebook. Daily and Sunday Mass are currently being livestreamed from various parishes in our diocese. For a comprehensive and updated list please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.

The faithful are encouraged to keep the Lord's Day holy. Some ways to do this include: reading the Scriptures of the day, especially the Gospels, praying with your families, and to joining yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. For more information and resources, please visit our website at www.catholichawaii.org.

Priests are reminded that they can still hear confessions by appointment only. Please observe good spacing between the penitent and priest, while at the same time observing absolute privacy for the penitent. Confessions by phone or via the internet are not permitted. General absolution is not permitted, because it presumes a gathering of people.

The Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum will only be administered, if possible, in situations where there is the danger of death. Please consult your parish priest, who will be given instructions on when and how to celebrate these sacraments during this time in which great prudence is needed for the safety and well-being of all.

All funerals, weddings and baptisms for the month of May should be postponed until further notice. If desired by the family, a memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date.

Liturgies at which Bishop Larry Silva will preside will be private, with only the liturgical ministers necessary, but will be live-streamed for all to see at www.hictv.com or https://www.facebook.com/HonoluluCathedralBasilica.

Mass for Fourth Sunday of Easter: May 3, 9:00 a.m. Mass for Fifth Sunday of Easter: May 10, 9:00 a.m.

Mass for the Sixth Sunday of Easter: May 17, 9:00 a.m.

Mass for the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord: May 24, 9:00 a.m.

Mass for Pentecost Sunday: May 31, 9:00 a.m.

The COVID-19 virus forces us and our parishioners to grapple with a difficult reality. Amid self-isolation and "stay-athome" orders, an increasing number of people are experiencing sickness and death separated from other people. Liturgical Press (Collegeville, MN) has posted more free resources in their website that relate to healing and grief. *Praying Together, Praying Apart*: *At-Home Prayers for Times of Healing, Illness, and Death* is a new resource available for free download in their website and at the links below for praying in times of healing, illness and death. I also attached it for your convenience. A free Spanish language edition of this resource is coming shortly as well on this page: https://offers.litpress.org/coronavirus-response-to-customers. Please consider sharing this on your own parish websites for your community's use.

The attached provides the following:

Part I: <u>Prayers of Comfort, Hope, and Healing</u>: These texts can be prayed by individuals, families, or other groups.

Part II: <u>Lucernarium for Healing</u>: Lucernarium, or "service of light," grows out of the tradition in the early church of lighting lamps for evening prayer. This celebration of light rejoices in Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, the Light no darkness can overcome.

Part III: **Rosary for Healing with Luke the Evangelist**: The rosary is a prayer pathway that invites us to meditate on significant events in Jesus' life. The Rosary for Healing with Luke the Evangelist focuses on the healing mission and ministry of Jesus Christ, allowing us to enter more fully into the healing experiences within Luke's Gospel. Begin each decade by reading the corresponding Scripture passage.

Part IV: <u>At-Home Service of Prayer when Someone Has Died</u>: One of the realities of social distancing is the inability to gather as a community for wakes, funerals, and other memorial services when someone has died. This service of prayer is intended to give people a way to pray in their own homes as they grieve the loss of a loved one. I hope this is helpful!


