First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-3

In this Reading, the prophet Isaiah invites all people to come to the feast that the Lord prepares for them. In biblical times, meals of water, wine, milk and rich fare injected joy into people's routines. They were not the norm, as they can be today with supermarkets providing daily fare fit for kings. The plenty and variety of the Lord's feast are a metaphor for divinely revealed teachings which the people feast on when they put them into practice. In the Lord's words: "Heed me, and you shall eat well." Though Israel was not faithful to the covenant and lost everything, the Lord did not terminate his relationship with them. The continuation of the divine human relationship would always depend, not on human fidelity but on God's steadfast love and loyalty. The "everlasting covenant" restores the benefits of the covenant with David and extends them to all the people.

Second Reading: Romans 8:35, 37-39

In this passage, Paul asks the question, "What will separate us from the love of Christ?: His short answer is "nothing." Paul reminds Christians that in all sufferings they are triumphing gloriously.

Gospel: Matthew 14:13-21

When Jesus hears of the death of John the Baptist, he goes off alone to pray. But the Sea of Galilee is so small that many notice where a boat carrying Jesus lands and bring their sick to him. He turns his thoughts from John to their suffering and, moved with compassion in the depths of his being, he heals them. His empathy extends to their need for nourishment at the end of the day. In the miracle of the feeding of the multitudes, Jesus was teaching his followers a lesson that what we need most is Jesus himself who is the bread of eternal life. The most important way we can call upon him is by participating in the Eucharist, where we become like the five thousand families that Jesus fed. And when we are fed by Christ, then nothing can separate us from his love.

You may bring disinfectant wipes for use in your seat before and after the service.



Date: July 30, 2020 To: All Pastors, Parish Administrators, Principals and Office/Business Managers From: *Dara Perreira*, Director of Human Resources Re: Diocesan Contact Person for COVID-19 Situations and Reporting of Situations

As Masses have resumed, our workplaces have opened and the start of the school year is upon us, please review this memo that provides instruction on who to contact for further direction in various COVID-19 situations. (*For protocols regarding parochial school students becoming ill or testing positive for COVID-19, please refer to school protocols*)

Various COVID-19 situations could include:

Receiving information from the Department of Health (DOH) about a positive COVID-19 test in your congregation or workplace.

A parishioner, volunteer or employee informing you they came in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. An employee, volunteer or parishioner who was asked to go home due to showing symptoms of COVID-19 while at Mass, performing ministry or work.

For the situations above or any other COVID-19 situation that needs addressing, <u>you must immediately call Dara Per-</u><u>reira, Diocesan Human Resources Director at 808-342-3241</u> who will then notify the proper internal resource team with a right to know and will guide you on next steps. Please see step #2 below if you need to immediately address an ill person.

Please note that names and identities of any employee, volunteer or parishioner involved in these situations must be held in the strictest confidentiality to the greatest extent possible. Protecting individual health information is legally and morally required and the parish, school and Diocese could be held liable for releasing this information.

For your information, by law a positive COVID-19 test will trigger the physician/lab informing the DOH of the test results. The DOH will then assign a "contact tracer" to the case who will work with the affected individual to identify any other individuals or groups who may have been exposed. The DOH will communicate directly to those individuals or groups. If one of those groups or individuals is part of our workplace ministry or congregation, the parish or school may be notified and the DOH will work with us (pastor, principal and Diocese) to advise on next steps. Do not assume you need to immediately inform your community or congregation and do not communicate anything unless approved by the Diocese.

Also, keeping track of individuals that attend specific Masses is a best practice to assist with contact tracing in the case of a positive COVID-19 test, but is not required by law.

Our best defense against the spread of COVID-19 is to continue to follow our safe practices. We must not become complacent in our efforts of cleaning and ensuring safety and health by following previous guidelines issued by the CDC and the Diocese. Please continue to enforce the following:

Stay home if you are sick

It is critical that employees, volunteers or parishioners do not come to church or school property while they are experiencing respiratory symptoms such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills or fatigue.

Individual who becomes sick at Mass, during ministry or work

If someone becomes sick while at Mass, ministry or work and needs immediate medical assistance, call 911. Sick individuals who are able to safely walk should be isolated in a designated room away from others. Inform adults that you would like to send them home and encourage them to consult a physician. Do not leave minors unattended. Contact the parent to arrange for transportation. Also, please follow these steps:

*If they have personal items that need to be collected (purse, etc.) retrieve it for them.

*Ask where they have been on property (bathrooms, offices, church, sacristy, etc) send them home immediately and encourage them to consult their doctor. (Continued)

*Disinfect any areas thoroughly after the individual has left.

*Contact *Dara Perreira* at 808-342-3241 to communicate the situation.

*Do not allow that person back at Mass, ministry or work unless they have a clearance from a doctor or if they have quarantined for 14 days. (The Diocese or DOH will provide guidance on this as well as whether or not work or Mass is suspended temporarily).

Disinfecting surfaces regularly

CDC guidelines state that regular disinfection of high touch surfaces such as doorknobs, bathrooms, computers, faucets, chairs and other surfaces where COVID-19 can potentially survive can greatly reduce the chances of spread. Ensure proper cleaning before and after Masses as well as before, during and at the completion of the workday in the workplace. Please pay special attention to sinks, coffee machines and the refrigerator in the workplace.

Masks are mandatory

According to the State, cloth face coverings must be "worn at all times by employees and public when outside the home". Cloth face coverings are meant to stop the wearer from spreading respiratory droplets. If someone does not wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth, you may nicely ask them to leave and to please return when they are wearing one.

Meetings and Gatherings (outside of 1 times)

Ensure that social distancing is taking place at all times. Limit gatherings and meetings and utilize meeting technology where possible.

General Hygiene

Please wash your hands frequently and thoroughly per CDC guidelines. Ensure that enough PPE including soap and hand sanitizer is provided.

No Communal Food

Please refrain from sharing bowls of candy and various other food. Please do not encourage workplace or parish celebrations, especially with food. Employees should take home or throw away food daily.

CENSUS 2020

BE COUNTED...

The 2020 Census is going on right now. Every ten years, the Census is done for representation in Congress, redistricting, and to guide the distribution of over \$675 billion in federal funds.

The information is used to determine a community's funding for programs such as Medicare and Medicaid for our kupunas, school lunches for our children, Pell Grants for those pursuing college degrees, transportation services, support to first responders and front liners and many more.

Heads of families are asked to make sure every member of their household is included such as the children and the elderly folks.

Your response to the 2020 Census is critical so that we can get an accurate and complete count of our community. Your answers are safe, confidential, and will not be shared with other agencies.

Our Diocesan Congress of Filipino Catholic Clubs (DCFCC) with the endorsement of Bishop Larry Silva has been working with the Filipino Complete Count Committee to get the word out about the census.

You may also fill out your paper questionnaire in English or Tagalog and mail it back to the Census Bureau. HEALTH CARE FOR THE UN-INSURED

Bayanihan Clinic Without Walls offers free medical services for the pandemic newly-unemployed By Anna Weaver, Hawaii Catholic Herald

People who are uninsured due to being laid off by the novel coronavirus' impact on the economy here in Hawaii have an option to receive medical care, free, thanks to a group of volunteer Filipino physicians.

Doctors with the *Bayanihan Clinic Without Walls*, a Philippine Medical Association of Hawaii affiliate, and *Hawaii Filipino Healthcare* are offering their services free of charge to anyone on Oahu who lost their job and consequently their health insurance during the pandemic.

Though the two groups primarily serve Filipino immigrants to the islands, the COVID Relief Job Loss Program is for anyone unemployed and uninsured due to the coronavirus, said JP Orias, executive director of the Bayanihan Clinic Without Walls.

"It's very basic kindness to help one another. Just that," Orias said. The spirit of the organization is found in its name, *Bayanihan*, a Filipino word meaning to help one another.

The 35 or so doctors participating have a range of specialties from general practice and internal medicine to geriatrics. The group continues to look for more volunteer doctors and contributions to keep the medical care going.

While *Bayanihan Clinic Without Walls* isn't a Catholic organization, many of its members are. Dr. Mariani, for instance, is Catholic and was taught by Franciscan Sisters all throughout her school years. She previously worked at St. Francis Medical Center and now does private practice at the Queen's Physicians Building. Many of her clients are Filipino and those who have no insurance.
