


"Lord, go up to the place of your rest, you and the ark of your holiness." Psalm 132:8



## First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9, 11-13

This Reading is iconic in the Church's spiritual tradition. Its most obvious lesson appears in light of the fact that the All-Powerful Lord, Creator of the heavens and the earth, chooses to manifest Himself to Elijah through a tiny, whispering sound rather than by more dramatic means. This lesson encourages us to be mindful of God's presence amidst what is small, simple, and seemingly insignificant.

#### Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5

In this Reading, Paul expreses his deep sortrow that for the most part his people, literally in Greek, his "brothers" according to the flesh, did not accept Jesus as the Messiah. His choice of the term "brothers." which he normally reserves for his new kin in Christ, reveals the depths of his anguish. He does not call his people "Jew," which was the ethnic designation used foreigners, but "Israelites" to recall their privileged position in salvation history. They are the people whom the Lord chose for his own, the "son" brought out of bondage from Egypt. They saw the "Glory of the Lord," i.e., the manifestation of his presence and power, at the Red Sea, and again when the Lord provided food for them in wilderness.

#### Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Today's Gospel Reading presents a pair of contrasts. After sending the disciples ahead across the water, Jesus went up on a mountain by Himself to pray. We cannot know what this simple, serene contemplation with God the Father, in the Holy Spirit, was like for Jesus. But it's obvious that Jesus is not bound by any command similar to the one given to Moses. Jesus ascends this mountain in order to gaze directly on His Father's countenance, through His humanity, in the fullness of His divinity.

You may bring disinfectant wipes for use in your seat before and after the service.


\*If you feel sick, please don't force yourself to come to church. You are dispensed from the obligation.

Aloha,

We received clarification from the City and County of Honolulu COVID-19 Response Information Team in reference the Emergency Order 2020-22 issued yesterday by Mayor Caldwell. "Churches and other houses of worship <u>can still cele-brate Mass</u> and conduct spiritual services <u>without</u> a 10-person capacity limitation under the guidelines of Exhibit A #11 (see attached) "In-person spiritual services".

The "social gatherings" limitations would only apply to "social" functions."

Please note, that meetings at church are included in the "social gatherings" limitations and subject to the 10-person limit.

Celebration of Funeral Mass, Weddings, and Baptisms may take place according to the guidelines from Bishop Larry Silva for the Reopening of Catholic Churches in Hawaii During the COVID-19 Pandemic (dated May 22, 2020 – see at-tached).

As a reminder *Funerals at this time <u>may not include</u> visitation times,* only the Vigil Service for the Deceased, the Funeral Mass, and the Committal Service.

#### **IMPORTANT:** CONTACTS FOR COVID-19 SITUATIONS & REPORTING

Date: July 30, 2020 To: All Pastors, Parish Administrators, Principals and Office/Business Managers From: *Dara Perreira*, Director of Human Resources Re: Diocesan Contact Person for COVID-19 Situations and Reporting of Situations

As Masses have resumed, our workplaces have opened and the start of the school year is upon us, please review this memo that provides instruction on who to contact for further direction in various COVID-19 situations. (*For protocols regarding parochial school students becoming ill or testing positive for COVID-19, please refer to school protocols*)

Various COVID-19 situations could include:

Receiving information from the Department of Health (DOH) about a positive COVID-19 test in your congregation or workplace.

A parishioner, volunteer or employee informing you they came in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19. An employee, volunteer or parishioner who was asked to go home due to showing symptoms of COVID-19 while at Mass, performing ministry or work.

For the situations above or any other COVID-19 situation that needs addressing, <u>you must immediately call Dara Per-</u><u>reira, Diocesan Human Resources Director at 808-342-3241</u> who will then notify the proper internal resource team with a right to know and will guide you on next steps. Please see step #2 below if you need to immediately address an ill person.

Please note that names and identities of any employee, volunteer or parishioner involved in these situations must be held in the strictest confidentiality to the greatest extent possible. Protecting individual health information is legally and morally required and the parish, school and Diocese could be held liable for releasing this information.

For your information, by law a positive COVID-19 test will trigger the physician/lab informing the DOH of the test results. The DOH will then assign a "contact tracer" to the case who will work with the affected individual to identify any other individuals or groups who may have been exposed. The DOH will communicate directly to those individuals or groups. If one of those groups or individuals is part of our workplace ministry or congregation, the parish or school may be notified and the DOH will work with us (pastor, principal and Diocese) to advise on next steps. Do not assume you need to immediately inform your community or congregation and do not communicate anything unless approved by the Diocese.

Also, keeping track of individuals that attend specific Masses is a best practice to assist with contact tracing in the case of a positive COVID-19 test, but is not required by law.

**Our best defense against the spread of COVID-19** is to continue to follow our safe practices. We must not become complacent in our efforts of cleaning and ensuring safety and health by following previous guidelines issued by the CDC and the Diocese. Please continue to enforce the following:

#### Stay home if you are sick

It is critical that employees, volunteers or parishioners do not come to church or school property while they are experiencing respiratory symptoms such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills or fatigue.

#### Individual who becomes sick at Mass, during ministry or work

If someone becomes sick while at Mass, ministry or work and needs immediate medical assistance, call 911. Sick individuals who are able to safely walk should be isolated in a designated room away from others. Inform adults that you would like to send them home and encourage them to consult a physician. Do not leave minors unattended. Contact the parent to arrange for transportation. Also, please follow these steps:

\*If they have personal items that need to be collected (purse, etc.) retrieve it for them.

\*Ask where they have been on property (bathrooms, offices, church, sacristy, etc) send them home immediately and encourage them to consult their doctor.

\*Disinfect any areas thoroughly after the individual has left.

\*Contact *Dara Perreira* at 808-342-3241 to communicate the situation.

\*Do not allow that person back at Mass, ministry or work unless they have a clearance from a doctor or if they have quarantined for 14 days. (The Diocese or DOH will provide guidance on this as well as whether or not work or Mass is suspended temporarily).

#### **Disinfecting surfaces regularly**

CDC guidelines state that regular disinfection of high touch surfaces such as doorknobs, bathrooms, computers, faucets, chairs and other surfaces where COVID-19 can potentially survive can greatly reduce the chances of spread. Ensure proper cleaning before and after Masses as well as before, during and at the completion of the workday in the workplace. Please pay special attention to sinks, coffee machines and the refrigerator in the workplace.

#### Masks are mandatory

According to the State, cloth face coverings must be "worn at all times by employees and public when outside the home". Cloth face coverings are meant to stop the wearer from spreading respiratory droplets. If someone does not wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth, you may nicely ask them to leave and to please return when they are wearing one.

#### Meetings and Gatherings (outside of 1 times)

Ensure that social distancing is taking place at all times. Limit gatherings and meetings and utilize meeting technology where possible.

#### **General Hygiene**

Please wash your hands frequently and thoroughly per CDC guidelines. Ensure that enough PPE including soap and hand sanitizer is provided.

#### No Communal Food

Please refrain from sharing bowls of candy and various other food. Please do not encourage workplace or parish celebrations, especially with food. Employees should take home or throw away food daily.

#### CELEBRATING OLM 150TH PARISH ANNIVERSARY

One century and fifty years have passed since Our Lady of the Mount was started as a mission station and grew up further as a parish. It has certainly gone a long way. From a simple wooden-frame structure nestled inside Kalihi Valley it has evolved into an imposing landmark amidst a diverse residential community. From the missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mary to the Diocesan priests, the parishioners have been ministered pastorally and spiritually who in turn gave their welcome and support. OLM is what it is now because of the previous generations who lived and passed on their dynamic and committed faith. We have been blessed not only to receive their rich legacy but feel more blessed to be able to continue, enhance and expand this legacy with our brand of faith and awakened stewardship. This calls for a celebration. We in this generation are fortunate and blessed indeed to see this milestone. We feel proud and triumphant and so we come together to celebrate and renew our faith in grateful stewardship.

Despite the brewing pandemic crisis brought about by covid-19, we are blessed to have our chief shepherd *Bishop Larry Silva* coming and presiding at the solemn Anniversary Mass on August 16, Sunday. He will also officiate the blessing and inauguration of the Pastoral Center which was renovated and used to be the Religious Sisters' convent. Our immediate preparation consists of a nine-day novena devotion starting on August 7.

#### PASTORAL CENTER

After the last Sacred Heart Pastor left in 1963, *Fr. Thomas Miyashiro* was assigned Pastor of OLM. He was the first Diocesan pastor at OLM. Among his accomplishments was the construction of the Convent which housed the Religious Sisters of the Holy Family Congregation. Other religious groups like the Maryknoll Sisters and St. Paul de Chartres came to live part-time. Then when the Religious were gone the building started to be used for varied pastoral activities such as the Sunday Catechesis, Youth meetings, distribution of food and household items by the Kokua and Outreach Ministry. It was also used for meetings by the Knights of Columbus, for choir practices and storage for all kinds of donations from people.

In view of its deteriorating physical condition and in view of the forthcoming big event of the 150<sup>th</sup> Parish Anniversary the pastor and parish leaders decided to embark on a major renovation. The parishioners were duly informed about the project and fundraising events were held. The major renovation jobs were done phase by phase. The new flooring, roofing, painting, plumbing, electrical and carpentry works were done as the funds were raised and made available. And thank God, through the leaders' determination and parishioners' unstinting support the refurbishing was completed and now ready for the Parish Anniversary lift-off. New furnishings and accessories include AC units, faucets, lavatories, door-knobs, window shades, curtains, shelves, kitchen and dining wares, tower fans, white boards and light bulbs. We are proud to designate it as the commemorative landmark of the parish milestone and the heartfelt symbol of our faithful stewardship.

After the blessing, there will be an open-house, and everyone is invited to have a look and see of this wonderful product of joyful and faithful stewardship.






