
WELCOME BACK TO GOD'S HOUSE

Pastor's Corner

Next Sunday's Reading The Most Holy Trinity

First Reading Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9



Responsorial Psalm Daniel 3:52-55

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Gospel John 3:16-18

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

This Reading narrates the initial events associated with the descent of the Holy Spirit onto the Apostles. Luke foreshadowed this with the words of John the Baptist: "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming...He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." The association of the image of fire with the Holy is significant. In the Old Testament, fire symbolizes God's presence in the covenant at Mount Sinai. In the New Testament, fire symbolizes the transformative power of the Holy Spirit. As the fire came to rest on the Apostles, "they were all filled with the Holy Spirit," transforming them and enabling them to proclaim the resurrected Christ to the large crowds gathered in Jerusalem.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:7, 12-13

In this Second Reading, we hear from Paul how the presence of the Holy Spirit brought the gift of faith and unity to the newborn Church. Paul tells the Christian community in Corinth that no one professes in faith that "Jesus is Lord" without the Holy Spirit. It is this common profession of faith that unites and benefits this community: "To each individual the manifestation of the Sprit is given for some benefit."

Gospel: John 20:19-23

In the Gospel Reading from John, we hear how Jesus, before Pentecost Sunday, gave the disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The resurrected Christ "came and stood in their midst" and spoke to them, saying, "Peace be with you." Then Jesus breathed on them, saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." From the beginning, the peace of the community was linked to the presence of the Holy Spirit.

*The directive from the Bishop to open up the churches on May 30/31 for public worship comes in conjunction with the order of the local authorities. The parishes have received guidance from the Diocese to prepare our churches for the return to normal services thru disinfecting and sanitizing. The faithful are still expected to abide by the 6-feet distancing, face covering and avoiding crowded gatherings. The dispensation for not attending Mass in church for fear of infecting others or contracting the virus is extended up to June 30 or until further notice.

On the Feast of Pentecost this Sunday, May 31, we still have the live-streamed Mass at 9:00am. The Bishop is urging us to participate in the televised or livestreamed Mass to fulfill our obligation if we cannot go to Church yet. There are also prescribed prayers that we can use individually or as a family. We need to keep connected with our Almighty God who can put an end to this pandemic and allow us to return unscathed to our normal lives. Let us stay safe, healthy and blessed and continue to pray for one another and for the whole world.

To the Catholic Faithful of Hawaii

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Peace be with you!

Those are the words of the risen Jesus as he breathed out the Holy Spirit upon his Apostles, sending them out in the power of the Spirit to proclaim that He is risen from the dead, and is always with us. Just as the Apostles encountered Jesus physically in the Upper Room on the night of the Resurrection, we encounter him physically in the Holy Eucharist. Now that it has been deemed safe for us to gather again in our churches to physically encounter the risen Lord in Holy Communion, we rejoice that the Spirit will open the way for us once again.

Our gathering for the Eucharist after so long a time without being able to celebrate together, while it will be a joyful event, will also have restrictions, because we want to be sure that all who attend are kept as safe as possible from infection. After consulting with the Priests' Council, it was decided that, while the parishes are not ready to open this coming weekend, we will open for public worship the weekend of May 30/31, which is Pentecost Sunday. Your pastors will be making final preparations this week to assure that we can gather as safe as possible.

While each parish will have somewhat different ways of implementing the Guidelines presented below, we ask your patience and cooperation. Yes, these are bothersome requirements, but they are necessary for the continuing health and safety of all during this global pandemic.

Be assured of my prayers for all of you as we come together to worship our Heavenly Father, to celebrate the presence of the Risen Lord, and to allow him to rekindle in us the fire of the Holy Spirit!

RE: GUIDELINES FROM BISHOP LARRY SILVA, BISHOP OF HONOLULU, FOR THE REOPENING OF CATHOLIC CHURCHES IN HAWAII DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

REGARDING PUBLIC MASSES:

- 1. Catholic churches, missions, chapels and oratories in Hawaii will **reopen for public worship the weekend of May** 30/31, Pentecost Sunday. During this coming week, parishes and hospitality ministers will be prepared to assist people in following these Guidelines.
- 2. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is extended through June 30, 2020. This will allow those who are not comfortable attending Mass at this time to stay away with a clear conscience. Masses will continue to be live-streamed, at least from some locations. (OLM Church will continue livestreaming of the Mass on Pentecost Sunday, May 31, at 9:00 AM). Before June 30, we will evaluate whether or not to extend the dispensation longer.
- **3**. As an act of charity, anyone who is sick, who is particularly vulnerable to infection, or is in a high-risk group should not attend Mass at this time.
- **4**. Some (though not all) parishes may be prepared to offer weekday Masses as soon as May 25. (OLM Church is open to the public for weekday Masses (Monday-Friday) at 7:00 AM starting May 25).
- **5**. All who attend Mass must maintain proper social distancing. Sitting together may be allowed for parents and small children of the same household.
- **6**. The social distancing protocol will limit the seating capacity and available spaces in the church. Each parish will have a way of limiting the number of people who attend each Mass, and we ask your patience and cooperation. (OLM Church has prepared the adjacent Parish Hall for more seating spaces so that hopefully nobody would be turned away from attending the Mass.
- 7. Parishes are free to use a lanai area adjacent to the church or to move Mass from the church to a larger gathering space (such as a parish hall or school gym), as long as the Mass can be seen and heard and proper social distancing is maintained. 8. The Mass schedule of each parish may be different from its normal Mass schedule. This is so because time will be needed to clean and sanitize the church between Masses, and dismissal will be by rows, so that people can maintain social distancing as they exit, so this may necessitate a greater amount of time between Masses. (For a trial run, OLM Church will have only one Mass on Sunday at 9:00 AM to see how many will actually come. Depending on the outcome, OLM will continue with this schedule or hold two Masses at 7:00 AM & 9:00 AM. With the parish hall as possible venue for more seating).
- **9**. Masks or face coverings will be worn by all who attend Mass. The only exceptions will be the priest-celebrant, while he is speaking, and the lectors and cantors, while they are reading or singing. Particular care should be taken to maintain social distancing for cantors, since the projection of the voice can carry particulates a longer distance.
- 10. Baptismal fonts and holy water fonts will be emptied.
- 11. Hymnals, missalettes and other worship material will be removed from the church before Mass. (At OLM hymns and responses at Mass will be projected on the screen). Parishioners are free to bring their own missals with them, if desired.
- **12**. The collection will be taken only with a long-poled basket (whose handles should be sanitized before and after use); the collected offerings will be brought to the front of the altar by one Hospitality Minister.
- **13**. The normal presentation of the gifts of bread and wine will not take place, but these elements will be brought to the altar from the credence table.

- **14**. There will be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or the Sign of Peace. A bow, a smile, or a wave will serve as a true sign of peace to one's neighbor.
- **15**. For Holy Communion, all ministers of Holy Communion will wear masks. Those receiving Communion will be ushered row by row so that a six-foot distance will be maintained at all times. Just before arriving at the Communion station, the communicant will remove the mask, receive Communion reverently, then immediately replace the mask.
- **16**. Communion on the hand (one hand held open above the other) is encouraged for the greater health and safety of all, though Communion on the tongue is not prohibited. The Precious Blood will only be taken by the priest.
- 17. All ministers of Holy Communion, including the clergy, will sanitize their hands immediately before distributing Communion and immediately after doing so. (A small table or stand may be placed next to each Communion station, so that if a minister feels his or her hands may have been contaminated, the paten/ciborium can be placed on the table momentarily while the minister sanitizes his or her hands.)
- **18**. People should leave the church according to the directives maintaining social distancing during the leave-taking. Congregating in the parking lot or elsewhere is discouraged, unless social distancing is maintained.
- 19. No social gathering (e.g. coffee and donuts) may be held after Mass.
- 20. Immediately after Mass the church will be sanitized according to the protocol adopted by the parish.

OTHER SACRAMENTS AND CHURCH MEETINGS

- **21**. Priests may hear confessions, as long as they do so with both priest and penitent taking proper precautions, including social distancing and wearing masks.
- **22**. Priests, deacons and other duly commissioned extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who are not at high risk of infection themselves -- may take Communion to the homebound, always exercising proper hygiene procedures and wearing masks.
- 23. Funerals, weddings, and Baptisms may take place according to the Guidelines above for the celebration of Mass. Funerals at this time may not include visitation times, only the Vigil for the Deceased, the Funeral Mass, and the Committal. Baptisms should be done in such a way that the same water is not poured on more than one person or stored in the font after it is used, thereby eliminating Baptism by immersion at this time.
- **24**. Pastors will decide when to celebrate the sacraments of Initiation for the Elect who normally would have been initiated at the Easter Vigil.
- 25. Since there is a large backlog of Confirmations/First Communions, Bishop Silva will give special delegation to all priests to confer the sacrament of Confirmation on the members of their respective parishes, extending from May 30 to December 31, 2020. The pastor will decide when to celebrate Confirmation/First Communion and may do so at several Masses in order to maintain proper social distancing. If a pastor desires the Bishop to confer these sacraments, he should make arrangements with the Office of the Bishop, and the Bishop will try to accommodate all requests, either personally or with the help of the Vicar General.
- **26**. Churches may now remain open during the day for private prayer at the discretion of the pastor and observing whatever guidelines he may establish.
- **27**. In-person church meetings may resume, IF proper social distancing and the wearing of masks is observed. Otherwise, meetings should continue to be conducted virtually.

***RENOVATION OF THE CONVENT — We are glad and grateful to the Lord for the completion of the 3-phased renovation of the convent under the supervision of *Joyce Oliveira*, the chair of the *Parish Planning & Building Committee (PPBC)*, and of the project manager, *Roger Isidro*. All labor and material costs were duly defrayed with no debt incurred. Thanks to the faithful stewardship of parishioners and the productive fundraising spearheaded by *Becky Jandoc* and her *Finance and Fundraiser ad hoc committees*. *Bishop Larry Silva* will come to bless it as the new *Pastoral Center*.

The remaining minor jobs on plumbing, electrical and carpentry are handled by volunteers. *Roger Isidro* continues to maintain the structures with repainting and upgrading deteriorating fixtures. Together with *Rudy Fiesta*, they painted the entrance porches of the church and convent after doing the same on the concrete staircases to the back and side entrances of the convent. Meanwhile, *Daniel Kang*, an RCIA catechumen who first volunteered and eventually hired continues working on the upgrading of plumbing and electrical fixtures under the supervision of *Roger Isidro*. Hopefully the work will be completed as soon as the sensor lights and video cameras around the compound will be installed. *Aida Isidro* assisted by bringing food for the workers and provided a new stand fan for use in the Center. On their part, the ladies which include *Becky DeCorte*, *Joyce Oliveira*, *Becky Jandoc & Tita Calizar* are eyeing the best way to restore order inside the renovated convent as well as give a fresh look with additional carpentry works and new sets of furniture in the *Kokua Ministry* office and display rooms. *Tom & Becky DeCorte's grandsons – Jordan*, *Nainoa & Elijah* also stepped up to help in cleaning up and putting into place some furniture of the Kokua Ministry. They are certainly appreciated.

*CHURCH ENVIRONMENT – In the midst of the pandemic crisis when there are no public services in church, some faithful parishioners continue to come every Saturday to prepare the Church for the livestreamed and private celebrations. They clean the altar with new linens, decorate the sanctuary with flowers, put up the seasonal banners and other tasks. They set up the proper worship environments and make our celebrations dignified and meaningful. In compliance with the Diocese advisory they marked the seating in the pews and communion line for 6-ft distancing as well as empty the holy water fonts and disinfect the church. We do appreciate Marivic Palting, Bella Miranda, Doi Facuri, Gloria Rodrigues and Fran Kovaloff for their dedication and devotion.

The Easter and baptismal fountain put up by the father and son tandem of *Jun & Gene Cortez* will be dismantled at the conclusion of the Easter season this Sunday.

*LITURGY - The live-streamed Masses for the past 10 Sundays were shot and produced by Dominic Olaso, head-servant of the Diocesan Evangelization Task Force (DETF). He is going back to serve in the parish of St. Pius XII in Manoa. The livestreaming of OLM Sunday Mass at 9:00am will continue via the OLM Facebook account and thru the kind services of the Llamedo family. There is also a wi-fi hook-up to the parish hall in case of an overflow in the church. Here the faithful can attend the Mass and receive Holy Communion from there. This is made possible thru the high-tech know-how of Jun Cortez and Fidel Flores. We thank Mary Ann Llamedo for providing solemn music accompaniment. All of them faithfully provided their respective services during the shutdown lightening the effect of the covid-19 pandemic and continue to do so at the re-opening of our church.

*GARDENING - As the world continues to lie low in this crisis, some people don't want to remain idle. Aside from attending to their personal and family concerns they come to help with the upkeep of the church grounds. Clemente Fontanilla mows the grasses; the couple tandem of Lito and Lia Centino planted new plants by the side of the Hall and Rectory while Eddie Lucero and Jun Flores continue to keep the yellow hibiscus blooming with flowers thru regular pruning and watering.

REPAIR & MAINTENANCE






