### CELEBRATING THE JUBILEE YEAR



Amidst the still surging and raging covid-19 pandemic on August 16, 2020 we, OLM priests and parishioners both in person and in virtual setting, made the day a very special one. It's the awaited day of our Parish 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. It's a Jubilee Year which the Bible says is celebrated as a special event every 50 years. In the year 1870, OLM was started as a mission by the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary missionaries with whom *St. Damien de Veuster* belonged. It's indeed special and significant and so we celebrated, rejoiced and thanked the Lord for this historic parish milestone albeit in a subdued and less festive manner.

Bishop Larry Silva came to preside and preach at the solemn Anniversary Mass. Concelebrating were the Vicar for Clergy Fr. Greg Honorio, the Pastor-emeritus Fr Adrian Gervacio and the Pastor Fr. Edgar Brillantes. Assisting the Bishop at the altar and with the Gospel were the Chancellor of the Diocese, Deacon Keith Cabiles and Deacon Rafael Mendoza of Star of the Sea



Church and our parish bookkeeper. The diocesan emcee, *Gary Garo*, directed the order of the celebration.

Following the Mass was the procession to the former Religious Sisters convent. It was built in 1963 and for the past three recent years, it has undergone a staggered renovation with the installation of new roofing, flooring and vertical slide glass windows; interior and exterior repainting, upgraded plumbing, electrical lines, outlets and fixtures and carpentry. The phase by phase refurbishing was made possible by the support of parishioners and friends through the raffle fundraising, dance for a cause, voluntary donations and thru the regular repair & maintenance stewardship. It was completed in time and paid in full without incurring any debt or budget deficit. The Bishop blessed and inaugurated it as the new *Pastoral Center* to serve as a commemorative landmark of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The chairperson of the Parish Planning & Building Committee (PPBC), *Joyce Oliveira*, and the project manager, *Roger Isidro*, cut the ceremonial ribbon while the Finance Chair, *Rebecca Jandoc*, and the Pastoral Council chair, *Marcelino Ulep*, unveiled the sign-board for the building. The *Pastoral Center* is a testimonial and tribute to all the founding faithful – the then-Bishop, missionaries, native inhabitants, Portuguese settlers and parishioners – for their vision, sacrifices and faith in establishing and maintaining OLM parish through the years and passing it on to our present generation. It now stands out as a distinctive religious landmark in Kalihi Valley and we hope to continue and perpetuate in our humble way their precious legacy. Our chosen theme of the occasion, *"Celebrating and Renewing our Faith in Grateful Stewardship"* articulates well this hope.

Don't miss this weekend's issue of the *Hawaii Catholic Herald*. It has on its cover on the front-page OLM's 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and the feature article titled *"Memories on the Mount."* 

We again take this occasion to thank each and every one - our parish leaders, ministers, organizations, staff, volunteers, ethnic groups, priests, religious and parishioners, living and dead, and friends near and far, for their help, big and small, in making this occasion meaningful, memorable and successful. May the heavenly Mother, Our Lady of the Mount, with her loving Son Jesus, bless us all.

#### First Reading: Isaiah 22:19-23

In this Reading, the Lord sends Isaiah to Shebna to remove him as the master of the palace and places the key of the House of David to Eliakim. Eliakim will control access to its stores and treasures. His task is to attend to the needs of the inhabitants of the realm like a father. The Lord's plan is to fix Eliakim like a peg in a sure or secure spot.

#### Second Reading: Romans 11:33-36

This short Reading is from a beautiful letter from St. Paul who expresses in awe at how much "more" God is than the human mind can imagine. Divine riches, wisdom, and knowledge are infinitive. Paul urges believers to contemplate God's all-encompassing presence and attention, and to seize the opportunities that the gift of a human life gives them to participate with all creation in giving glory to God.

#### Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

In this Gospel Reading, when asked by Jesus, "Who do you say that I am?", Peter answers, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Peter did not figure this on his own. This insight is given him by the Father. Peter needs this knowledge to be the rock on which Jesus will build his Church and to carry out the formidable tasks that Jesus entrusts to him.

#### Extension of Dispensation from Sunday Mass Obligation

Due to the ongoing Covid-19 coronavirus pandemic, Bishop Silva extends the dispensation of all the people of the Diocese of Honolulu and all visitors to the Diocese of Honolulu from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass **through October 31, 2020**. All who are able to attend Sunday Mass without putting themselves or others at serious risk of infection are encouraged to do so, but are not obliged to do so.

Subject: Updated to Liturgical Guidelines Due to the new "Act Now Honolulu – No Social Gathering Order" [COVID-19]

We are blessed that our churches are opened and we can gather again to worship together as one Ohana. Our daily lives, routines at home, school, work and community have changed in the past months as well as our liturgies and worship experiences due to the unpredictable COVID-19 pandemic. Each island has been exposed differently to the virus and we are called to continue doing our Christian best to support our local county and government officials in fighting this illness.

In the past month, the island of Oahu (County of Honolulu) has seen a great increase of COVID-19 cases. Yesterday, Governor Ige approved Mayor Kirk Caldwell's latest emergency order for the County of Honolulu called "Act Now Honolulu – No Social Gathering Order" [COVID-19] which impacts the island of Oahu only in an attempt to flatten the recent surge in COVID-19 cases on the island. These restrictions impact all Catholic churches, chapels, oratories, centers, and missions, on the island of Oahu only, and begin at midnight tonight (Wednesday, August 19), and will last for the next 28 days (or until further notice).

\*Face coverings (masks and/or face shields) will be worn at ALL times by all who attend Mass, including the ministers (i.e. priest-celebrant, concelebrants, deacons, lectors and musicians) during the liturgical celebration. For those parishioners and ministers with respiratory issue it is highly suggested the use of a face shield instead of a face mask.

\*Singing during the celebration of the Mass or at any other church gatherings is to be suspended. The use of wind instruments (other than the organ) is also prohibited. Musicians may consider playing instrumental music, using a piano and/or church organ, during the entrance gathering, at the communion rite and recessional.

\*One of the lectors or the priest celebrant should recite the Entrance Antiphon and the Communion Antiphon prescribed for each Mass and found in the Roman Missal. The "Alleluia" Gospel Acclamation, with its verse, may be either recited or omitted.

\*The Responsorial Psalm and all the Mass parts (i.e. Kyrie, Gloria, Collect, Prefaces, Eucharistic Prayer, the Lord's Prayer and other prayers) are to be recited.

\*No face-to-face meetings with groups larger than 5 are allowed; including but not limited to, any church ministry, community and staff meeting in any church facilities. This number limitation DOES NOT apply to the celebration of public Masses, Funeral Masses, Weddings and immediate preparation of the sacraments.

Neighbor island pastors/administrators may want to consider implementing these restrictions in their own parishes (as they see it fit) to continue helping with the fight against the propagation of this virus. Always follow the latest instructions from your own County Mayor. As a reminder, the following directives from the May 22, 2020 Bishop Larry Silva's guidelines are still in effect for the entire diocese:

<u>UPDATE</u>: The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is extended through **October 31, 2020**. This will allow those who are not comfortable attending Mass at this time to stay away with a clear conscience. Masses will continue to be livestreamed. An updated list of parishes that are live-streaming can be found at <u>www.catholichawaii.org.</u>

\*As an act of charity, anyone who is sick or who is particularly vulnerable to infection should not attend Mass at this time.

\*All who attend Mass must maintain proper social distancing. Whether members of the same household will be able to sit together will depend on the particular decision of each parish, so please follow the directives of your parish.

\*Baptismal fonts and Holy water fonts will be continuing to stay emptied.

\*To minimize the amount of ministers in the sanctuary area the use of altar servers is discouraged.

\*The collection will be taken only with a long-poled basket (whose handles should be sanitized before and after use); or offerings may be placed in a locked box, guarded by at least two unrelated people.

\*The normal presentation of the gifts of bread and wine will not take place, but these elements will be brought to the altar from the credence table.

\*As a precautious/safety measure and in order to avoid any exposure of the hosts to the priest's "aerosols and/ or droplets" we ask that the hosts placed on the altar for the consecration be kept on a separate bowl covered with a pall or another cloth in the same way we cover the chalices with palls to keep bugs out.

\*For Holy Communion, **ALL** ministers of Holy Communion will wear masks. Those receiving Communion will be ushered row by row so that a six-foot distance will be maintained at all times. Just before arriving at the Communion station, the communicant will remove the mask, receive Communion reverently, then immediately replace the mask.

\*Communion on the hand (one hand held open above the other) is encouraged for the greater health and safety of all, though Communion on the tongue is not prohibited. The Precious Blood will only be taken by the priest.

\*All ministers of Holy Communion, including the clergy, will sanitize their hands immediately before distributing Communion and immediately after doing so. (A small table or stand may be placed next to each Communion station, so that if a minister feels his or her hands may have been contaminated, the paten/ciborium can be placed on the table momentarily while the minister sanitizes his or her hands.)

\*People should leave the church according to the directives given by the ushers or the priest in order to maintain social distancing during the leave-taking. Congregating in the parking lot or elsewhere is prohibited.

\*No social gathering (e.g. coffee and donuts) may be held after Mass.

\*Immediately after Mass the church will be sanitized according to the protocol adopted by the parish.

Aloha,

We received clarification from the City and County of Honolulu COVID-19 Response Information Team in reference the Emergency Order 2020-22 issued yesterday by Mayor Caldwell. "Churches and other houses of worship <u>can still celebrate Mass</u> and conduct spiritual services <u>without</u> a 10-person capacity limitation under the guidelines of Exhibit A #11 (see attached) "In-person spiritual services".

The "social gatherings" limitations would only apply to "social" functions."

Please note, that meetings at church are included in the "social gatherings" limitations and subject to the 10-person limit.

Celebration of Funeral Mass, Weddings, and Baptisms may take place according to the guidelines from Bishop Larry Silva for the Reopening of Catholic Churches in Hawaii During the COVID-19 Pandemic (dated May 22, 2020 – see attached).

As a reminder *Funerals at this time <u>may not include</u> visitation times,* only the Vigil Service for the Deceased, the Funeral Mass, and the Committal Service.
