

"O God, let all the nations praise you!" Psalm 67:4



First Reading: Isaiah 56:1, 6-7

In today's Reading, outsiders play a role in the revelation of both God's love for all peoples and his desire to live in relationship with them. Since conquerors mixed subjugated peoples to ensure control and discourage rebellion, God's people find themselves living closely with foreigners. When some of these ask to join their religion, the prophet welcomes them, a decision that actualizes the teaching of his predecessor, First Isaiah, that the Lord reigns over all nations. Those who would be God's people must act justly, always do the right thing, minister to the Lord and so prepare themselves for the justice and deliverance of the Lord that will soon be revealed.

Second Reading: Romans 11:13-15, 29-32

In this Reading, Paul writes to Gentile Christians who live roughly five hundred years after the Jews and Gentiles addressed in the first reading. In this section of his letter he explains that, since Israel rejected God's messiah or Christ, the promises made to them are extended to all. Paul suggests that God reaches out to the Gentiles to make Israel jealous in the hope of bringing them back. All the promises that God made to the Jews remain in effect because divine charisms and grace are "irrevocable."

Gospel: Matthew 15:21-28

In this Gospel, another Gentile, a Canaanite woman whose daughter is tormented by a demon, comes looking for Jesus. The woman's thricerepeated address of Jesus as "Lord" demonstrates her faith in him. The words of her initial plea, "Have pity or mercy on me, Lord" echo in the penitential rite of the Mass ("eleieson, Kyrie"). Jesus says nothing as she keeps calling out to him. He seems uneasy about spending time and energy on this outsider. Finally, the woman challenges Jesus that even dogs eat the scraps from the table of their Lords. Her unwavering faith sways Jesus and gives in to do her will.



Saint Damien, pray for us! * Saint Marianne, pray for us!


A STEWARDSHIP PRAYER FOR OUR PARISH FAMILY

For your information, by law a positive COVID-19 test will trigger the physician/lab informing the DOH of the test results. The DOH will then assign a "contact tracer" to the case who will work with the affected individual to identify any other individuals or groups who may have been exposed. The DOH will communicate directly to those individuals or groups. If one of those groups or individuals is part of our workplace ministry or congregation, the parish or school may be notified and the DOH will work with us (pastor, principal and Diocese) to advise on next steps. Do not assume you need to immediately inform your community or congregation and do not communicate anything unless approved by the Diocese.

Also, keeping track of individuals that attend specific Masses is a best practice to assist with contact tracing in the case of a positive COVID-19 test, but is not required by law.

Our best defense against the spread of COVID-19 is to continue to follow our safe practices. We must not become complacent in our efforts of cleaning and ensuring safety and health by following previous guidelines issued by the CDC and the Diocese. Please continue to enforce the following:

Stay home if you are sick

It is critical that employees, volunteers or parishioners do not come to church or school property while they are experiencing respiratory symptoms such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills or fatigue.

Individual who becomes sick at Mass, during ministry or work

If someone becomes sick while at Mass, ministry or work and needs immediate medical assistance, call 911. Sick individuals who are able to safely walk should be isolated in a designated room away from others. Inform adults that you would like to send them home and encourage them to consult a physician. Do not leave minors unattended. Contact the parent to arrange for transportation. Also, please follow these steps:

*If they have personal items that need to be collected (purse, etc.) retrieve it for them.

*Ask where they have been on property (bathrooms, offices, church, sacristy, etc) send them home immediately and encourage them to consult their doctor.

*Disinfect any areas thoroughly after the individual has left.

*Contact *Dara Perreira* at 808-342-3241 to communicate the situation.

*Do not allow that person back at Mass, ministry or work unless they have a clearance from a doctor or if they have quarantined for 14 days. (The Diocese or DOH will provide guidance on this as well as whether or not work or Mass is suspended temporarily).

Disinfecting surfaces regularly

CDC guidelines state that regular disinfection of high touch surfaces such as doorknobs, bathrooms, computers, faucets, chairs and other surfaces where COVID-19 can potentially survive can greatly reduce the chances of spread. Ensure proper cleaning before and after Masses as well as before, during and at the completion of the workday in the workplace. Please pay special attention to sinks, coffee machines and the refrigerator in the workplace.

Masks are mandatory

According to the State, cloth face coverings must be "worn at all times by employees and public when outside the home". Cloth face coverings are meant to stop the wearer from spreading respiratory droplets. If someone does not wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth, you may nicely ask them to leave and to please return when they are wearing one.

Meetings and Gatherings (outside of 1 times)

Ensure that social distancing is taking place at all times. Limit gatherings and meetings and utilize meeting technology where possible.

General Hygiene

Please wash your hands frequently and thoroughly per CDC guidelines. Ensure that enough PPE including soap and hand sanitizer is provided.

No Communal Food

Please refrain from sharing bowls of candy and various other food. Please do not encourage workplace or parish celebrations, especially with food. Employees should take home or throw away food daily.

150th PARISH ANNIVERSARY NEWS

CELEBRATING OLM PARISH JUBILEE

One century and fifty years have passed since Our Lady of the Mount was started as a mission station and grew up further as a full-fledged parish. It has certainly gone a long way. From a simple wooden-frame structure nestled inside Kalihi Valley it has evolved into an imposing landmark amidst a diverse residential community. From the missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mary to the Diocesan priests, the parishioners have been ministered pastorally and spiritually who in turn gave their welcome and support. OLM is what it is now because of the previous generations who lived and passed on their dynamic and committed faith. We have been blessed not only to receive their rich legacy but feel more blessed to be able to continue, enhance and expand this legacy with our brand of faith and awakened stewardship. This calls for a celebration. We in this generation are fortunate and blessed indeed to see this milestone. We feel proud and triumphant and so we come together to celebrate and renew our faith in grateful stewardship which is the general theme of our grand event.

Despite the brewing pandemic crisis brought about by covid-19 that disrupted our plans to invite the former Pastors, associate or resident priests and Religious or their representatives and hold more festive activities like an ethnic-cultural event, youth & young adult worship rally and jam session, vocation promotion, mission-evangelization retreat and a grand testimonial banquet, we are blessed to have our chief shepherd *Bishop Larry Silva* coming and presiding at the solemn Anniversary Mass on <u>August 19, Sunday</u>. He will also officiate the blessing and inauguration of the Pastoral Center which used to be the Religious Sisters' convent and now refurbished like new. Our immediate preparation consists of a nine-day novena devotion starting on August 7. On <u>August 15, Saturday</u>, there will be a special Marian devotion at 12:00 noon to honor her on the feast of her Assumption. This happens to be our Patroness feast day so let us come together to celebrate and offer her our veneration and gratitude for her motherly protection and invoke once again her graces and favors for our parish and the whole world.

With heartfelt gratitude, we thank all who helped in making our celebration meaningful and successful. There are always generous parishioners who readily offer their assistance, both their physical services and financial resources, without asking and we could only invoke God's blessings upon them.

Members of the Santo Nino Visayan Ministry, Jun & Nida Flores, Cathy Villanueva, Joe & Fe Go, Eddie & Cita Lucero, hang festive buntings and streamers along the buildings within the church compound. Fe Go & Catechists worked on the art and graphics for the Welcome signs and boards. Fran Kovaloff and Arlene Orsino designed the gallery along the corridor and glued the nameplate for each room. They also arranged the collage of photos on the pictorial board and other historical memorabilia for display. Roger Isidro fixed the frames and markers for hanging. Becky Jandoc ordered the signage for the Center while Jenny Jandoc ordered the bentos for take-home by the people. Moses & Christina Andres offered to secure the leis for the bishop and clergy and ti leaf cordon for the cutting of the ribbon in the blessing of the Pastoral Center.

Marc Ulep and his boys led the cleaning of the new slide glass windows. Bella Miranda, Gloria Rodrigues, Corazón Orcino, Adoracion Padilla, Nellie Puzon, Doi Facuri, Steve Tapat, Fran Kovaloff and Lolito Dullin showed up to spruce up and decorate the church. hall and new Pastoral Center.

PASTORAL CENTER

After the last Sacred Heart Parish priest left in 1963, *Fr. Thomas Miyashiro* was assigned as the first diocesan Pastor of OLM. Among his accomplishments was the construction of the Convent which housed the *Religious Sisters of the Holy Family Congregation*. Other religious groups like the *Maryknoll Sisters* and *St. Paul de Chartres* came to live part-time. Then when the Religious were gone the building started to be used for varied pastoral activities such as the Sunday Catechesis, Youth meetings, distribution of food and household items by the Kokua and Outreach Ministry. It was also used for meetings by the Knights of Columbus, for choir practices and storage for all kinds of donations from people. In view of its deteriorating physical condition and of the forthcoming big event of the 150th Parish Anniversary the pastor

and parish leaders decided to embark on a major renovation. The parishioners were duly informed about the project and fundraising events were held. The major renovation jobs were done phase by phase. The new flooring, roofing, glass slide windows, painting, plumbing, electrical and carpentry works were done as the funds were raised and made available. And thank God, through the leaders' determination and parishioners' unstinting support the refurbishing was completed and now ready for the Parish Anniversary lift-off. New furnishings and accessories include AC units, faucets, lavatories, doorknobs, window shades, curtains, shelves, kitchen and dining wares, tower fans, white boards and light bulbs. All the rooms including the chapel, classrooms, restrooms, storage rooms were fixed, There are now a fully transformed Kokua Ministry display room with an office and fitting room, Knights of Columbus room, oratory, lounge, meeting room for parish youth, ministries, committees, and organizations. We in the present generation are mighty proud to designate it as the commemorative landmark of the parish jubilee milestone and the heartfelt symbol of our faithful steward-ship that we can pass on to the next generations.

After the blessing, there will be an open-house where everyone is invited to have a look and see of this wonderful product of joyful and faithful stewardship. Don't forget your take home bento when you leave.

The needed repairs were completed with the upgrading of the plumbing and electrical fixtures and installation of the sensor lights around the compound under the supervision of *Roger Isidro. Adriano Daligcon* did his part of replacing and activating fluorescent lights by the candle stands inside the church and fixing the automatic timer for the night lights around the church. *Roger & Adriano* fixed the electrical outlets for appliances and installed the new window shades and curtains furnished by *Tita Calizar* and *Becky Jandoc. Becky & Tita* also did the purchasing of white boards and air fans for the classrooms and completed the needed wares for the kitchenette. *Fran Kovaloff* and *Arlene Orsino* ordered and hung the display pictures and put the signage for each room. The father and son tandem of *Tony* and *Nickolus Peterson* lifted and moved the heavy table and pew from the ground to the second floor.

The 2020 Census is going on right now. Every ten years, the Census is done for representation in Congress, redistricting, and to guide the distribution of over \$675 billion in federal funds.

The information is used to determine a community's funding for programs such as Medicare and Medicaid for our kupunas, school lunches for our children, Pell Grants for those pursuing college degrees, transportation services, support to first responders and front liners and many more.

Heads of families are asked to make sure every member of their household is included such as the children and the elderly folks.

Your response to the 2020 Census is critical so that we can get an accurate and complete count of our community. Your answers are safe, confidential, and will not be shared with other agencies.

Our Diocesan Congress of Filipino Catholic Clubs (DCFCC) with the endorsement of Bishop Larry Silva has been working with the Filipino Complete Count Committee to get the word out about the census.
